LAST TIME: Virginia Tech held Duke to 139 yards of total offense and kept the Blue Devils off the scoreboard in a 36-0 victory in Blacksburg. Hokie QB **Sean Glennon** passed for 301 yards and two touchdowns to lead the way while **Eddie Royal** added a 58-yard punt return for a touchdown in the first quarter.

RANKINGS: Virginia Tech is ranked 12th in this week's Associated Press national poll. The Hokies are 10th in the USA Today coaches poll. Duke is unranked.

COACHES: Duke's **Ted Roof**, a 1987 graduate of Georgia Tech, is in his fourth full season as head coach of the Blue Devils and holds a record of 6-39 ... **Frank Beamer**, a 1969 graduate of Virginia Tech, is in his 21st season as the head coach at his alma mater with a 203-106-4 career record for the third most wins among active coaches.

2007 Homecoming: Duke Hosts Virginia Tech

The Duke football team will host Virginia Tech on Saturday, October 13 at 12 noon for the 2007 edition of Homecoming. The game will be televised live by Lincoln Financial Sports with **Steve Martin** (play-by-play), **Rick "Doc" Walker** (analyst) and **Mike Hogewood** (sideline) calling the game. Last week, the Blue Devils' second half comeback attempt fell short against Wake Forest in a 41-36 setback. Virginia Tech is coming off a 41-23 victory at Clemson to improve to 2-0 in ACC play.

The Duke-Virginia Tech Series

Duke and Virginia Tech have met 14 times on the gridiron, with the series deadlocked at 7-7. The series dates back to a 25-0 Blue Devil win in 1937 and Duke won six in a row and seven of the first eight meetings to start the series between the two schools. Through the first six games, the Blue Devils held an impressive 207-19 scoring advantage.

Virginia Tech Scouting Report

The Hokies enter this weekend's contest with a 5-1 overall record and a 2-0 mark in the ACC as they have won four straight games since suffering a loss at LSU in the second week of the season. Virginia Tech is led by its special teams and defensive units which have tallied six total touchdowns this season. **Eddie Royal** owns two punt returns for scores while **Victor Harris** has a 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown. On defense, **Harris**, **Brandon Flowers** and **D.J. Parker** have each returned interceptions for touchdowns.

More Duke-Virginia Tech Series Notes

- In Duke's 18-0 victory over the Hokies in 1938, **Robert O'Mara** rushed 20 times for 180 yards. The yardage total ranks 15th on Duke's individual single-game chart. At the time of the game, O'Mara's performance ranked second-best at Duke behind **Jack Alexander's** 193-yard outing against North Carolina in 1935.

- On October 20, 1951 against Virginia Tech, left halfback **Charlie Smith** took a pitch from quarterback **Jerry Barger** and raced 85 yards — untouched — to establish the longest rushing play from scrimmage in Duke gridiron history. Interestingly enough, the same game included a 75-yard run from scrimmage by Duke's **Piney Field** — a dash that matches the 12th-longest run in Blue Devil football history.

- Virginia Tech's 469 rushing yards in the Hokies' 48-12 win over Duke in 1969 rank as the third-highest single-game total allowed by the Blue Devils. The total stands as Virginia Tech's second-best single-game total behind a 500-yard effort versus Pittsburgh in 1993.

- In a wild finish at Wallace Wade Stadium, Duke's **Dennis Tabron** intercepted a **Steve Casey** pass and returned it 10 yards for a touchdown with just 56 seconds remaining in the game to lift the Blue Devils to a 14-7 victory on October 10, 1981. **Cyrus Lawrence** paced the Hokie attack with 177 rushing yards while Duke's **Cedric Jones** caught five passes for 58 yards and a TD.

- On October 8, 1982 in Durham, the Hokies rallied from a 21-0 deficit to defeat Duke, 22-21. Duke QB **Ben Bennett** threw two TD passes to **Chris Castor** and **Joel Blunk** scored on a one-yard run to give the Blue Devils a three-touchdown advantage in the second period. Tech answered with a touchdown in each of the second, third and fourth quarters, and **Todd Greenwood** hooked up with **Mike Shaw** for a game-winning two-point conversion with just 33 seconds left in the contest. Bennett finished the day with 20 completions in 29 attempts for 290 yards while Greenwood threw for 218 yards.

- On October 13, 1984 in Blacksburg, Virginia Tech blanked Duke, 27-0, as the Hokie defense held the Blue Devils to minus-4 rushing yards. Hokie quarterback **Mike Cox** threw for 153 yards and two touchdowns while Duke managed just 68 total yards on the day.

- On September 18, 2004 in Blacksburg, the Hokies played their first ACC football game against Duke, defeating the Blue Devils by a 41-17 count on their way to winning the league championship.

High School Graduates

Duke's **Alfred Williams** and the Hokies' **Mario Edwards** both graduated from Westlake H.S. (Georgia). Duke's **Andrew Holoman** and Virginia Tech's **Ed Wang** both graduated from Stone Bridge H.S. in Ashburn, Va.

First and 10

- Duke first-year assistant coach **Danny Pearman** spent eight seasons on the coaching staff at Virginia Tech, helping the Hokies to a 78-23 record, two league titles (1999 Big East & 2004 ACC) and eight bowl game berths.

- **Thaddeus Lewis'** 15 touchdown passes this season already match the seventh-best single-season performance in Duke history. **Anthony Dilweg** holds the school standard with 24 scoring tosses in 1988.

- Over the past three games, **Eron Riley** has 15 receptions for 409 yards and seven touchdowns. On the year, Riley leads the ACC in receiving yards (544), receiving yards per game (90.7) and touchdown catches (7).

