Blue Devil Update

Duke (18-7, 5-6) faces Boston College (18-6, 9-2) on Wednesday at the Silvio O. Conte Forum in Chestnut Hill, Mass. Tip-off is set for 9:00 p.m. with ESPN televising the contest. The Eagles enter the contest ranked 21st in both the AP and ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll, while the Blue Devils are unranked for the first time in 10 years.

Duke is coming off a 72-60 loss at Maryland on Sunday. The Blue Devils scored the first five points of the game before Maryland countered with a 29-4 run to take a 20-point lead with just over eight minutes remaining in the opening half. Duke scraped its way back into the contest, closing to 58-52 with 8:02 remaining in the second half but could get no closer to the Terrapins.

Sophomore **Josh McRoberts** led the Blue Devils with 20 points, eight rebounds, four blocks and two steals. After going 2-of-5 from the field in the first half, McRoberts shot 7-of-8 in the second half to close the game with a career-best nine field goals.

Greg Paulus (12) and **Jon Scheyer** (11) also reached double-figures in scoring, but the Blue Devils were unable to overcome 17 turnovers. Maryland converted Duke's turnovers into 21 points and held a 12-4 edge in fastbreak points. The Terrapins also posted a 48-30 advantage on points in the paint.

Duke shot 43.1 percent (25-of-58) from the field in the loss, including just 28.6 percent (4-of-14) from three-point distance. The Blue Devils have dropped four straight games and are shooting just 43.5 percent (101-of-232) during that stretch.

Storylines

▶ Duke has dropped four straight games since registering a 75-61 win over Boston College on Jan. 28. The four-game losing streak is the longest for the Blue Devils since a six-game skid midway through the 1994-95 season. Duke's current losing streak is just the fifth four-game skid at Duke by a **Mike Krzyzewski**-led team. Duke has not lost more than four games in a row with Coach K on the bench. The Blue Devils' six-game skid during the 1994-95 season came while Krzyzewski was sidelined while recovering from back surgery.

▶ Duke's seven losses this season are the most since the team lost seven games during the 2002-03 season. Six of the Blue Devils' seven losses have come against teams ranked in the top 35 of the latest RPI standings.

▶ The Blue Devils are 18th in the RPI and have the fourth toughest strength of schedule. Duke is 4-6 against teams in the top 35 of the RPI, including a 3-1 mark against top 20 teams.

▶ Duke dropped from the AP rankings this week, marking the first time since the end of the 1995-96 season that the Blue Devils have not been ranked among the top 25 teams in the country. Duke was ranked 200 consecutive weeks, the second longest streak in NCAA history. Wednesday's game snaps a string of 380 straight games played as a ranked team for the Blue Devils.

▶ Shooting percentage and turnovers have plagued the Blue Devils during their current four-game losing streak. In the last four games, Duke is shooting just 43.5 percent (101-of-232) from the field and 33.8 percent (22-of-65) from three-point distance. The Blue Devils are averaging 14.0 turnovers per game, with their opposition scoring 18.0 points per game off Duke turnovers, during the skid.

▶ The Blue Devils are 155-107 versus ranked teams under Krzyzewski, including a 68-28 mark since the 1997-98 season. Duke is 3-2 this season against ranked competition and 3-1 all-time against teams ranked 21st in the AP poll.

▶ Sophomore **Josh McRoberts** is averaging 15.3 points, 7.3 rebounds, 2.0 assists, 1.7 blocks and 1.0 steals in three career games versus Boston College. The Carmel, Ind., native is shooting 68.2 percent (15-of-22) from the field and 84.2 percent (16-of-19) from the foul line against the Eagles. McRoberts enters Wednesday's contest ranked among the ACC leaders in scoring (13.2 ppg. - 22nd), rebounds (7.9 rpg. - t-second), blocks (2.56 bpg. - second) and minutes played (34.80 mpg. - sixth).

▶ **Greg Paulus** is averaging 11.6 points, 2.2 rebounds and 3.8 assists per game in ACC play. He also has a 1.40:1 assist-to-turnover ratio in conference action and has scored in double-figures in eight of 11 league games. Over the last four games, Paulus is averaging a team-high 15.0 ppg., while shooting 40.9 percent (9-of-22) from three-point range.

