SERIES: Virginia leads, 30-27

LAST OUTING: On September 16 in Blacksburg, Va., Duke suffered a 36-0 loss to then 14th-ranked Virginia Tech ... QB **Sean Glennon** threw for 301 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Hokies ... On September 21 in Atlanta, Ga., Georgia Tech WR **Calvin Johnson** caught six passes for 165 yards and two touchdowns as the Yellow Jackets defeated Virginia, 24-7 ... Georgia Tech held Virginia to just 166 total yards in the victory.

LAST TIME: On September 24, 2005 in Charlottesville, Va., QB **Marques Hagens** threw four touchdown passes to lead Virginia to a 38-7 win over Duke ... The Blue Devils managed just 215 yards of total offense while committing four turnovers.

RANKINGS: Both teams are unranked.

COACHES: Duke's **Ted Roof** (Georgia Tech '87) is in his third full season as head coach of the Blue Devils and holds a record of 5-25 ... **Al Groh** (Virginia '67) is in his sixth year as head coach at Virginia ... He is 64-69 overall and 38-29 at Virginia as a head coach.

Duke Hosts Virginia For Homecoming

Following an open date, Duke returns home to entertain Virginia in the 2006 edition of Homecoming ... Kickoff is set for 12 noon and the game will be televised live by Lincoln Financial Sports ... **Steve Martin** will handle the call with assistance from **Rick Walker** (analyst) and **Scott Pryzwansky** (sideline) ... The Blue Devils stand at 0-3 overall and 0-2 in league play following a 36-0 loss at Virginia Tech while the Cavaliers are 1-3 overall and 0-1 in the conference after dropping a 24-7 decision to Georgia Tech.

Duke On Homecoming

The Blue Devils hold an all-time ledger of 35-45-1 in Homecoming games ... Duke has hosted Virginia five times for Homecoming, posting a 1-4 record.

The Duke-Virginia Series

Saturday's tilt will mark the 58th time that Duke and Virginia have met on the gridiron, with the Cavaliers holding a slim 30-27 series advantage ... Duke and Virginia first met in 1890 — a 10-4 Cavalier victory ... Virginia has won six in a row and 15 of the last 17 meetings over the Blue Devils ... Duke enjoyed success against the Cavaliers in the 1960s and 70s, winning 14-of-17 games from 1961-78.

Duke-Virginia Notes

Duke head coach **Ted Roof** went 2-1-1 against Virginia during his playing days at Georgia Tech (1982-85) and was 4-0 versus Groh's Demon Deacon clubs during that stretch ... Virginia head coach **Al Groh** spent six seasons (1981-86) as the head coach at Wake Forest, going 2-4 versus Duke ... Duke linebacker **Andrew Holoman's** father, **Bryan**, lettered in football at Virginia from 1978-81 ... Duke offensive tackle **Jerrod Holt's** brother, **Joe**, played at Virginia in the early 2000s.

More Duke-Virginia Series Notes

- **1891:** Duke closes out a perfect 3-0 season with a 20-0 win over Virginia ... The Blue Devils had beaten Furman (96-0) and North Carolina (6-4) previously in the season.
- **1943:** In the first meeting since 1930, Duke upends Virginia, 49-0, on its way to an 8-1 record.
- **1961:** Duke wins 42-0 to post its second largest victory margin in an ACC game.
- **1982:** In Duke's 51-17 win, the Blue Devils compile 621 yards of total offense — the fifth highest single-game total in school history.
- **1988:** Duke's **Anthony Dilweg** throws for 391 yards and three touchdowns and Duke holds on for a 38-34 win after building a 31-7 halftime lead.
- **1992:** Virginia's **Terry Kirby** rushes for 207 yards as the Cavaliers win in Durham, 55-28.
- **1994:** In Duke's last win over a nationally-ranked team, the 23rd-ranked Blue Devils down 13th-ranked Virginia, 28-25 ... **Spence Fischer** throws for 236 yards and the Duke defense intercepts three passes in the win.
- **1995:** Current offensive coordinator **Mike Groh** passes for 346 yards and four TDs in the Cavaliers' 44-30 win.
- **1999:** Duke's **Carl Franks** gains his first head coaching win with a 24-17 overtime decision in Charlottesville ... **Spencer Romine** tosses a touchdown pass in overtime and **Lamar Grant** seals the victory with an interception.
- **2002:** Despite being held to just two net rushing yards, Virginia edges Duke, 27-22, as **Matt Schaub** throws for 315 yards.