- Lewis and Riley have hooked up for a touchdown through the air seven times this season and 10 times in their careers. The **Ben Bennett-to-Chris Castor** combination holds the school's single-season and career standards with 13 during the 1982 campaign and 17 for their careers.

- **Vincent Rey** has an ACC-best 72 total tackles through six games.

- The margin of victory in Duke's last five games is 7.0 points. In that stretch, Duke defeated Northwestern by six (20-14) points while suffering four defeats by an average of 7.3 points.

- Duke's last win over a nationally-ranked team came in 1994 when the 23rd-ranked Blue Devils knocked off 13th-ranked Virginia, 28-25, in Durham.

A Glance At The 2007 Opponents

Duke's 12 opponents in 2007 are a combined 42-26 (.618) at the midpoint of the season. In 2006, Duke's foes combined for an 87-67 (.565) overall record with eight schools playing in bowl games.

Lewis Climbing Career TD List

Sophomore quarterback **Thaddeus Lewis** added four touchdowns to his career total against Wake Forest, giving him 26 to move into sixth all-time and one shy of **Anthony Dilweg** for fifth. Lewis has 11 touchdown passes as a freshman last year — including six in the final two games — and has 15 through six games this season. Lewis has a touchdown pass in 13 of his 18 career games and has thrown a touchdown pass in each of his past eight contests.

Lewis Inches Closer To Dilweg

With four scoring tosses last week, **Thaddeus Lewis** moved into a tie for seventh place on Duke's single-season list for touchdown passes. At the midway point of the season, he already has thrown 15 touchdowns and is only nine away from tying **Anthony Dilweg's** record total of 24 set in 1988.

Thaddeus Lewis passed for 291 yards against Wake Forest to move into eighth place on the all-time passing yards list at Duke with 3,625 career yards. Only a sophomore, Lewis is now 277 yards shy of **D. Bryant** for seventh place on the all-time list.

Four Straight 200-Yard Games

After opening the season with 285 passing yards combined in the first two games, **Thaddeus Lewis** has passed for over 200 yards in each of his last four contests, including Northwestern (246), Navy (428), Miami (241) and Wake Forest (291). He now has nine 200-yard games in his career.

Lewis Records First For Duke QBs

Thaddeus Lewis is the first quarterback in the history of Duke football to throw 10 or more touchdown passes in both his freshman and sophomore seasons. After throwing 11 as a true freshman in 2006, he has already topped that total with 15 through six games this season. Only a sophomore, Lewis already ranks among the school's top 10 in career passing yards and TDs.

Lewis Among ACC & NCAA Leaders

Sophomore **Thaddeus Lewis** ranks in the top 10 of the ACC in several categories, ranking tied for first in touchdown passes, second in pass efficiency and third in both passing yards and total offense. Nationally, he ranks tied for eighth with 15 touchdown passes, 26th with 1,491 passing yards and 29th in passing efficiency with a 141.23 QB rating.

Four TD Tosses

Thaddeus Lewis has thrown four touchdown passes against both Navy and Wake Forest this season, joining **Dave Brown** and **Steve Slayden** as the only Duke quarterbacks to throw four touchdowns twice in the same season. Lewis is the only Duke signal-caller with three career four-touchdown games as he also tallied four TD's against North Carolina last season. The four touchdowns are tied for the second-most in a single game in Duke history. The record of six was set by Slayden against Georgia Tech in 1987. He also had four touchdowns against Vanderbilt that year. Brown threw four touchdowns against both N.C. State and Wake Forest during the 1989 season. **Scotty Glacken** is the only other quarterback with two four-TD games in a career.

Bennett / Lewis Comparison

Ben Bennett, who starred for the Blue Devils from 1980-83, finished his career by completing 820-of-1,375 throws for 9,614 yards and 55 touchdowns. As a senior, he earned third team All-America and ACC Player of the Year honors. Here is how sophomore quarterback **Thaddeus Lewis** stacks up against Bennett — Duke's all-time leader in pass completions, attempts, yards and touchdowns — through the first 18 games of each player's respective career:

Lewis Responsible For 34 Points At Navy

With four touchdown passes, one rushing touchdown and two successful two-point conversions, **Thaddeus Lewis** was responsible for 34 of Duke's 43 points at Navy. He surpassed his previous high of 26 points set versus North Carolina in 2006. The Duke record is 36 points, held by **Steve Slayden**, who passed for six scores against Georgia Tech in 1987, and **Tom Powers**, who rushed for six TDs against Richmond in 1950.

Lewis Efficient Against Northwestern & Navy

Quarterback **Thaddeus Lewis** put together back-to-back quality performances against Northwestern and Navy with two of the NCAA's top single-game passing efficiency ratings this season. At Northwestern, he completed 82.6 percent of his passes (19-of-23) for 246 yards and three scores for a 215.5 efficiency rating. At Navy, Lewis completed 63.9 percent of his passes (23-of-36) for 428 yards and four touchdowns for a 205.98 efficiency rating.

400-Yard Outing for Lewis

Sophomore quarterback **Thaddeus Lewis** recorded just the 11th 400-yard passing game in school history when he completed 23-of-36 attempts for 428 yards and four touchdowns at Navy. The 428 yards marks the seventh-highest single-game total in Duke history. There have been 29 quarterbacks with 400-yard games in the NCAA this season.

Lewis Finds The Mark At Northwestern

Sophomore quarterback **Thaddeus Lewis** was near perfect in Duke's 20-14 victory over Northwestern. In the first half, he led the Blue Devils to a 20-7 lead completing 14 of his 15 pass attempts for 186 yards and three touchdowns. He completed his last 12 passes of the half and would extend that streak to 15 straight completions in the second half, the second most in Duke history. He finished the contest completing 82.6 percent of his passes (19-of-23) for 246 yards and three scores.