▶ **Jon Scheyer** is the fifth-leading freshman scorer (12.2 ppg.) in the ACC this season. His 46 treys are the second-most (behind North Carolina's **Waye Ellington** - 48) in the ACC by a freshman this season.

102nd Season of Basketball

Duke is in its 102nd season of basketball in 2006-07. The Blue Devils have compiled a 1,814-818 record to rank fourth all-time in victories.

Duke In Elite Victory Club

With its 71-56 win over Air Force in the semifinals of the CBE Classic on Nov. 20, 2006, Duke became just the fourth school in NCAA history to have earned at least 1,800 all-time wins. Now with 1,814 wins, the Blue Devils join Kentucky (1,944), North Carolina (1,905) and Kansas (1,892) as members of the 1,800-win club.

Sustained Success

Duke has won 20 or more games 41 times in its 102 years of basketball. Including a 32-4 mark last year, Duke has won 20+ games for 10 straight seasons.

The Blue Devils have won 30 or more games nine times, including six times in the last nine seasons. All nine 30+ win seasons have come under Coach K.

Coach K Moving Up Victory Ladder

Mike Krzyzewski is one of just 19 coaches in Division I history to reach 700 career wins. His 771 wins is ninth all-time among college basketball's victory leaders (third among active coaches). Here is a look at the all-time victory leaders:

Junior **DeMarcus Nelson**, sophomore **Greg Paulus** and sophomore **Josh McRoberts** were named team captains for the 2006-07 season. Paulus and McRoberts are the first sophomores to be named team captains in the 102-year history of the Duke men's basketball program.

Blue Devil Trends

► The Blue Devils have had 11 consecutive winning seasons (including last season), the fourth-longest streak in school history.

► Duke has won 159 of its last 198 games outside of Cameron Indoor Stadium, including an 89-16 mark (.848) at neutral sites since the 1997-98 season.

► The Blue Devils are 142-10 as the top-ranked team against unranked opponents, including a 63-0 mark at home.

► Duke has had at least two first team All-ACC picks in seven of the past nine years.

► The Blue Devils have advanced to the Sweet 16 in nine consecutive seasons, the longest current streak in the nation and the second-longest of all-time behind North Carolina's 13 in succession from 1981-93.

► Duke has lost only 38 games in the past seven years. Opponents' average margin of victory in those games is just 6.1 points.

► **Greg Paulus** and **Martynas Pocius** were both named to the All-ACC Academic team last year, marking the 11th time in the past 12 years Duke has had multiple players on the team.

► Duke has been ranked in the top 5 of the AP poll 290 times overall. The Blue Devils own a 476-89 record all-time as a top 5 team. Duke is 2-1 in 2006-07 when ranked in the top 5.

► Duke has led the ACC in scoring margin in eight of the last 10 years.

Defensive Trends

Duke has made a name for itself with annual excellence on defense. Here are some of the defensive trends that separate Duke from many other programs:

► Six Duke players — **Tommy Amaker** (1987), **Billy King** (1988), **Grant Hill** (1993), **Steve Wojciechowski** (1998), **Shane Battier** (1999, 2000 and 2001) and **Shelden Williams** (2005 and 2006) — have won the National Defensive Player of the Year award.

► Duke is the only school with multiple individual National Defensive POY winners. Duke players have earned the honor in nine of the 20 years of the award.

► At least two Blue Devils have been on the ACC coaches' All-Defensive Team in six of the past nine years.

► Sixteen Duke players have been named to the ACC All-Defensive team as voted upon by the league's coaches since 1996. The next closest school, Georgia Tech, has seven honorees.

► In 896 games with **Mike Krzyzewski** as its head coach, Duke has held the opposition to less than .500 from the field 671 times (593-78 record).

► The Blue Devils are 47-0 under Coach K and 105-4 since the 1948-49 season when holding opponents under 50 points.

► Duke is 269-8 under Coach K when holding opponents to .400 or less from the field. The Blue Devils are 12-0 this season when holding opponents to .400 or less.

► Duke has led the ACC in scoring defense in two of the last three years. The Blue Devils are currently allowing an ACC-low 58.6 points per game.

