SETTING THE SCENE

OPENING DRAW

- Opening weekend for the 2019 Duke squad will see the 24th-ranked Blue Devils welcome Villanova to Koskinen Stadium Saturday at 1 p.m. on ACC Network Extra.
- Duke and the Wildcats meet for just the third time in program history and the first time in a season opener.
- Head coach Kerstin Kimel's squad returns 23 letterwinners from the 2018 campaign, including eight starters, and this year welcomed the nation's No. 4 recruiting class.
- The Blue Devils begin the season tied for 19th in the Inside Lacrosse Media Poll and ranked 24th in the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association Coaches Poll.

SCOUTING THE WILDCATS

- Villanova and head coach Julie Young welcomed back 27 players for the 2019 campaign.
- The Wildcats were picked to finish fourth in the BIG EAST Preseason Coaches' Poll.
- Villanova's group of returners includes program single season draw controls record holder Devin Hassinger and 2017 BIG EAST Freshman of the Year Katie Comerford, both of whom earned a spot on the Preseason All-BIG EAST Team.

DUKE VS. THE BIG EAST

- The Blue Devils are 41-14 all-time against teams from the BIG EAST.

DUKE IN SEASON OPENERS

- The Duke program is 22-1 all-time in season openers and 20-2 in home openers.
- The Blue Devils have won 18 consecutive home openers entering the 2019 season.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- Senior attacker Olivia Jenner garnered Preseason All-ACC recognition Wednesday. A first team IL Media All-America pick last spring, Jenner led Duke at the draw in 2018 with an ACC-best 149 draw controls.
- Jenner was also named to Inside Lacrosse's Preseason All-America third team in December, and was joined in earning preseason accolades from the publication by teammates Callie Humphrey and Charlotte North, who were honorable mention selections.
- Duke was picked to finish seventh in the ACC in a poll of the league's eight head coaches, also released Wednesday.

DUKE RANKED IN PRESEASON POLLS

- Duke earned a spot in preseason polls released by the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association (IWLCA) and by Inside Lacrosse.
- Head coach Kerstin Kimel's squad was one of seven ACC teams to begin the spring ranked top 25 in the IWLCA Coaches Poll, with Boston College and North Carolina both landing inside the top five, Virginia Tech at No. 14, Syracuse at No. 15, Virginia at No. 16, Notre Dame at No. 20 and Duke at No. 24.
- Eight of the Blue Devils' 2019 opponents were ranked in the IWLCA preseason poll, including four inside the top 10.

MADDIE JENNER EARNS SPOT ON U.S. U19 TEAM

- Blue Devil freshman Maddie Jenner was named to the 2019 U.S. U19 women's national team training roster following a late January Spring Premiere weekend in Stanford, Calif.
- The six-team women's event featured the U.S. senior and U19 teams, national teams from Japan and England, and college teams from Fresno State and Stanford.
- Jenner, who had a game-high nine draw controls in an 18-8 victory over England, was one of 23 players to make the latest U19 roster, released Jan. 31.

BLUE DEVILS BOAST ONE OF TOP MIDFIELD UNITS

- Despite the graduation of three-time All-ACC selection Maddie Crutchfield, Duke has been projected to boast one of the top midfield groups in the country this spring, as outlined by IL Women's Halley Quillinan recently on Lax Sports Network. Quillinan highlights the return of Olivia Jenner at the draw, as well as the addition of sister Maddie Jenner, as a key to the unit's success.
- In the midfield, the Blue Devils also welcome back Catriona Barry, who totaled 53 draw controls as a freshman to rank second on the squad behind Olivia Jenner, and Abby Landry, who had 12 goals while starting all 17 contests in 2018.