Lewis-to-Riley

Quarterback **Thaddeus Lewis** has connected with wideout **Eron Riley** for seven touchdown passes this season and 10 times in the past two seasons. The Duke record for quarterback-to-wide receiver scoring connections is 17 touchdowns held by **Ben Bennett** and **Chris Castor**. The Bennett-to-Castor combination also holds the school single-season standard with 13 touchdowns in 1982. This season Lewis threw two touchdowns to Riley against Wake Forest, one at Miami and four at Navy. Only one other time in school history did a QB throw four touchdown passes to the same receiver. In 1997, **David Green** hit **Corey Thomas** for touchdown passes of 36, 19, four and 18 yards against Georgia Tech.

Spreading The Ball Around

Sophomore quarterbacks **Thaddeus Lewis** and **Zack Asack** have spread the ball around this season, completing passes to 12 different receivers. They have combined to complete 75 passes for 1,172 yards and 11 touchdowns to wide receivers. The running back corps has tallied 28 grabs for 270 yards and two touchdowns and the tight ends have eight catches for 63 yards and two touchdowns.

Touchdown King

Sophomore tight end **Brandon King** made his first two catches on the season count as both resulted in touchdowns for the Blue Devils. His first career touchdown came in the season-opener against Connecticut when he gave Duke its first TD of 2007 with a six-yard score. At Northwestern, he broke a 7-7 tie with a seven-yard touchdown grab.

Scoring Quickly

Duke has scored six touchdowns this season in under a minute. At Navy, four of Duke's six touchdown drives lasted less than a minute. Two of the drives took only one play as **Thaddeus Lewis** hit **Eron Riley** for touchdown passes of 76 and 35 yards on back-to-back offensive plays, lasting just 20 and 19 seconds, respectively. The two hooked up for a nine-yard score to cap a four play, 58-yard drive that took 39 seconds and then the duo's final touchdown was the second play of a 70-yard drive that lasted just 54 seconds. Lewis capped a three-play, 16 yard drive with a 16-yard touchdown pass to **Jomar Wright** at Virginia. Last weekend, Lewis connected with Riley for a 68-yard touchdown pass on the second play of a drive that lasted 54 seconds.

Ronnie Drummer and **Felix Jones** of Arkansas are the only two active players in the nation with both a run from scrimmage of 80 or more yards and a 100-yard kickoff return to his credit. In 2005 at Miami, Drummer sprinted 81 yards for a touchdown. In the 2005 season-opener at East Carolina, Drummer returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown. The kickoff return matched the Duke record since the NCAA began recording official statistics in 1938, equalling returns by **Leroy Gallman** (vs. Tennessee in 1994) and **Greg Boone** (vs. Tennessee in 1982). In his career Drummer has seven career touchdowns, averaging 47 yards per play.

Boyette Breaks Long Run

Junior running back **Re'quan Boyette** broke a 62-yard run against Wake Forest for Duke's longest rush of the season. Boyette's longest run of his career is 78 yards, good for a touchdown against Florida State in 2005. He finished the Wake Forest game with 77 yards on eight carries, an average of 9.6 yards per attempt.

Offensive Line Experience

One year after having the least experienced offensive line unit in the nation, Duke returns all five starters, joining Virginia as the only two ACC squads to bring all five offensive line starters back from 2006. Senior **Matt Rumsey** has started 29 straight games at center while tackle **Cameron Goldberg**, who was named Duke's Most Outstanding Offensive Player a year ago, also returns. Seven players on Duke's roster have combined for 102 career starts and over 7,000 total snaps, giving the Blue Devils solid experience up front.

Tough Defenses Ahead

Over its next four games, Duke will face four of the top five defenses in the ACC based on total yards per game in Virginia Tech (320.2 ypg/5th), Florida State (302.6 ypg/3rd), Clemson (289.3 ypg/1st) and Georgia Tech (302.3 ypg/2nd). This weekend's opponent, Virginia Tech, is second in the ACC in pass efficiency defense and is allowing the second fewest points per game (15.6).

Duke Radio Network

A state-wide radio audience follows all the action of Duke football on The Duke Radio Network. The network provides in-depth pregame coverage, live play-by-play of all the action, and the post-game press conferences straight from the locker room to stations via satellite each game. The one-hour tailgate show, hosted by **John Roth**, is broadcast live from the Blue Devil Tailgate Terrace at home games.

Two-time North Carolina Broadcaster of the Year **Bob Harris**, the voice of the Blue Devils for the past 31 seasons, calls all the action for Duke fans each game. He was inducted into the Stanly County (N.C.) Sports Hall of Fame in 1993 and the North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame in 2006.

Analyst **Wes Chesson** joins Harris in the booth each game and is in his 27th season providing color commentary for Duke games. Chesson, an All-ACC receiver at Duke from 1968-70, still holds five school receiving records, hauling in 164 catches for 2,399 yards during his playing days. He went on to play with the NFL's Atlanta Falcons (1971-73) and Philadelphia Eagles (1973-74).

In December of 2000, Harris and Chesson were selected to work the 64th annual Shrine Bowl Game of the Carolinas in Charlotte, N.C.

Anthony Dilweg, the 1988 ACC Player of the Year, joins the broadcast team for his ninth season, serving as the sideline reporter with a keen inside perspective. **John Rose** serves as the network's engineer.