Devilish On Defense

Despite the departure of two-time NABC Defensive Player of the Year **Shelden Williams**, Duke's defense is one of the best in the ACC this season. The Blue Devils are allowing an ACC-best 58.6 points per game (tied for 17th-lowest in the NCAA - as of Feb. 8) and have held 14 opponents under 56 points in a game, including six foes under 50 points this season.

Duke has held opponents to fewer than 20 points in a half six times and has limited the opposition to less than 30 points in a half on 23 occasions. Here is a look at Duke's scoring defense:

More Duke D

Duke is allowing the opposition to shoot 40.3 percent (552-of-1371) overall from the field, third-best in the ACC. The Blue Devils have held 12 opponents to less than 40.0 percent shooting from the field.

Duke's field goal percentage defense from the three-point arc is even more impressive. The Blue Devils are giving up just 4.0 three-point field goals per game with the opposition shooting 28.8 percent (99-of-344) from three-point distance.

The Blue Devils have forced 20 or more turnovers in a game five times this season and are creating 14.9 topg. In wins over Columbia, Holy Cross, UNC Greensboro, Wake Forest and N.C. State, the Blue Devils forced more turnovers than their opponents had made field goals. Here is a look at Duke's top defensive efforts this season:

Nelson Leading The Way

DeMarcus Nelson leads the Blue Devils in scoring (14.0 ppg.) and field goals (134). He is also tied for the team lead in steals (36) and second in three-point percentage (38.2 pct.) and tied for second in rebounding (5.2 rpg.). Nelson has scored in double-figures 36 times in his career, including 21 times this season. Duke is 28-8 in such games. Nelson's scoring average is up 6.9 points from a season ago, the seventh-largest increase in the ACC this season. Here is a look at the top scoring increases among ACC players:

Guard On The Glass

DeMarcus Nelson, one of the top rebounding guards in the country, is tied for second on the team in rebounding at 5.2 rpg. He is one of just two guards in the conference (joining N.C. State's Gavin Grant) averaging more than five rebounds per game. Nelson has grabbed five or more rebounds 15 times this season, including a career-high 11 boards in a win over Temple.

Super Soph

Josh McRoberts is the only player in the ACC to rank in the top 10 in rebounds (t-second - 7.9 rpg.), blocks (second - 2.56 bpg.) and minutes (sixth - 34.80 mpg.). He is also the only player in the country averaging over 10.0 points, 7.5 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 2.5 blocks per game.

Sophomore **Josh McRoberts**, a Wooden Award and Naismith Trophy candidate, is showcasing his well-rounded game in his second season at Duke. The Carmel, Ind., native leads the team in rebounding (7.9 rpg.), blocks (2.56 bpg.) and assist/turnover ratio (1.58:1). He is also second on the team and 22nd in the ACC in scoring (13.2 ppg.) and second on the team in assist with 90.

In Duke's 75-48 win over UNC Greensboro, McRoberts blocked five shots and had seven assists, marking just the fourth time in school history a player has recorded five or more assists and blocks in the same game. In a 79-72 win over Kent State, he became the first player in Duke history to register at least four points, four rebounds, four assists, four blocks and four steals in a game. He finished with 19 points, six rebounds, four assists, six blocks and four steals against the Golden Flashes. McRoberts posted a career-high 17 rebounds to go along with 15 points, five assists and three blocks in a Dec. 31 win over San Jose State. Here is a look at McRoberts' top games this season:

Paulus At The Point

Sophomore **Greg Paulus** is averaging 9.7 points, 2.0 rebounds and 3.7 assists per game. He is also shooting a team-high 42.7 percent (41-of-96) from three-point range.

Paulus has 24 career double-figure scoring games, including a career-high 23 points against Florida State on Feb. 4. Paulus knocked down a career-best five treys and finished with 17 points in a win over Wake Forest on Jan. 18.

The Syracuse, N.Y., native is averaging 12.3 points, 2.3 rebounds and 3.7 assists per game over the last 15 contests. He has reached double-figures in scoring in 12 of the 15 games and is shooting 42.5 percent (31-of-73) from three-point distance in that time span.

Fab Freshman

Freshman **Jon Scheyer** has been one of Duke's most consistent players this season. The Northbrook, Ill., native has reached double-figures in scoring 16 times and is third on the team in scoring at 12.2 ppg.