The combined record of Duke's first three opponents — Richmond, Wake Forest & Virginia Tech — is a perfect 11-0.

A Glance At Virginia

The Cavaliers travel to Durham this week with a 1-3 overall record with a victory over Wyoming (13-12 in OT) and losses to Pittsburgh (38-13), Western Michigan (17-10) and Georgia Tech (24-7) ... In the ACC, Virginia ranks 12th in total offense and seventh in total defense and have utilized the services of three different quarterbacks in 2006: Christian Olsen (33-61 for 249 yards), Jameel Sewell (22-42 for 166 yards) and Kevin McCabe (23-32 for 222 yards) ... Sewell, a redshirt freshman from Richmond, earned the start in Virginia's last game, the defeat at Georgia Tech ... On defense, Jon Cooper has amassed a team-leading 32 tackles on the year while Clint Sintim has 23 stops, six tackles for loss and a pair of sacks ... Marcus Hamilton paces the secondary with his 11 career interceptions ... On the special teams front, the Cavaliers lead the ACC in net punting while ranking third in kickoff coverage.

Blue Devils Endure Challenging Road

Duke is in the midst of one of the most challenging five-game runs in school history as the Blue Devils face Virginia Tech, Virginia, Alabama, Florida State and Miami in succession ... An open date on Sept. 23 followed the trip to Blacksburg ... Last year, those five schools combined for a 45-17 (.726) record with five bowl game berths (three wins) ... This week's AP top 25 poll features Virginia Tech at No. 11, Florida State at No. 19, with Miami standing second and Alabama 15th among others receiving votes ... In this week's USA Today national poll, Virginia Tech checks in at No. 10 followed by Florida State (17th) with Alabama sitting first and Miami seventh among others receiving votes ... The last time Duke played four ranked foes in a five-game stretch came in 1946 with consecutive tilts versus top-ranked Army, Georgia Tech (16th), Wake Forest (13th), South Carolina (unranked) and North Carolina (14th) with the Blue Devils posting a 2-3 ledger in that span by earning wins over Wake Forest and South Carolina ... In 1944, Duke played four straight games against ranked opponents — No. 6 Navy, No. 2 Army, No. 5 Georgia Tech and No. 12 Wake Forest — picking up victories in the final two contests of that run.

A Glance At The 2006 Ledger

A year ago, Duke's 12 opponents for the 2006 season combined for a 92-52 (.639) overall record that included a 5-3 ledger in bowl games ... The .639 winning percentage for Duke's 12 foes is the highest in the nation ... Five teams — Virginia Tech (7th), Alabama (8th), Miami (17th), Boston College (18th) and Florida State (23rd) — closed the year ranked in the final Associated Press poll while three more — Georgia Tech, Navy and Virginia — were among others receiving votes ... In addition, Richmond went 9-4, advanced to the NCAA I-AA quarterfinals and was ranked eighth in the final poll.

Rookie Lewis Assumes Starting Role

In week two at Wake Forest, rookie quarterback **Thaddeus Lewis** started for the Blue Devils, becoming just the second true freshman to start under center for Duke in the past 22 seasons ... Prior to **Zack Asack's** start against Navy last season (Oct. 1), the last Duke true freshman to start at quarterback was **Steve Slayden** against Army on Sept. 29, 1984 ... Lewis responded by completing 21-of-32 passes for 305 yards and one touchdown ... The 305 passing yards marked the most by a Duke quarterback in his starting debut since **Dave Brown** threw for 444 yards versus Wake Forest in 1989 ... Lewis then started Duke's week three game against Virginia Tech in Blacksburg, but departed the contest prematurely following an illegal hit from Hokie defensive back Aaron Rouse in the second quarter.

