► 104th Season of Basketball

Duke is entering its 104th season of basketball in 2008-09. The Blue Devils have compiled a 1,846-808 record to rank fourth all-time in victories.

► Duke Names Tri-Captains for 2008-09

The Blue Devils selected three captains for the 2008-09 season. Senior **Greg Paulus** was named captain for the second time after serving as a team captain for the 2006-07 season. Juniors **Gerald Henderson** and **Jon Scheyer** will join Paulus as captains on the team this season.

► Blue Devils Return 11 Letterwinners

With the loss of only one starter and two letterwinners, Duke returns the bulk of its squad from a year ago. The 14-man roster features 11 returning letterwinners, including four starters. Seniors **Greg Paulus**, **David McClure** and **Jordan Davidson** along with juniors **Gerald Henderson**, **Martynas Pocius**, **Jon Scheyer**, **Lance Thomas** and **Brian Zoubek** give Duke eight upperclassmen. The roster also features six talented underclassmen as **Kyle Singler**, **Nolan Smith** and **Steve Johnson** return for their sophomore seasons and the Blue Devils welcome freshmen **Olek Czyz**, **Miles Plumlee** and **Elliot Williams**.

The group of 11 returning players helped Duke to a 28-6 record in 2007-08, including a 13-3 mark in ACC play. The Blue Devils were a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament, the 13th straight season they have made the NCAA Tournament.

The talent level remains abundant on the current squad, as it features eight players who earned prep All-America recognition, including seven who competed as McDonald's All-Americans.

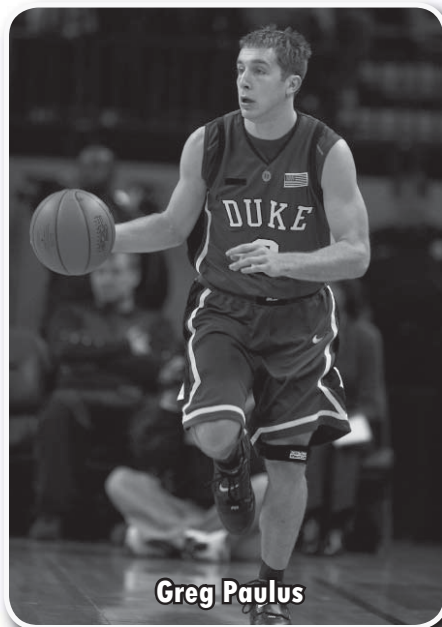
► Strong Guard Play for Duke

The Blue Devils' backcourt is among the top returning units in the country. Two starters return from a year ago as **Greg Paulus** and **Gerald Henderson** each started in 33 of the 34 games.

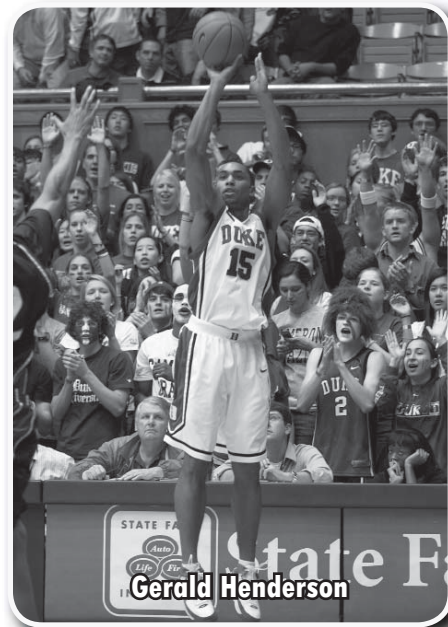
Paulus averaged 11.4 points, 2.1 rebounds, 3.2 assists and 1.5 steals per game in his third year as the starting point guard. He was named to the All-ACC third team and also received *ESPN the Magazine* Academic All-America honors last season. He was fourth in the ACC with 2.44 three-point field goals per game and third with a 1.98:1 assist-to-turnover ratio. Henderson became a full-time starter in his sophomore season and averaged 12.7 points, 4.7 rebounds, 1.6 assists, 1.1 steals and 0.9 blocks per game. He ranked 20th in the ACC in scoring average and was the team leader with 31 blocks on the season.

Duke's top player off the bench in 2007-08, **Jon Scheyer**, brings plenty of experience to the backcourt. Despite coming off the bench, Scheyer was third on the team with 28.3 minutes per game. He averaged 11.7 points, 3.9 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 1.4 steals per game. He was also one of the top free throw shooters in the conference, ranking second (.889) with 120 made free throws in 135 attempts. Sophomore point guard **Nolan Smith** is coming off a good freshman season in which he averaged 5.9 points, 1.5 rebounds and 1.3 assists per game. Junior **Martynas Pocius** also returns after his 2007-08 season was cut short by an ankle injury. Senior **Jordan Davidson** played in 13 games last season.

Freshman **Elliot Williams**, a Memphis, Tenn., native is expected to make an immediate impact for the Blue Devils. Williams was a McDonald's All-America selection out of St. George's High School.