Scheyer, a two-time ACC Rookie of the Week selection, scored a career-high 26 points against No. 5 North Carolina. He also had 25 points in an 85-63 win over Miami. He went 5-of-8 from the field, including 4-of-6 from three-point distance, in the contest. Scheyer also had 20 points in a 79-56 win over N.C. State.

Scheyer On The Line

Jon Scheyer is one of the top free throw shooters in the ACC this season. He is currently third in the conference (29th in the NCAA) in free throw percentage (.865 - 90-of-104). Scheyer went 11-of-11 from the free throw line versus Miami, becoming just the 13th player (22 times) in Duke history to make all his free throws while attempting at least 10 in a game. Scheyer had a string of 40 straight made free throws, the third-longest streak at Duke (tied for seventh in the ACC), snapped against North Carolina.

David McClure has been a key contributor for the Blue Devils this season. The Ridgefield, Conn., native is tied for second on the team in rebounding at 5.2 rpg., while playing 22.0 minutes per game. He has grabbed at least five rebounds in 15 contests, including double-figure efforts against Temple (12) and Miami (11).

McClure is also averaging 4.8 points and shooting 53.5 percent (46-of-86) from the field. He is also tied for the team lead with 34 steals (t-10th in the ACC), including a career-high seven in a win over UNC Greensboro. McClure made the game-winning layup at the buzzer in a 68-66 win over Clemson on Jan. 25.

► The Blue Devils are 88-16 (.846) in neutral settings and 71-23 (.755) in true road games played since 1998.

► In ACC play, Duke is 79-22 (.782) away from home since 1997-98.

► Since 1998, Maryland (.865, 135-21) is the only ACC school that has a higher **HOME** winning percentage than Duke's .803 away winning percentage.

ACC Dual Champs

Duke has won the ACC regular season and tournament championship nine times (1963, 1964, 1966, 1986, 1992, 1999, 2000, 2001 & 2006). That feat has been accomplished just 16 other times in league history.

In the past 20 years, only seven ACC teams have won both the regular season and tournament crowns, including six times by the Blue Devils (1986, 1992, 1999, 2000, 2001 & 2006). Duke is the only program to claim the outright regular season title and conference championship (five times – 1986, 1992, 1999, 2000 & 2006) in that time span.

ACC Dominance

Duke has dominated the ACC regular season like no other program during the past 11 seasons. The Blue Devils have won 138 league games (30 games ahead of the next team), seven regular season ACC championships (including the 2006 crown) and seven of the past eight ACC Tournament titles (1999-2003, 2005 & 2006). In 2003, Duke became the first team in league history to win five straight ACC Tournament championships.

ACC Tournament History

The Blue Devils have won seven of the last eight ACC Tournament Championships including the 2006 title. Overall, Duke has posted an 80-37 record (.684) in the ACC Tournament. Duke has won 16 tournament titles, the highest championship total in the league. Duke's conference tournament titles came in 1960, 1963, 1964, 1966, 1978, 1980, 1986, 1988, 1992, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2005 and 2006.

Under head coach **Mike Krzyzewski**, Duke is 42-15 in the ACC Tournament. With 10 tournament titles at Duke, Coach K is one of 12 coaches in ACC history with two or more league championships.

Consecutive Wins At Home Vs. Non-Conference Foes

Duke completed its 2006-07 home non-conference schedule with an 11-0 record and has now won an NCAA-best 51 consecutive non-conference home games. Duke's last home loss against a non-conference foe was an 83-82 decision against St. John's on Feb. 26, 2000. The 51 straight non-conference home wins is the second-longest streak in school history. McRoberts Among Wooden Award Top 30

Josh McRoberts was named among the top 30 candidates for the John R. Wooden All-America team and Player of the Year on Jan. 30. McRoberts is one of six ACC players named to the midseason Wooden Award top 30.

Scheyer Named ACC ROW

Jon Scheyer was named ACC Rookie of the Week on Dec. 26 after averaging 15.5 points and 3.5 rebounds in a pair of Duke wins. The Northbrook, Ill., native scored 17 points and pulled down three rebounds in a 79-72 win over Kent State on Dec. 19. Two nights later, Scheyer tallied 14 points and grabbed four rebounds in a 61-54 win over 22nd-ranked Gonzaga.

Scheyer was also named ACC Co-ROW on Jan. 22 after leading Duke to wins over Wake Forest and N.C. State. He averaged 14.5 points, 3.5 rebounds and 2.0 assists per game for the week to share honors with Miami's Dwayne Collins.