After averaging just 31.0 yards per punt in the season opener against Connecticut, he has increased his average to 41.2 yards per punt and now ranks seventh in the ACC with his average. On the season, Jones has a long punt of 64 yards at Northwestern and has seven boots downed inside the 20-yard line.

Two-Point Conversion Success

The Blue Devils have gone for two points after a touchdown six times this season and have converted four of those attempts. At Navy, Duke attempted two two-point conversions and **Thaddeus Lewis** connected with **Nick Stefanow** on both tries for successful attempts. The first two-point conversion attempt of the season came at Virginia when Lewis passed the ball to **Tielor Robinson** for the two points. Against Wake Forest the Blue Devils were 1-for-3 with Lewis connecting with **Clifford Harris** on the successful attempt.

Most Points in Loss Since 1987

Duke scored 43 points at Navy, but it was not enough as the Mids booted a field goal on the game's final snap to prevail, 46-43. The 43 points scored in a loss were the most since 1987 when Duke lost to N.C. State, 47-45. Duke's offense scored 36 points in the opening half at Navy, the most a Duke team had scored in the first half since 1999 when the Blue Devils put 41 points on the board against Wake Forest.

Captains and Coin Toss

Through six games this season, Duke has had 19 different players represent the team as game captains. **Patrick Bailey**, **Thaddeus Lewis**, **Eron Riley** and **Cameron Goldberg** have all been captains in two games. Duke has won the coin toss in four of the six games this season. They elected to receive against Virginia and Navy and deferred to the second half against Northwestern and Wake Forest.

Consecutive Starts Streak

Several Duke players extended their consecutive starts streak at Wake Forest. Long snapper **Casey Hales** has the longest streak with 40 straight starts at his position. **Matt Rumsey** extended his starts streak to 29 straight games, earning the start at center. Rush end **Patrick Bailey** has now started in 26 consecutive games while **Eron Riley** is next with 19 consecutive starts. **Zach Maurides**, **Rob Schirman** and **Vince Oghobaase** have all started in 18 straight games while **Adrian Aye-Darko** and **Thaddeus Lewis** have made 17 straight starts.

Nine New Defensive Starters

The Blue Devil defense has featured nine first-time starters this season with five against Connecticut, two more at Virginia and one against both Northwestern and Navy. All three linebacker slots were filled with first time starters against Connecticut, including **Tim Ball**, **Vincent Rey** and **Charles Robinson**. Rey tallied 17 tackles, Robinson had seven tackles and an interception and Ball had seven tackles. Defensive end **Ryan Radloff** and cornerback **Leon Wright** also received their first career starts against the Huskies with Wright recording eight tackles. Two players earned their first collegiate starts on the defensive line at Virginia as **Greg Akinbiyi** and **Kinney Rucker** earned nods with Akinbiyi posting seven tackles. At Northwestern **Wesley Oglesby** earned his first career start and recorded one sack and four quarterback hurries. True freshman **Adam Banks** drew his first career start at Navy and had two tackles.

First Time Blue Devils

In the season-opener against Connecticut, 17 Blue Devils saw the first playing time of their respective careers including eight redshirt freshmen (**Abraham Kromah**, **Sheldon Bell**, **Patrick Egboh**, **Kevin Jones**, **Marcus Lind**, **Mitchell Lederman**, **Brett Huffman** and **Wesley Oglesby**) and seven true freshmen (**Adam Banks**, **Bryan Morgan**, **Matt Pridemore**, **Tony Jackson**, **Eddie Morgan**, **Nick Maggio** and **Austin Kelly**). In addition, sophomores **Ben Loebner** and **Kinney Rucker** earned their first snaps as Blue Devils versus the Huskies. **Jeremy Ringfield** made his collegiate debut at Northwestern. True freshmen **Danny Parker** and **Damian Thornton** received their first action at Navy.

All 11 Back In The Fold

Duke is the only team in the ACC that returns all 11 starters on offense from last year. Behind the Blue Devils are Miami and Virginia — each bring back nine starters — while Wake Forest returns eight. Defensively, the Blue Devils have five returning starters to match the second fewest in the league along with N.C. State and trailing only North Carolina's total of four.

Under Duke's Roof

On December 6, 2003, **Ted Roof** became the 20th head coach in Duke football history. A 1987 graduate of Georgia Tech, Roof served as Duke's interim head coach for the final five weeks of the 2003 season. Under Roof's guidance, Duke snapped a 30-game losing streak in ACC play with a 41-17 victory over Georgia Tech on November 8, and then closed out the season by defeating North Carolina, 30-22, for the Blue Devils' first win over the Tar Heels since 1989. Roof owns a 6-38 overall head coaching record with the Blue Devils. As a senior at Georgia Tech, he earned All-ACC accolades, captained the 1985 Yellow Jackets to a 9-2-1 season and guided the team to a win over Michigan State in the All American Bowl. The Lawrenceville, Ga., native finished his career with 417 tackles and was inducted into the Georgia Tech Athletics Hall of Fame in 1998.

Four New to Duke Coaching Staff

The Duke coaching staff has four new faces for the 2007 season in former Duke lettermen **John Gutekunst** and **Deonto McCormick**, as well as two first-year coordinators in **Danny Pearman** and **Peter Vaas**. A veteran coach with 40 years of experience, Gutekunst captained the Blue Devil football squad back in 1965, and also served as an assistant coach at Duke from 1968-78. He will coach the defensive backs in this his second stint on staff. McCormick finished his playing career at Duke this past season, and has joined the ranks as a graduate assistant coach. Pearman, who will coordinate Duke's special teams efforts while guiding the tight ends, played at Clemson and previously coached at Alabama, Virginia Tech and North Carolina. Vaas, Duke's first-year offensive coordinator, brings a wealth of experience to Durham. A former head coach in NFL Europe, Vaas spent the last two seasons as the quarterbacks coach at Notre Dame.

