Duke Game Notes

- Duke won its 108th NCAA Tournament game Friday, third-most in history. The Blue Devils own the top winning percentage (.755, 108-35) in tournament history.
- Duke and Kansas both won Friday; the two programs are tied for most NCAA Tournament wins (43) of any program in the country since 2000.
- Friday's win was the 91st in NCAA Tournament history for Head Coach Mike Krzyzewski, 20 more than the next closest coach (Roy Williams).
- Duke has now won five straight in postseason play (4-0 in ACC Tournament, 1-0 in NCAA Tournament), after dropping three of its last four games to end the regular season.
- Friday's game was Duke's fourth in Bon Secours Wellness Arena, its third in NCAA Tournament play (3-0). Last season, the Blue Devils lost to Clemson when it used the Greenville arena as its home court.
- Duke's 52-point first half was its 10th half of the season with 50 or more points.
- Grayson Allen scored 21 points and moved into 34th place on Duke's career scoring list (1,404).
- Allen's point total was his highest since the North Carolina game in Cameron Indoor Stadium on Feb. 9.
- Allen was 5-9 from three Friday, the second time in the last three games he has made five from beyond the arc.
- Amile Jefferson blocked three shots Friday, passing Shavlik Randolph for eighth on the school's all-time list (132).
- Jefferson played his 149th game as a Blue Devil, breaking the previous school record shared by Christian Laettner (1989-92) and Kyle Singler (2008-11).
- Matt Jones scored double figures for the first time since a game against Wake Forest on Feb. 18. Jones finished with 14 points.
- Jayson Tatum produced a double-double with 18 points and 12 rebounds. It was Tatum's third of the season.
- Tatum tied career highs for both steals (4) and blocks (4) against Troy.
- Tatum has made 117 free throws on the season. Only three freshmen in Duke history have made more.
- Luke Kennard now has 711 points on the season, the 17th-best single season figure in Duke history.
- Kennard extended his personal streak to 39 consecutive games with at least one three-point goal, the 10th-longest streak in ACC history.