McRoberts Tabbed ACC Co-Player of the Week

Josh McRoberts and Virginia's Sean Singletary were named ACC Co-Players of the Week on Jan. 2. McRoberts posted his second straight double-double with 15 points and a career-high 17 rebounds in a 70-51 win over San Jose State, while Singletary had 33 points in a Cavalier win.

Senior Class of One

Joe Pagliuca is the lone senior on the roster for the Blue Devils this season. Head coach Mike Krzyzewski has now had four teams at Duke with only one senior. It is also the 11th time (1927, 1938, 1947, 1951, 1957, 1960, 1978, 1982, 2000, 2002, 2007) in Duke history that the club has had only one senior on the roster. The Blue Devils have had 13 years (1925, 1933, 1934, 1935, 1936, 1937, 1939, 1941, 1942, 1943, 1945, 1946, 1953) without a senior on the team.

Duke Youth

Duke head coach Mike Krzyzewski enters the 2006-07 season with one of the youngest teams in Duke history. With just two upperclassmen (senior Joe Pagliuca and junior DeMarcus Nelson) the Blue Devils have the fewest upperclassmen since the 1945-46 season. Prior to this season, the fewest upperclassmen on the roster during Krzyzewski's tenure was four (two juniors and two seniors) in 1986-87. Here is a look at the youngest teams in Duke history:

Duke Tops New NCAA Evaluation

An NCAA report released on Nov. 9 showed that college athletes nationwide are graduating at higher rates than before, with Duke as the leading institution for student-athlete graduation rate.

The report, which was compiled from incoming freshman athletes in the 1999-2000 academic year, showed that within a six-year span after their enrollment, 91 percent of Duke's student-athletes graduated (national average - 63 pct.). Over the same period, 93 percent of Duke's overall student body graduated, as opposed to 61 percent nationally. Beyond Duke, three other institutions-Boston College, Bucknell and Northwestern-graduated at least 90 percent of their student-athletes.

Duke Inks Three During Early Signing Period

Head coach **Mike Krzyzewski** announced the signing of three senior high school student-athletes to national letters-of-intent during November's early signing period. **Taylor King, Kyle Singler** and **Nolan Smith** each signed national letters-of-intent to attend Duke, giving the Blue Devils another top-10 recruiting class. Scout.com rates the class third overall, while Rivals.com ranks the group sixth in the country.

King, a 6-7, 215-pound small forward from Santa Ana, Calif., is ranked 35th overall and 11th among small forwards by Rivals.com. Last season, King shot 64 percent from the field and averaged 17.1 ppg., 10.2 rpg. and 4.7 bpg. as a junior at Mater Dei High School. He has helped Mater Dei to an 88-12 record and two state runner-up finishes in three seasons.

Singler, the fourth-ranked player in the 2007 class, has led South Medford (Ore.) to an 83-7 record over the past three years, including a state championship in 2005. The 6-8, 210-pound small forward averaged 20.5 points, 5.4 rebounds and 1.9 assists per game as a junior, earning *Parade Magazine* All-America second team honors along the way.

Smith, a 6-4, 175-pound combo guard, led Oak Hill Academy to a 40-1 record and a No. 2 ranking in the final *USA Today* national rankings last season. As a junior, he averaged 17.0 points, 5.0 rebounds, 5.0 assists and 2.0 steals per game, while shooting 73 percent from the field, 45 percent from three-point distance and 86 percent from the foul line.

All three members of the 2007 class were key contributors on the gold medal-winning USA Men's U-18 National Team in 2006. King was third on the team in scoring at 12.0 ppg. and fourth among tournament leaders in both three-point field goals (10) and three-point pct. (10-of-21, .476). Singler averaged 11.0 points, 6.3 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.3 steals per game. Smith recorded 9.0 points, 4.0 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.8 steals per game and was tied for eighth in the tournament in free throws made (15) and free throw percentage (15-20, .750). The

USA Under-18 National Team posted four straight wins at the FIBA Americas Championship in San Antonio, Texas to qualify for the 2007 U-19 FIBA World Championship.

Blue Devils In The NBA

On opening night in the NBA, Duke had the second-most alumni competing in the league. In addition, the combined salary of the 13 former Blue Devils ranks as the highest-paid group in the NBA.