Tops Among True Freshmen

Thaddeus Lewis ranks first among true freshmen nationally in several statistical categories including total offense (147.3), passing yards per game (154.3) and passing efficiency (129.34) ... He is second in total passing yards behind Arkansas' Mitch Mustain ... In the ACC, Lewis, who threw for 1,237 yards and 12 touchdowns at Hialeah Miami Lakes (Fla.) High School last fall, stands third in passing efficiency, eighth in passing yards per game and ninth in total offense.

Talley & Lowe Connection

In each of Duke's first two games in 2006, seniors **John Talley** and **Codey Lowe** teamed together for a turnover ... Against Richmond, Talley stripped the football loose from running back Tim Hightower and Lowe recovered the fumble ... At Wake Forest, Talley knocked free the ball from running back Micah Andrews and Lowe again fell on the loose ball for a Duke possession ... Talley ranks first in the ACC with his two caused fumbles while Lowe is tied for second with his pair of recoveries.

Tauillili Posts Sixth Double Figure Tackle Game

Sophomore linebacker **Michael Tauillili** has picked up where he left off in 2005 by posting a team-best 28 tackles through three games of the 2006 campaign ... His 9.3 tackles per game rank second in the ACC behind Patrick Lowery of N.C. State (9.8) ... With an 11-stop performances against Richmond and Virginia Tech, the Houston, Texas, native now has six double figure tackle games in his last eight outings dating back to last year ... In 14 career games, Tauillili has 120 stops — good for a per game average of 8.6 tackles — and he leads Duke in tackles this season with a total of 28.

Name Change

Last year, Duke fans heard the name "**Michael Brown**" over the public address system, television and radio frequently as the rookie linebacker led the Blue Devils in tackles with 92 ... During the off-season, the Houston, Texas, product made a change to his last name in favor of **Tauillili** (tau-EE-lee-EE-lee) to pay respect to his Samoan heritage ... "When I went back to Samoa and talked to my family, I felt that as I got older and more mature and understood my heritage it was necessary to embrace it to the fullest," said Tauillili.

Wide Receivers Contribute

Duke's three top wide receivers — **Raphael Chestnut**, **Eron Riley** and **Jomar Wright** — have made a steady contribution to the Blue Devil offense in 2006 ... The trio has combined to catch 34 passes for 417 yards — good for a per reception average of 12.3 yards.

Talley Earns Preseason All-America Honors

John Talley headlines Duke's preseason honorees as the senior cornerback was named preseason first team All-America by *The Sporting News* ... Duke senior cornerback **John Talley** is one of 33 candidates on the preseason Watch List for the 2006 Jim Thorpe Award, an honor presented annually to the top defensive back in the nation ... Michael Huff of Texas captured the 2005 Thorpe Award, and other past winners include Bennie Blades of Miami (1987), Deion Sanders of Florida State (1988), Charles Woodson of Michigan (1997) and Roy Williams of Oklahoma (2001) ... The award is named after history's greatest all-around athlete, a man who excelled as a running back, passer and kicker on offense, but also was an awesome defensive back ... Recognized in the Pro Football Hall of Fame simply as "The Legend", Thorpe also played professional baseball and won Olympic gold medals in the decathlon and pentathlon ... The watch list will be narrowed to 10 semifinalists the first Monday in November and then to three finalists the Monday before Thanksgiving ... The winner will be announced on ESPN's College Football Awards Show, telecast from Disney World on December 7 ... The official presentation of the award will be in Oklahoma City on Feb. 7.

Robinson & The Duke Family Connection

Junior fullback **Tielor Robinson** has significant ties to the Duke football program as two uncles — **Cedric** and **Walter Jones** — enjoyed outstanding careers for the Blue Devils ... Robinson spent two years at Army before transferring to Duke prior to last season, and then sat out the 2005 campaign due to NCAA regulations ... While with the Black Knights, Robinson rushed 114 times for 548 yards and five touchdowns while catching 34 passes for 297 yards and two scores ... He earned Conference USA Player of the Week honors after accounting for 193 all-purpose yards and five TDs against Cincinnati in 2004 ... Cedric Jones played from 1978-81 and caught 99 career passes for 1,732 yards (7th all-time at Duke) and 21 touchdowns (3rd) ... He earned second team All-America honors as a senior and spent nine seasons with the NFL's New England Patriots ... Walter Jones played from 1988-91 and had 119 receptions (10th all-time at Duke) for 1,968 yards (6th) and 17 TDs (4th) and was on Duke's 1989 ACC title squad ... Robinson's mother, **Sandra Robinson**, is the sister of Cedric and Walter.