NORTH COMING OFF BREAKOUT SEASON

- Dallas native Charlotte North etched her name in the Duke record books as a rookie, breaking the program's freshman goals and points records last spring. She led the squad in both categories, totaling 59 goals and 64 points in 17 contests.
- North rounded out the season with a team-high 12 hat tricks and ranked among the ACC leaders with an average of 3.47 goals per game.
- During the course of her freshman season, North twice earned ACC Offensive Player of the Week accolades. She wrapped up the year as a second team All-ACC selection and an honorable mention All-America and All-Rookie Team choice by Inside Lacrosse.

CHALLENGING SLATE AWAITS

- Duke's 2019 slate features seven contests against opponents who were selected to the 2018 NCAA Championship field. In addition, half of Duke's 2019 opposition finished this past season with 10 or more wins.
- The program's nine regular season home contests feature ACC tilts against North Carolina, Notre Dame, Syracuse and Virginia Tech, as well as an inaugural meeting with VCU May 5 at Koskinen Stadium. The Blue Devils' eight road games include trips to three ACC opponents and early season matchups at Northwestern and Penn.

KIMEL NAMES TEAM CAPTAINS

- Blue Devil seniors Olivia Jenner, Jamie Lockwood, Ellie Majure and Charlotte Tucci have been tabbed team captains for the 2019 season.
- Jenner is a three-year starter and was a second team Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association All-South Region and All-ACC selection at attack last spring. Lockwood has appeared in 27 games between the pipes over the past three seasons while Majure has played in 50 career contests with 29 goals and nine assists in that span. Tucci is a returning starter on defense for the Blue Devils and ranked among the team's leaders last spring with 18 ground balls.

FRESHMAN CLASS AMONG TOPS IN COUNTRY

- Duke's freshman class was tabbed No. 4 in the country by Inside Lacrosse in the publication's fall Recruiting Issue.
- Maddie Jenner, an attacker and draw specialist from Annapolis, Md., was among the 2018 ILWomen Power 100

Women's Incoming Freshmen - Top 10, coming in at No. 4. She was joined in the publication's Class of 2018 Power 100 by Anna Callahan of Glenwood, Md., at No. 12, Olivia Rubin of Baltimore, Md., at No. 44 and Sophia LeRose of San Diego, Calif., at No. 46.

- Eva Greco of Wilton, Conn., and Maddie Johnston of Baltimore, Md., were named to IL Women's "On the Rise" list.
- Duke was one of only four schools with multiple student-athletes listed within the top 12 of the power rankings.

GRIFFIN JOINS BLUE DEVIL COACHING STAFF

- Head coach Kerstin Kimel announced in July the addition of Brooke Griffin to the Blue Devil staff as an assistant coach.
- A native of Annapolis, Md., Griffin completed an outstanding collegiate career at Maryland in 2015. She twice earned first team All-America laurels from the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association (IWLCA) and was the Big Ten Attack Player of the Year and a Tewaaraton Award nominee as a senior. Griffin led the Terrapins to back-to-back national titles, serving as a team captain on the 2014 and 2015 championship squads.
- Griffin went on to compete with the U.S. national team, helping Team USA capture its third consecutive World Cup title last summer in Guildford, England. She has also taken the field as a member of the Women's Professional Lacrosse League's Baltimore Brave.

CHREST ERBE INDUCTED INTO DUKE ATHLETICS HOF

- Former Blue Devil great Katie Chrest Erbe was the first member of the Duke women's lacrosse program to be enshrined in the Duke Athletics Hall of Fame at September's induction ceremony.
- Erbe's storied career was headlined by the 2005 Tewaaraton Trophy, an honor presented annually to the nation's top player.
- From 2003-06, she helped Duke to a four-year ledger of 61-18 with three ACC regular season championships, one ACC Tournament title and four NCAA Tournament berths including two appearances in the Final Four. A two-time All-America pick, Erbe was the 2003 ACC Rookie of the Year and went on to garner ACC Player of the Year accolades in both 2005 and 2006.
- Erbe established the program's single-season record for total points with 96 in 2005 and graduated as the school's all-time leader in both goals (216) and points (287). She went on to help the United States to the 2009 Federation of International Lacrosse world championship.