The Duke basketball program has held a prominent spot in the national basketball scene since the beginning of the post-World War II era. The final national rankings are just one measuring stick in which the Blue Devils are among the elite in the history of the sport.

In the Coach K era, which began in 1980-81, Duke has finished in the Associated Press top 25 a total of 20 seasons, including seven times as the No. 1 team in the nation. Last season Duke finished No. 1 in the final regular season poll and No. 7 in the *USA Today*/ESPN rankings, marking the 27th time Duke has placed in the top 10 at the end of the regular season. With consecutive AP No. 1 finishes from 1999-2002, Duke became the first school in college basketball history to be ranked at the top of the final AP poll four straight years.

Here is a look at some of the notes from Duke and the rankings:

- ▶ Duke has been ranked No. 1 in either the AP or *USA Today*/ESPN coaches poll at some point in the season in 14 of the past 21 years.
- ▶ **Mike Krzyzewski** has spent more weeks ranked in the top 25 (387 weeks), top 10 (331) and No. 1 (92) than any other active coach (AP poll only).
- ▶ Duke has been ranked No. 1 79 weeks since 1990, the most by any school in the nation. The next closest school is Kansas at 32 weeks during the same time span.
- ▶ Duke has been No. 1 92 weeks (188 games, 165-23) in the AP poll since 1986.
- ▶ Of the 896 games coached at Duke by Krzyzewski, 755 of them have come as a ranked team (84.2 percent). Duke's record (under Coach K) as a ranked team is 620-135.
- ▶ Under Coach K, Duke has played more games as a No. 1 team (188) than it has as an unranked team (138).
- ▶ The Blue Devils was ranked in the top 25 of the AP poll in 380 consecutive games from Nov. 20, 1996 through Feb. 11, 2007.
- ▶ Duke has been ranked No. 1 in the nation 110 weeks overall, the second-highest figure in NCAA history behind only UCLA (128).
- ▶ Duke's current streak of finishing in the top 10 of the AP poll for 10 consecutive seasons is second all-time behind UCLA (13 straight years 1967-79).
- ▶ Duke's 1991-92 team is one of only 12 in college basketball history to be ranked No. 1 the entire season.
- ▶ Duke has been ranked in 200 of the last 201 AP polls. The Blue Devils have been in the top 10 of 130 of the last 137 polls.

No. 1 Devils

Since the 1997-98 season, Duke has been ranked No. 1 in the Associated Press poll 55 weeks, 32 more than the next closest team (Connecticut). The Blue Devils reached the top ranking seven consecutive seasons from 1998-2004, becoming just the second program in NCAA history to accomplish that feat. UCLA holds the record with 12 consecutive seasons being ranked No. 1 at some point (1964-75). Duke is the only school to gain the top ranking in the land in more than four of the past nine seasons. The Blue Devils finished the season ranked No. 1 in the AP poll for four consecutive seasons (1999-2002), an unprecedented feat in college basketball history.

Overall, Duke has a 189-28 record as the nation's top-ranked team. Of those 217 games at No. 1, **Mike Krzyzewski** has coached Duke in 188 of them, compiling a 165-23 record.

Winning seasons, superb graduation rates for his players and a basketball team that is as close as family are all attributes that reflect on the man who is in his 27th year as the head coach of the Duke Blue Devils, Hall of Famer **Mike Krzyzewski**.

Continuing to build on his well-earned reputation as one of the top college basketball coaches of all-time, Coach K led Duke to a 32-4 record, its ninth consecutive appearance in the NCAA Sweet 16, the No. 1 final national ranking and its seventh ACC tournament championship in the past eight seasons in 2005-06.

From 1999-2002, Duke finished number one in the nation in the final Associated Press poll for a record four consecutive seasons. In 2003-04, the Blue Devils reached the nation's top spot in the AP poll, marking the seventh straight year they had been number one (only UCLA's string of 12 consecutive years reaching No. 1 from

1964-75 was longer). The 2004-05 season completed a nine-year run in which Duke compiled an incredible 119-25 ACC regular season record. Duke has won seven of the past 10 ACC regular season crowns and has won at least 11 ACC regular season contests in each of the past 10 years, which is another ACC first. In the past seven years, four different Blue Devils — **Elton Brand**, **Shane Battier**, **Jason Williams** (twice) and **J.J. Redick** (twice) — have earned National Player of the Year honors. Also, Duke's 133 victories over a four-year period from 1998-2001 established an NCAA record.