Riley Looks To Build From 2005 Season

When **Jomar Wright** was lost for the season in week five against Navy last year, fellow wide receiver **Eron Riley** — then a true freshman — was forced into a more prominent role within the Duke offense ... Over the final six weeks, Riley produced 11 receptions for 247 yards and two touchdowns, averaging an impressive 22.5 yards per catch ... His top outing came at Clemson in week 10 when the Savannah, Ga., native hauled in a season-best four passes for 130 yards including a 66-yard touchdown.

Wright Returns

Junior wide receiver **Jomar Wright** returned to the Blue Devil lineup after missing the final six games of the 2005 campaign due to injury ... Against Navy in week five, Wright suffered a season-ending knee injury after hauling in a 19-yard reception along the Duke sideline ... He is Duke's active leader with 39 career receptions for 639 yards and three touchdowns ... Among active ACC wide receivers with at least 25 pass receptions, Wright entered the 2006 season ranking third with his career per catch average of 18.4 yards, ahead of Miami's Lance Leggett (17.3) and Georgia Tech's Calvin Johnson (16.9) and trailing only Florida State's Greg Carr (20.6) and Virginia Tech's Josh Morgan (19.0) ... An impressive 69.2 percent (27-of-39) of Wright's career receptions have produced first downs for the Duke offense.

Drummer & The Big Play

Junior **Ronnie Drummer** joins Felix Jones of Arkansas as the only two active players in the nation with both a run from scrimmage of 80 or more yards and a 100-yard kickoff return to his credit ... Last year at Miami, Drummer sprinted 81 yards for a touchdown on the opening series of the third quarter ... On third down and 11 from the Duke 19 yard line, Drummer broke through a hole on the left side of the line and darted past the Hurricane defense for the sixth longest rush in Blue Devil history and the longest run from scrimmage against Miami since 1976 ... The rushing touchdown was the first for Drummer, who also has a receiving touchdown (vs. Clemson in 2004) and kickoff return for a score (at East Carolina in 2005) to his credit ... Against Miami, the Salinas, Calif., native finished with nine carries for a career-high 101 yards ... In the 2005 season-opener at East Carolina, Drummer returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown ... The kickoff return matched the Duke record since the NCAA began recording official statistics in 1938, equalling returns by **Leroy Gallman** (vs. Tennessee in 1994) and **Greg Boone** (vs. Tennessee in 1982) ... The school mark of 105 yards was set by **Ace Parker** versus North Carolina in 1936.

Duke Radio Network

A state-wide radio audience follows all the action of Duke football on The Duke Radio Network. The network provides in-depth pregame coverage, live play-by-play of all the action, and the post-game press conferences straight from the locker room to stations via satellite each game. The one-hour tailgate show, hosted by **John Roth**, is broadcast live from the Blue Devil Tailgate Terrace at home games.

Two-time North Carolina Broadcaster of the Year **Bob Harris**, the voice of the Blue Devils for the past 30 seasons, calls all the action for Duke fans each game. He was inducted into the Stanly County (N.C.) Sports Hall of Fame in 1993 and the North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame in 2006.

Analyst **Wes Chesson** joins Harris in the booth each game and is in his 27th season providing color commentary for Duke games. Chesson, an All-ACC receiver at Duke from 1968-70, still holds five school receiving records, hauling in 164 catches for 2,399 yards during his playing days. He went on to play with the NFL's Atlanta Falcons (1971-73) and Philadelphia Eagles (1973-74).

In December of 2000, Harris and Chesson were selected to work the 64th annual Shrine Bowl Game of the Carolinas in Charlotte, N.C.

Anthony Dilweg, the 1988 ACC Player of the Year, joins the broadcast team for his seventh season, serving as the sideline reporter with a keen inside perspective. **John Rose** serves as the network's engineer.