Duke Graduate

Duke has one college graduate on its 2007 roster in tight end **Nick Stefanow**. On May 13, 2007, Stefanow graduated from Duke with a degree in psychology. He is currently pursuing a master's degree in humanities.

Rey & Riley Earn ACC Honors

Junior Wide Receiver **Eron Riley** became the second Duke player to earn ACC Player of the Week on September 24 when he was chosen as the ACC Offensive Back of the Week following a performance against Navy when he caught six passes for 235 yards and four touchdowns. **Vincent Rey** earned the first weekly honor following the Northwestern game. He tallied 11 tackles, two tackles for a loss and four pass breakups to lead Duke to its first victory of the season.

Helmet Decal & Uniform Patch

The Blue Devils will wear decals on their helmets this season in remembrance of Duke Sports Hall of Fame inductee **Dr. Frank Bassett**, who passed away on March 6, 2007. Bassett served as Duke's team physician from 1966-93. In 2002, Bassett received the Volunteer of the Year award from the National Association of Athletic Development Directors for his efforts in co-chairing the Duke University Football Campaign. The campaign raised over \$20 million for the Yoh Football Center that opened in the fall of 2002. In addition, Duke — along with the other 11 ACC schools — will don a black patch on the front of the game jersey to recognize the campus tragedy at Virginia Tech this past spring.

23 States Represented on Duke Roster

When **Ted Roof** and his staff hit the recruiting trails they cover the entire United States as the Blue Devils have players from 23 different states on their roster. The Peach State leads the way as 18 players hail from Georgia. Next on the list is Florida with 12 players while the home state, North Carolina is represented with 12 on the team. Next is Texas with nine, followed by Maryland which has five players.

Swedish Connection

The Duke roster features two players — **Pontus Bondeson** and **Marcus Lind** — who hail from Sweden. Members of the recruiting class of 2006, Lind, who played one year of prep football at St. Aquinas High School in Florida, committed to the Blue Devils and then informed the Duke coaching staff about his fellow countryman. Both redshirt freshmen, Bondeson and Lind are expected to compete for playing time in 2007 on the defensive and offensive lines, respectively.

International Ties

Along with the two players from Sweden on the Duke roster, **Pontus Bondeson** and **Marcus Lind**, the Blue Devils also are represented by **Chris Rwabukamba**, a redshirt freshman defensive back from Ontario, Canada.

The Duke Family Connection

Senior fullback **Tielor Robinson**, along with his two first cousins **Cameron** and **Colin Jones**, has significant ties to the Duke football program. Robinson's uncles — **Cedric** and **Walter Jones** — enjoyed outstanding careers for the Blue Devils. Cedric Jones is the father of Cameron and Colin and played from 1978-81. He caught 99 career passes for 1,732 yards (7th all-time at Duke) and 21 touchdowns (3rd). He earned second team All-America honors as a senior and spent nine seasons with the NFL's New England Patriots. Walter Jones is the uncle of the three current Duke players. He played from 1988-91 and had 119 receptions (10th all-time at Duke) for 1,968 yards (6th) and 17 TDs (4th) and was on Duke's 1989 ACC title squad. Robinson spent two years at Army before transferring to Duke prior to last season, and then sat out the 2005 campaign due to NCAA regulations. While with the Black Knights, Robinson rushed 114 times for 548 yards and five touchdowns while catching 34 passes for 297 yards and two scores. He earned Conference USA Player of the Week honors after accounting for 193 all-purpose yards and five TDs against Cincinnati in 2004. Robinson's mother, **Sandra Robinson**, is the sister of Cedric and Walter.

Family Affair

The Blue Devils have two brothers — **Ayanga** and **Ifreke Okpokowuruk** — as members of the defensive line unit. In addition, returning starting fullback **Tielor Robinson** will be joined this year on the roster by two family members as first cousins **Colin** and **Cameron Jones** matriculate to Duke.

Childhood Friends

Forced to attend different high schools in Houston didn't alter the close-knit relationship between **Vince Oghobaase** and **Michael Tauiliili**. Friends since childhood, the pair journeyed together to Durham and will embark on their second season starting together on the Duke defense. Last year, Oghobaase earned Freshman All-America honors after recording 28 tackles while Tauiliili paced the Blue Devils with 94 total tackles.

The 2006 season will mark the 50th anniversary of the 1957 Duke team that played in the Orange Bowl. The Blue Devils, under the direction of head coach **Bill Murray** and team captain **Hal McElhanev**, went 6-3-2 on the year and finished the season ranked 14th in the final AP poll. Duke went on to play Oklahoma in the Orange Bowl, dropping a 48-21 decision to the Sooners.

Additional Anniversaries

Other Blue Devil gridiron highlights celebrating anniversaries this year include:

25th: The Blue Devils post a 6-5 ledger in 1982 as ACC Player of the Year **Chris Castor** lights up opposing defenses by catching 46 passes for 952 yards and 13 touchdowns.

35th: **Steve Jones** rushes for a then single-season school record 1,236 yards and earns ACC Player of the Year honors in 1972.

45th: In 1962, the Blue Devils capture the ACC Championship and post an 8-2 mark by closing the season with wins over Maryland, Wake Forest and North Carolina.

55th: In just his second season atop the program, Duke head coach **Bill Murray** guides the 1952 Blue Devils to an 8-2 overall ledger and the Southern Conference championship.

70th: In 1937, Duke rebounds from the end of the Ace Parker Era to post a 7-2-1 record and earn a final national ranking of No. 20.