Krzyzewski's record as Duke's all-time winningest coach offers evidence of his success: 698 total wins; 387 weeks ranked in the top 25; 331 weeks ranked in the top 10; 92 weeks ranked No. 1; 10 Final Four berths in the last 20 years, including five straight appearances from 1988-92; 21 seasons with at least 20 wins in the past 23 years; 21 upper-division finishes in the ACC in the past 22 years; nine 30-win seasons (most by any coach all-time); 11 regular season ACC crowns and 10 Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament titles, including seven of the last eight years (a record five in succession from 1999-2003).

But most impressive are the three national championships (1991, 1992 and 2001) that make Coach K one of only four coaches in NCAA history to earn three or more NCAA titles. In addition to Krzyzewski, only John Wooden (10), Adolph Rupp (4) and Bob Knight (3) have accomplished that feat. With back-to-back national championships in 1991 and 1992, Coach K became the first coach since Wooden in 1972-73 to earn consecutive NCAA crowns.

He and the Blue Devils have been a fixture on the national basketball scene with 11 consecutive NCAA Tournament berths from 1984-94 and 22 in the last 23 years. Overall, he has taken his program to postseason play in 23 of his 26 years in Durham and is the winningest active coach in NCAA Tournament play with a stunning 68-19 record for a 78.2 winning percentage. His 68 tournament wins rank first in NCAA history.

Coach K owns a 771-257 career record while attaining a 698-198 mark at Duke. On Nov. 17, 2000, Krzyzewski earned his 500th win at Duke with a 98-85 triumph over Villanova. That night, the fabled floor of Cameron Indoor Stadium was dedicated as Coach K Court. On Dec. 12, 2004, Krzyzewski became just one of 17 coaches in Division I history to reach 700 or more wins. With a win over Seton Hall on Nov. 16, 2005, Coach K also became just the 10th coach in NCAA history to record 650 wins at one school.

Such accomplishments have not gone unnoticed. In all, Coach K has been named the National Coach of the Year 12 times in eight different seasons, including *Basketball Times*, UPI and Chevrolet (1986), Naismith (1989), the NABC (1991), *The Sporting News* and Naismith (1992), *Basketball Times* (1997), the NABC and Naismith (1999), Chevrolet (2000) and the Victor Awards (2001). He was named Coach of the Decade for the 1990s by the NABC and was the second recipient of the John R. Wooden Legends of Coaching Award. On October 5, 2001, Coach K was presented by his college coach Bob Knight as one of three members of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame class of 2001 (Krzyzewski joined Temple's John Chaney and former NBA star Moses Malone as 2001 inductees).

In 1992, *The Sporting News* named him the Sportsman of the Year, becoming the first college coach to win the honor. The magazine said, "On the court and off, Krzyzewski is a family man first, a teacher second, a basketball coach third, and a winner at all three. He is what's right about sports..."

Krzyzewski received another prestigious honor in 2001 as he was named "America's Best Coach" — all coaches, any sport, any level of play — by *Time* magazine and CNN. "No college hoops coach has won more in the past two decades," wrote Josh Tyrangiel of *Time*, "and Krzyzewski has accomplished all this with a program that turns out real-deal scholar athletes — kids who go to class, graduate and don't mind telling everyone about it."

On the court, Coach K has averaged more than 25 wins a season during his career at Duke and more than 31 wins per year over the last six seasons. Duke has won at least 30 games in seven of the past 13 seasons. He directed his teams to nine straight trips to the round of 16 from 1998-2006, as well as joining Wooden as the only coach to guide a team to the Final Four five consecutive years.

Krzyzewski added to his already impressive list of accomplishments on Sept. 26, 2005 when he was named head coach of the USA Basketball Men's Senior National Team program for 2006-2008.

Freshman center **Brian Zoubek** scored a game-high 18 points as 12th-ranked Duke earned an 86-43 season-opening victory over Columbia in the first round of the CBE Classic in Cameron Indoor Stadium.