Duke Graduate

To find an example of the consummate student-athlete, look no further than Duke's **Eli Nichols** ... A defensive end slated to start for the third straight season, Nichols graduated from Duke on May 13, 2006 with a B.S.E. degree in mechanical engineering, and will enter the school's one-year master's degree program in Engineering Management this fall ... In 29 career games for the Blue Devils, the Crawfordville, Fla., native has 102 tackles, 15.0 tackles for loss and six sacks to his credit and is looking to join former All-ACC pick and NFL Draft choice **Chris Combs** (1996-98) as the only two players in Duke history to lead the team in quarterback sacks for three consecutive seasons ... Last year, Nichols became the 11th player in Duke football history to receive Academic All-America honors with a second team citation.

Also, the group is one of only seven active running back trios in the country to each have a 100-yard rushing game to his credit ... Last year, the trio combined to rush for 1,047 yards and 12 touchdowns.

Fourteen Blue Devils See First Action

Twelve Duke newcomers saw their first game action against Richmond in the season-opener: QB **Thaddeus Lewis**, WR **Jabari Marshall**, FB **Tielor Robinson** (played at Army in 2003 and 2004), LB **Vincent Rey**, DT **Vince Oghobaase**, FB **Brandon King**, P **Alex Feinberg**, DT **Norman Gee**, QB **Kevin Cronin**, CB **Leon Wright**, FS **Catron Gainey** and DE **Ayanga Okpokowuruk** ... Five of those 12 are true freshmen: Lewis, King, Wright, Rey and Gainey ... In week two at Wake Forest, true freshmen OT **Jerrold Holt** and WR **Jeremy Ringfield** played for the first time.

First Starts

Eight Blue Devils made their first starts at their respective positions versus Richmond — RT **Fred Roland**, RG **Rob Schirmann**, LG **Zach Maurides**, FB **Tielor Robinson**, TE **Nick Stefanow**, QB **Marcus Jones** (made four starts at WR in 2005), DT **Vince Oghobaase** and SS **Glenn Williams** ... At Wake Forest in week two, QB **Thaddeus Lewis** and SS **Adrian Aye-Darko** received the first starting assignments of their respective careers.

Duke Plays Its 94th Year Of Football

The 2006 season marks Duke's 94th campaign of inter-collegiate football, with the Blue Devils holding an all-time record of 443-430-31 ... Football was introduced at Duke by **Dr. John Crowell**, who coached then Trinity College to victories in its first two games ever — wins of 16-0 and 25-17 over North Carolina in 1888 ... After the 1894 season, football was banned at Duke by the Board of Trustees, but returned in high form in 1920 when **Floyd Egan** guided the team to a 4-0-1 ledger.

Youth Movement

During the 2004-05 seasons, Duke played more true freshmen — 28 — than any other team in the ACC ... In 2004, Duke played an ACC-high 14 true freshmen — a total that ranked second nationally behind Idaho (17) ... In 2005, the Blue Devils played 14 true freshmen, tops in the ACC and tied for third nationally ... Duke has played seven true freshmen in 2006.

Defense Rises To Occassion Vs. Deacons

At Wake Forest in week two, the Duke defense was faced with the challenge of playing against the top rushing offense in the ACC and responded by holding the Demon Deacons to just 57 yards on 24 attempts ... Wake Forest, which ranked first in the ACC and 23rd nationally in rushing offense in 2005, is led by running back Micah Andrews, who was limited to just 41 yards on 17 attempts after picking up 142 yards on 20 carries in the season-opener against Syracuse ... The Blue Devils held Wake Forest scoreless in the first half, marking the first time that Duke had allowed zero points in the first 30 minutes of an ACC game since Nov. 22, 2003 during a 30-22 win over North Carolina in Chapel Hill.

A Glance At Special Teams

Sophomore kicker **Joe Surgan** returns to the Blue Devil lineup after booting six-of-eight field goals as a rookie in 2005 ... Last year Surgan finished second on the team with 33 total points ... At punter, junior **Alex Feinberg** and freshman **Kevin Jones** competed during preseason camp to take over for the graduated Chris Sprague ... Long snapper **Casey Hales** is back for this third campaign as a starter ... On the return front, juniors **Ronnie Drummer** and **Chris Davis** are back after ranking fifth and eighth in the league in kickoff return average, respectfully, a season ago ... Davis also finished sixth in the ACC in punt return average ... Also back for the Blue Devils is junior **Casey Camero**, who made his presence felt in 2004 with three blocked kicks.