85th: Duke goes unbeaten over the final six weeks of the season to post a 7-2-1 overall record in 1922 under head coach **Herman Steiner**.

Duke Tops Nationally in NCSA Power Rankings

For the third straight year, Duke University was the top-ranked Division I school in the 2007 National Collegiate Scouting Association Power Rankings. The power rankings take a school's Directors' Cup, U.S. News & World Report and NCAA graduation rate rankings into account. Duke also claimed the top Division I spot in 2005 and 2006. Duke now has three No. 1 power rankings in the NCSA's four year history of producing them. Duke received a No. 7 ranking in 2004 before claiming the top spot each of the last three years.

ACC Player of the Year Honors

Duke boasts more ACC Player of the Year honorees — 10 — than any other school in the league. Duke's first ACC Player of the Year was **Jerry Barger** in 1954. They had back-to-back winners in 1971 and 1972. In the 1980's the Blue Devils had four ACC Player of the Year winners and **Robert Baldwin** became the league best 10th recipient in 1994.

DURHAM, N.C. — Connecticut QB **Todd Lorenzen** threw for 298 yards and two touchdowns and the Huskies outscored Duke by a 34-0 margin in the second half en route to a 45-14 victory over the Blue Devils in front of 17,251 fans at Wallace Wade Stadium.

The Blue Devils took the opening kickoff and drove 80 yards on six plays for a six-yard touchdown pass from QB **Thaddeus Lewis** to TE **Brandon King**. Lewis hooked up with WR **Eron Riley** for a 53-yard completion to start the march while RB **Justin Boyle** converted a key third down with a seven-yard run to the Husky six yard line.

Connecticut responded with a scoring drive on its first possession as Lorenzen rushed for 31 yards on two attempts to key a seven-play, 56-yard session that netted a 30-yard field goal by K **Tony Ciaravino**. The Huskies then pulled within two points with a safety when Lewis was sacked and fumbled the football into the end zone where Duke recovered.

At the 10:55 mark of the second period, Ciaravino booted a 27-yard field goal to give the Huskies an 8-7 advantage, but Duke's **Jabari Marshall** returned the ensuing kickoff 94 yards for a touchdown to reclaim the lead. Marshall's return for a score matched the 11th-longest such return in Duke history and marked the first of his career. Connecticut closed the half with a third field goal off the foot of Ciaravino and Duke led at intermission, 14-11.

Lorenzen keyed Connecticut's first possession of the third quarter by hitting WR **D.J. Hernandez** with a 57-yard scoring strike on third-and-seven from the Husky 43 yard line. Later in the quarter, Lorenzen's 41-yard pass to WR **Brad Kanuch** set up a two-yard scoring toss to TE **Steve Brouse** as the Huskies pushed their lead to 25-14 at the end of three periods.

In the final quarter, Connecticut posted scoring drives of 25 and 38 yards while returning an interception 36 yards for a touchdown to account for the final margin.

The Connecticut defense limited Duke to just 169 yards of total offense including just 15 yards on the ground.

Lewis finished the day with 14 completions in 28 attempts for 148 yards while Boyle picked up a team-high 31 rushing yards. LB **Vincent Rey**, making his first career start, paced the Blue Devil defense with 17 tackles while LB **Charles Robinson** added seven tackles, two tackles for loss and one interception.

RB **Donald Brown** rushed 19 times for 99 yards for the Huskies while WR **Terence Jeffers** caught eight passes for 92 yards.

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. — Virginia RB **Cedric Peerman** rushed for 137 yards and one touchdown as the Cavaliers defeated Duke, 24-13, in front of 58,554 fans and a regional television audience at sun-splashed Scott Stadium in Charlottesville, Va.

Virginia used special teams play to set up the first score of the game as **Vic Hall** returned a Duke punt 67 yards to the Blue Devil four yard line. Two snaps later, Cavalier QB **Jameel Sewell** found TE **Tom Santi** for a seven-yard touchdown pass at the 11:40 mark of the opening period. On the Cavaliers' second possession, Peerman darted 58 yards for a touchdown to push the lead to 14-0 with 8:13 left in the first quarter.

Virginia's third possession of the day yielded two points for the Blue Devils as an errant snap on fourth down sailed over the head of Cavalier P **Ryan Weigand** and out of the back of the end zone for a safety.

Duke LB **Vincent Rey** thwarted a Virginia scoring opportunity by blocking a field goal attempt midway through the second quarter and **Rodney Ezzard** scooped up the loose ball and returned it 61 yards into Cavalier territory.

Highlighted by an eight-yard run from QB **Zack Asack** on fourth down-and-two at the Virginia 26 yard line, the Blue Devils drove inside the Cavalier 10 yard line but missed a 26-yard field goal attempt.

With a 27-yard field goal on the final snap of the first half, Virginia extended its advantage to 17-2. The field goal by K **Chris Gould** capped a six-play, 48-yard drive that took the final 2:27 of the second period.

At the 2:51 mark of the third quarter, Duke QB **Thaddeus Lewis** hooked up with WR **Jomar Wright** on a 16-yard scoring strike. Lewis then followed with a two-point conversion toss to FB **Tielor Robinson**, pulling the Blue Devils to within 17-10. The three-play, 16-yard drive came after Virginia snapped the ball past Weigand for the second time in the contest.

On the ensuing kickoff, Duke LB **Adam Banks** caused and recovered a fumble to give Duke possession of the football. The Blue Devils then drove 16 yards in five plays for a 21-yard field goal by **Joe Surgan** to make the score 17-13 with 1:04 remaining in the third period.