Columbia went ahead 3-0 on a three-point bucket in the opening minutes, but **Jon Scheyer** responded with a trey of his own. A steal and layup by **DeMarcus Nelson** then gave the Blue Devils a 5-3 advantage and Duke would never trail again. Scheyer connected on 4-of-5 three-point attempts for 12 first half points as the Blue Devils held a 46-24 lead at intermission.

Zoubek connected on 4-of-7 field goals and 10-of-13 free throws and added six rebounds and one blocked shot in 14 minutes of action. Fellow rookies Scheyer and **Lance Thomas** chipped in 12 points each while Nelson had 11 points along with three steals, three blocks and two assists. **Josh McRoberts** had a perfect shooting evening, sinking both of his field goal attempts and all four foul shots for eight points. He also logged a game-high seven boards, three assists and three blocks.

Georgia Southern jumped out to a 4-0 advantage and led 18-12. The lead changed hands 11 times in the first half, but Duke closed the half with a 9-2 run, including a Nelson three-pointer at the buzzer, to give the Blue Devils a 38-32 lead at intermission.

Ahead by six at 44-38, **Lance Thomas** started a 9-0 run with a layup and the Blue Devils took a 53-38 lead on **Gerald Henderson's** jumper with 14:28 left in the contest. Georgia Southern would get no closer than 13 points the rest of the way.

The Blue Devils limited the Eagles to 16 points in the second half as Georgia Southern made just 7-of-33 field goals (21.2 pct.). The Blue Devils went from 41.7 percent (10-of-24) shooting from the floor in the first half to 58.3 percent (14-of-24) in the second stanza.

Josh McRoberts added 16 points, six rebounds and three blocked shots while Henderson had 13 points and a pair of steals. **Jon Scheyer** chipped in 11 points, four boards and four assists.

Duke was 9-for-16 from the field in the second half and the backcourt tandem of Paulus and Scheyer were 6-for-8 after going a combined 0-for-4 in the first half.

Josh McRoberts had 15 points for Duke, which came into the game allowing just 52.3 points per game. McRoberts also had seven rebounds and six assists while DeMarcus Nelson added 12 points.

Holy Cross led by a 28-22 count at intermission, holding the Blue Devils to just 32.0 percent (8-of-25) shooting from the floor in the opening 20 minutes.

Duke came out of intermission running, and McRoberts' fast break dunk at the 16:56 mark knotted the contest at 30-30. Henderson finished with eight points and four rebounds while Thomas added a game-best eight boards. Jon Scheyer contributed five points, seven rebounds and three assists against just one turnover in 33 minutes of action.

Despite 22 points from DeMarcus Nelson, Virginia Tech defeated fifth-ranked Duke in overtime, 69-67, at Cameron Indoor Stadium.

Virginia Tech scored the first eight points of the game, but Duke battled back to knot the game at 14-14 just under eight minutes into the contest. The Hokies then used a 13-8 spurt to close the half to lead 38-33.

Duke took its first lead of the game at 51-49 with 11:33 remaining. The lead then changed hands five times before Tech led by three (62-59) at the 3:00 mark. Gerald Henderson trimmed the margin to one with 35 seconds left, and two Hokie foul shots pushed the lead back to three six seconds later. Nelson buried a trey with 19 seconds left to tie the game at 64-64.

In overtime, McRoberts gave Duke a 66-64 advantage on the opening possession, but the Hokies countered with two free throws. McRoberts hit one free throw with 1:28 left for a 67-66 lead, but Tech then went ahead with 30 seconds left and, following a Duke miss, the Hokies got a free throw to lead by two. Greg Paulus' last-second effort from three-point range was blocked.

Nelson was 8-of-13 from the floor including a 4-of-6 effort from behind the three-point arc. McRoberts posted a double-double with 16 points and 10 rebounds, while Jon Scheyer finished with 12 points.

Despite a career-high 23 points from **Greg Paulus**, the Duke Blue Devils suffered a 68-67 loss to Florida State in Cameron Indoor Stadium.

Duke got off to a good start, holding leads of 7-0, 17-5 and 27-10 in the first 11 minutes of the game. Florida State, however, closed the half on a 23-9 run to trail 36-33 at intermission.

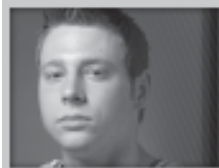