► More Depth Inside for Duke

The two frontline starters from last season are back for another year at Duke in 2008-09. Junior **Lance Thomas** and sophomore **Kyle Singler** each return after gaining valuable starting experience a season ago. Thomas started 28 of the 32 games he played in. He averaged 4.3 points and 3.3 rebounds per game while shooting 50.5 percent from the field. Singler was named ACC Rookie of the Year and was a third team All-ACC selection. He was one of the Blue Devils' top players, leading the team with 5.8 rebounds per game and ranking second with 13.3 points per game. He also averaged 1.4 assists and 1.1 steals per game. Singler ranked among the ACC leaders in scoring (17th) and rebounding (16th).

Senior **David McClure** enters his final season with the Duke program. As a junior he played in 30 games with four starts. He averaged 1.0 points and 1.9 rebounds per game off the bench. The 7'1", 280-pound junior **Brian Zoubek** also returns as a presence in the low post. He averaged 3.8 points and 3.4 rebounds per game while leading the team with a .594 field goal percentage. His time was limited due to a foot injury last season but he played in 25 games. Sophomore **Steve Johnson**, who redshirted last season, is also a returner on the front line for the Blue Devils.

Two freshmen will look to contribute inside for Duke. **Miles Plumlee**, a Warsaw, Ind., native who played at the Christ School in North Carolina, is 6'10" and weighs 230 pounds. **Olek Czyz** comes from Reno High School in Reno, Nev. He is 6'7" and weighs 240 pounds.

► 1,000 Point Scorers

Senior point guard **Greg Paulus** became Duke's 56th 1,000-point scorer last season in the NCAA Tournament. Paulus and **DeMarcus Nelson** each recorded their 1,000th career point last season. Paulus currently ranks 54th all-time at Duke with 1,017 career points.

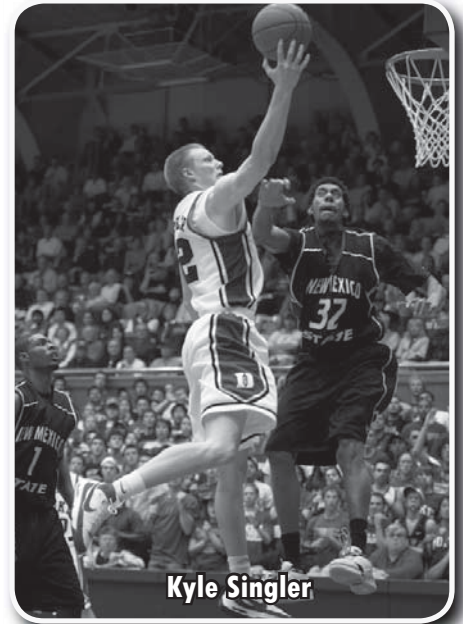
Juniors **Jon Scheyer** and **Gerald Henderson** each have a chance to add their names to the prestigious list of 1,000-point scorers this season. Scheyer enters the year with 799 career points and needs 201 to reach the mark. Henderson is 348 points shy as he has 652 career points.

► ACC Active Assist Leader

Greg Paulus enters his senior season as the league's active leader with 420 career assists. He is on pace to finish his career in the Duke top-10 for career assists. He currently ranks 11th all-time and needs 13 assists to tie **Jeff Capel** for 10th on the career charts. Paulus also enters 2008-09 ranked seventh among active players in the ACC in scoring with 1,071 career points.

► High Scoring Offense

Last season, Duke averaged 83.2 points per game to rank second in the ACC and fourth nationally in scoring offense. The Blue Devils scored over 100 points twice, 90 or more points nine times and 80 or more points 20 times.

Duke was one of the top three-point shooting teams in the country, which contributed to the high points totals. The Blue Devils led the ACC with 9.1 treys per game and were second with a .377 three-point field goal percentage. Nationally, Duke was 18th in three-point field goals per game.

The bulk of the scoring load returns for the 2008-09 season. Five of the six top scorers return with four returners averaging in double figures last season. In all the returning players accounted for 76 percent of last year's scoring.

► Balanced Scoring

The scoring attack from the Blue Devils came from all different angles in 2007-08 with five different players averaging in double figures.

The Blue Devils had five or more players score in double figures in 12 games last season. It was tied for the seventh most by any Duke team.

It wasn't only the starters who accounted for the Blue Devils' scoring offense. The bench produced 916 points on the year, an average of 26.9 points per game. A bench player scored in double figures 37 times with a school record six 20-point efforts. **Jon Scheyer** led the team's bench production with an average of 11.7 points per game. He posted 22 games in double figures last season off the bench.

► Devilish Defense

The Blue Devils' pressure defense helped lead to a high-powered offense in 2007-08 and with a deep bench Duke will look to apply similar pressure this year.

Duke will have to replace **DeMarcus Nelson**, who was the ACC Defensive Player of the Year a year ago, but still returns four players who averaged over one steal per game in 2007-08. As a team last season, the Blue Devils were second in the ACC with 8.7 steals per game and tied for fourth in scoring defense, allowing only 69.4 points per game.