The Cavaliers responded by driving 82 yards in 15 plays for a four-yard touchdown pass from QB **Peter Lalich** to Santi with 9:39 left on the clock in the fourth period. Duke answered with an eight-snap, 47-yard march to the Virginia 23 yard line, but misfired on a 40-yard field goal attempt with 7:03 remaining. The Blue Devils would gain possession of the football two more times, but were unable to move past midfield.

Lewis completed 14-of-30 passes for 137 yards with one touchdown and one interception. The sophomore now has at least one touchdown pass in four straight games and in eight of his past 10 outings dating back to last season.

EVANSTON, Ill. — Behind the arm of QB **Thaddeus Lewis** and a bend-but-don't-break defense, the Duke Blue Devils upended Northwestern by a 20-14 count as 23,716 fans looked on at Ryan Field in Evanston, Ill.

Trailing by six points, Northwestern took possession of the ball at its own 35 yard line with just 1:17 left in the game. Completed passes of 24 and 10 yards pushed the Wildcats to the Duke 31 yard line and, after a sack, QB **C.J. Bacher** scrambled 35 yards to the seven yard line. The Blue Devils held, forcing four consecutive incomplete passes to preserve the win.

Lewis hit on 19-of-23 passes for 246 yards and three TDs on the night.

The two teams traded turnovers in the opening minute of the contest. Northwestern received the opening kickoff, and on its second play from scrimmage Bacher's pass was intercepted by Blue Devil LB **Michael Tauliilli**.

Starting on the Wildcat 30 yard line, Duke was unable to take advantage by fumbling the football back to Northwestern on its initial snap.

Thanks in part to a third down quarterback pressure by DE **Wesley Oglesby**, the Duke defense forced a punt on the Wildcats' second possession. The Blue Devils responded by driving into Northwestern territory, and Lewis connected with WR **Raphael Chestnut** with a 27-yard gain to convert a fourth down and give Duke a first-and-goal situation at the four yard line. On the next snap, Lewis found WR **Jomar Wright** over the middle in the end zone for a touchdown to cap the 11-play, 86-yard drive that took 5:24 off the clock.

Northwestern countered with a 10-play, 83-yard scoring drive that ended when RB **Brandon Roberson** scored on a five-yard run with 3:45 remaining in the opening period. Following **Jabari Marshall's** 27-yard kickoff return to the 30 yard line, Duke ventured past midfield again and Lewis hooked up with TE **Brandon King** for a seven-yard scoring strike to push the Blue Devils back ahead, 14-7, with 13:48 left in the second quarter. The march covered 70 yards in 10 plays with Lewis hitting on all seven of his throws for 58 yards.

Duke forced its second turnover of the game when CB **Leon Wright** intercepted a pass in the end zone for a touchback midway through the second period. Lewis then engineered a seven-play, 80-yard scoring drive that ended when his 12th consecutive pass completion went to **Ronnie Drummer** for a 56-yard touchdown. Duke's extra point was wide, giving the Blue Devils a 20-7 advantage with 6:16 remaining in the second quarter.

Northwestern then drove 62 yards down the field for a successful 34-yard field goal, but opted to accept an offsides penalty against Duke and set up a fourth down and two at the Blue Devil 11 yard line. On the ensuing snap, Bacher threw a pass intended for **Omar Conteh**, but Duke cornerback **Glenn Williams** knocked the ball free to give the Blue Devils possession.

The Wildcats scored the only points of the second half when Bacher scored on a one-yard plunge on the opening play of the fourth quarter.

ANNAPOLIS, Md. — Navy K **Joey Bullen** booted a 44-yard field goal as time expired to lift the Midshipmen to a 46-43 win over Duke as 31,278 fans looked on at Navy-Marine Corps Stadium in Annapolis, Md.

Duke QB **Thaddeus Lewis** completed 23-of-36 pass attempts for a career-high 428 yards with four touchdowns and one interception. The 428-yard performance marks the seventh-highest single-game total in Duke history while the four scoring tosses match the second-best total.

The favorite target for Lewis against the Midshipmen was **Eron Riley**, who caught six passes for 235 yards and four touchdowns. Riley's day matched the school single-game standard for touchdown receptions while his 235 yards rank as the fifth-highest total in the Duke annuals.

Offensive fireworks were the story in the first half with Riley catching touchdown passes of 76 and 35 yards in the opening quarter.

The Mids erased a 12-point deficit when FB **Eric Kettani** ended a six-play, 60-yard drive with a 10-yard scoring run. QB **Kaipo-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada** then found WR **O.J. Washington** open for the two-point conversion, making the score 25-22 in favor of Navy with 5:36 before halftime. Duke responded with an eight-play, 61-yard drive to take a 29-25 lead when Lewis scored from three yards out on the ground and K **Greg Meyers** booted the extra point with 2:31 remaining in the half.

On Navy's next possession, Kaheaku-Enhada was intercepted by Duke LB **Marcus Jones** at the Blue Devil 42 yard line. Lewis took advantage of the turnover by directing a four-play, 58-yard scoring drive that ended when the quarterback's nine-yard fade pass to the back right-hand corner of the end zone was hauled in by Riley. Duke led by a 36-25 margin at intermission.

The Midshipmen took the opening kickoff of the second half and drove 74 yards in seven plays for a four-yard touchdown run by Kettani, pulling Navy to within 36-32 just over three minutes into the period. The Blue Devils pushed the lead back to 11 points almost immediately, however, when Lewis found Riley for a 69-yard scoring strike on Duke's next possession.

Both offenses went dry until Bullen connected on a 35-yard field goal with 8:07 left in the fourth quarter to trim Duke's lead to 43-35. After a Duke punt, Navy tied the game at 43-43 when QB **Jarod Bryant** caught a touchdown pass and then rushed for the two-point conversion with 3:49 left in the final quarter.

The Blue Devils then drove into Navy territory, but Lewis threw an interception on third down and 21 yards to go, giving the Mids possession at their own 26 yard line with 38 seconds remaining. Bryant led Navy 48 yards on seven plays to set up Bullen's game-winning field goal.

Game 5 Duke Miami 14 24

Orange Bowl • Miami, Fla.**

MIAMI, Fla. — Miami QB Kyle Wright threw for 230 yards and two touchdowns as the Hurricanes survived a fourth quarter rally by Duke for the second year in a row with a 24-14 victory over the Blue Devils in front of 30,614 fans at the Orange Bowl.

Trailing 17-7 in the fourth quarter, Duke QB Thaddeus Lewis rallied the Blue Devils for a touchdown by hitting WR Eron Riley in stride down the left sideline on a 31-yard scoring toss to pull Duke within three points at the 9:46 mark of the final period. After the Duke defense stopped Miami short on fourth down, Duke took possession at its own 32 yard line. The Blue Devils drove to the Hurricane 30, but Lewis was sacked on fourth down to lose possession with just three minutes remaining. Miami scored just 45 seconds later to account for the final margin.

Miami claimed the early lead on its first possession, driving 46 yards on eight plays for a five-yard scoring toss from Wright to WR Kayne Farquharson. Hurricane K Francesco Zampogna's point after touchdown made the score 7-0 with 8:34 left in the first period.

At the 3:35 mark of the opening quarter, Zampogna pushed the Miami advantage to 10-0 with a career-long 47-yard field goal. The field goal capped a six-play, 32-yard drive that took 1:56 off the clock. Miami squandered a scoring chance when Zampogna's 42-yard field goal attempt on the final snap of the first half was wide right.

Duke CB Leon Wright intercepted a pass to give Duke possession of the football early in the third quarter. The Blue Devils responded by marching deep into Miami territory, but a lost fumble ended the drive. The Hurricanes then drove to the Duke 11 yard line, but Kyle Wright again was picked off by Leon Wright — this time in the end zone — to thwart the scoring opportunity.

The Blue Devils then found paydirt by marching 80 yards on seven snaps for a 41-yard touchdown pass from Lewis to RB Ronnie Drummer. The touchdown marked Drummer's second in as many trips to the Orange Bowl as the North Salinas, Calif., native had an 81-yard touchdown run versus the Hurricanes two seasons ago. K Nick Maggio's point after touchdown conversion pulled Duke to within 10-7 at the 4:35 mark of the third quarter.

Duke then forced a punt, but turned the ball over with a fumble early in the fourth period. Miami turned the miscue into a 17-7 lead when TB Graig Cooper scored on a two-yard run with 12:06 remaining in the fourth quarter. The Blue Devils countered with a five play, 65-yard scoring drive that concluded when Lewis hooked up with Riley for the 31-yard touchdown pass.

Lewis finished the day with 18 completions in 27 attempts for his 241 yards. RB Re'quan Boyette paced the Duke ground attack with a 71 yards on 14 carries. Drummer and WR Jomar Wright each caught a team-high four passes for 53 and 47 yards, respectively.

Game 6 Wake Forest Duke 41 36

DURHAM, N.C. — A furious rally by Duke over the final 20 minutes of the game came up short as visiting Wake Forest defeated the Blue Devils, 41-36, as 20,134 fans looked on at Wallace Wade Stadium.

The Demon Deacons built a 25-point lead at 34-9 when CB Alphonso Smith returned an interception 30 yards for a touchdown midway through the third period. Duke then began its comeback bid, starting with a touchdown pass from QB Thaddeus Lewis to WR Eron Riley at the 3:24 mark of the third quarter.

Following an interception by S Chris Davis that gave the Blue Devils excellent field position, Duke trimmed the lead to 34-23 late in the third quarter when RB Justin Boyle scored from three yards out and Lewis followed with a two-point conversion pass to FB Clifford Harris.

The Duke defense then forced a punt, and Lewis directed a six play, 74-yard drive that ended when WR Jomar Wright turned a short pass into a 31-yard touchdown. Duke's two-point conversion failed and the Demon Deacons kept a five-point cushion.

A 26-yard punt return by CB Leon Wright provided Duke with possession at the Wake Forest 47 yard line with just under three minutes remaining, but the Blue Devils turned the ball over on downs with four incomplete passes. WR Kenneth Moore immediately extended Wake Forest's lead to 41-29 with a 53-yard touchdown run.

Duke responded by marching 67 yards in 10 plays for a 19-yard scoring toss from Lewis to WR Austin Kelly with just over one minute left, cutting the lead to 41-36. Wake Forest ended the Duke surge by recovering the ensuing kickoff.

The Blue Devils opened the game with nine straight points on a safety and 68-yard touchdown pass from Lewis to Riley. Wake Forest then scored 34 consecutive points on rushing touchdowns by FB DeAngelo Bryant, Moore and TB Micah Andrews, two field goals by K Sam Swank and the interception return by Smith.

Lewis finished the day completing 21-of-47 passes for 291 yards and four touchdowns. Riley had eight grabs for 143 yards and two scores while Wright posted six catches for 84 yards and one touchdown. TB Re'quan Boyette rushed for a team-high 77 yards on just eight attempts.

Duke LB Vincent Rey had a game-high 12 tackles.

For Wake Forest, QB Riley Skinner was 22-of-30 through the air for 221 yards. Moore caught 11 passes for 100 yards while rushing four times for an additional 84 yards.