Overall, the Blue Devils recorded 10 or more steals in a game 17 times, tying for the fifth most in a single season by a Duke squad. Of those 17 games with 10 or more steals, 10 came in conference play, matching the school record from 2005-06.

The Blue Devils forced 20 or more turnovers in 14 games last season. Opponents had more turnovers than assists in 29 of the 34 games.

► Staff Changes

The Duke basketball staff went through some changes following last season. **Steve Wojciechowski** and **Chris Collins** were promoted to Associate Head Coaches after **Johnny Dawkins** left to become the head coach at Stanford. Replacing Dawkins on staff is former Blue Devil **Nate James**.

Also leaving for Stanford was Duke's Director of Basketball Operations, **Mike Schrage**. **Chris Spatola** was promoted to the position from graduate assistant coach, while **Chris Carrawell** was hired for that role. The Blue Devils also added a new video coordinator position, hiring former student manager **Kevin Cullen**.

► Sustained Success

Duke has won 20 or more games 43 times in its 103 years of basketball. Including its 28-6 mark a year ago, Duke has won at least 20 games for 12 consecutive seasons.

► Duke in Elite Victory Club

Duke is one of just four schools in NCAA history to have earned at least 1,800 all-time victories. Now with 1,846 wins, the Blue Devils join Kentucky (1,966), North Carolina (1,950) and Kansas (1,943) as members of the prestigious 1,800-win club.

► New Century, Similar Result

With 261 victories in the decade, Duke has the most wins by any program in the nation since the 1999-2000 season. Included in that record are two trips to the Final Four (2001 and 2004) and a national championship in 2001. This decade has been the best in terms of winning percentage for the Blue Devils (.826).

► Moving Up the Victory Ladder

Mike Krzyzewski is one of just six coaches in Division I history to reach 800 career wins. His 803 wins rank tied for fifth among college basketball's victory leaders and first among active coaches. With 730 victories as the Duke head coach, Krzyzewski is also one of just eight coaches to win at least 700 games at one school.

► First and Foremost

Duke has been ranked No. 1 in the nation (Associated Press poll) a total of 110 weeks, the second-highest figure in college basketball history behind only UCLA (134). Duke's total of 110 weeks ranked No. 1 is 14 more weeks than the next closest ACC school (North Carolina, 96). In fact, the remaining 11 ACC Schools have been ranked No. 1 a combined 124 times, just 14 more weeks at No. 1 than the Blue Devils.

► NCAA History

With its continued success during March Madness, Duke is piling up impressive NCAA Tournament numbers. Duke, which made its 32nd NCAA Tournament appearance last season, has been one of the best NCAA Tournament teams in the history of college basketball. The Blue Devils' .748 winning percentage (86-29) in NCAA Tournament play is the best all-time. Duke's 86 NCAA Tournament victories and 115 NCAA Tournament games rank fourth in NCAA history.

In 2008, the Blue Devils made their 13th consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance and 24th in the last 25 seasons under **Mike Krzyzewski**.

► ACC History

The Blue Devils have won seven of the past 10 ACC Tournament championships. Overall, Duke has posted an 81-39 record (.675) in the ACC Tournament. Duke has won 16 league championships, the second highest championship total in the league. Duke's league tournament titles came in 1960, 1963, 1964, 1966, 1978, 1980, 1986, 1988, 1992, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2005 and 2006.

Under head coach **Mike Krzyzewski**, Duke is 43-17 in the ACC Tournament. Coach K's Blue Devils have won 10 ACC Tournament titles (1986, 1988, 1992, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2005 and 2006). Coach K is one of only two of the 12 ACC head coaches to have earned two or more league championships.

► ACC Dominance

Duke has dominated the ACC regular season like no other program during the past 12 seasons. The Blue Devils have won 154 league games (29 games ahead of the next team) — an average of nearly 13 wins per year, seven regular season ACC championships and seven of the past 10 ACC Tournament titles (1999-2003, 2005-06). In 2003, Duke became the first team in league history to win five straight ACC Tournament championships.

► Selling Out

Duke has sold out 274 consecutive games at Cameron Indoor Stadium. The last time Duke did not have a sellout at home was on Nov. 16, 1990, against Boston College. Overall, the Blue Devils continue to be one the nation's most popular draws, playing in front of sellout crowds in all venues in 235 of their last 275 games.

► Non-Conference Home Win Streak

Duke has won an NCAA-best 59 consecutive non-conference home games. Duke's last home loss against a non-conference foe was an 83-82 decision against St. John's on Feb. 26, 2000.

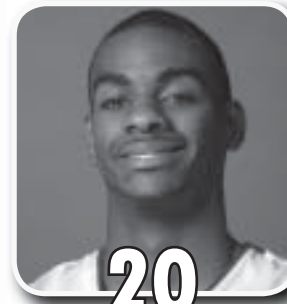