Seven Seniors

The Duke roster boasts just seven recruited scholarship seniors who are in their final season of eligibility ... Only Florida State, Kentucky and South Carolina have fewer with six ... All members of Duke's defensive unit, the group includes **Casey Camero**, **Jeremy Edwards**, **Codey Lowe**, **Deonto McCormick**, **Eli Nichols**, **John Talley** and **Alex Williams**.

Peach State Leads The Way

Duke has a team-high 20 players from the state of Georgia, followed by Florida (16) and Texas (12) ... North Carolina ranks fourth with eight players with California, Maryland and South Carolina checking in with four apiece.

ACC Enters Year Two Of Divisional Play

With the additions of Miami (Fla.), Virginia Tech and Boston College over the 2004 and 2005 seasons, the ACC adopted divisional play last fall ... Last year, Atlantic Division champion Florida State defeated Coastal Division champion Virginia Tech in the first ACC Championship game in Jacksonville, Fla. ... 65th Anniversary

The 2006 season will mark the 65th anniversary of the 1941 Duke team that hosted Oregon State for the Rose Bowl ... Head coach **Wallace Wade** directed the Blue Devils to a 9-1 ledger that season, with the lone defeat coming to the Beavers in front of 56,000 fans in Durham, marking the only time the Rose Bowl has been played outside of California.

Additional Anniversaries

Other Blue Devil gridiron highlights celebrating anniversaries this year include:

25th: **Cedric Jones** catches 42 passes for 832 yards and 10 touchdowns in 1981 en route to garnering second team All-America honors.

45th: In 1961, the Blue Devils capture the ACC Championship and post a 7-3 mark by closing the season with wins over Navy, North Carolina and Notre Dame.

55th: Head coach **Bill Murray** begins his successful 15-year career with a 5-4-1 campaign in 1951 ... Murray would guide Duke to 93 wins and seven league titles during his tenure.

70th: In 1936, All-America **Ace Parker** plays his final season for the Blue Devils, helping Duke to a 9-1 ledger with the only loss coming to then second-ranked Tennessee, 15-13.

75th: **Wallace Wade** coaches his first season — 1931 — in Durham, securing a 5-3-2 record ... Wade went on to coach 16 total seasons and compile a 110-36-7 overall mark.

85th: The Blue Devils earn a 6-1-2 record including a 68-0 triumph over Wolford in 1921.

105th: In 1901, Duke goes 3-0 on the year by outscoring Furman, North Carolina and Virginia by a combined 122-4 count.

Three Academic All-ACC Picks Return

Last year, Duke placed a league-high eight players on the Academic All-ACC squad, and three of those are members of the 2006 Blue Devil roster ... Current Blue Devils **Patrick Bailey**, **Eli Nichols** and **Matt Rumsey** were named to the squad last season.

Under Duke's Roof

On December 6, 2003, **Ted Roof** became the 20th head coach in Duke football history ... A 1987 graduate of Georgia Tech, Roof served as Duke's interim head coach for the final five weeks of the 2003 season ... Under Roof's guidance, Duke snapped a 30-game losing streak in ACC play with a 41-17 victory over Georgia Tech on November 8, and then closed out the season by defeating North Carolina, 30-22, for the Blue Devils' first win over the Tar Heels since 1989 ... Roof owns a 5-25 overall head coaching record with the Blue Devils ... As a senior at Georgia Tech, he earned All-ACC accolades, captained the 1985 Yellow Jackets to a 9-2-1 season and guided the team to a win over Michigan State in the All American Bowl ... The Lawrenceville, Ga., native finished his career with 417 tackles and was inducted into the Georgia Tech Athletics Hall of Fame in 1998.

N.C. Sports Hall Of Fame

In May of 2006, the North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame inducted two individuals with Duke ties — longtime radio announcer **Bob Harris** and former gridiron star **Steve Jones** ... Harris, a native of Albemarle, N.C., enjoyed his 30th season as the play-by-play voice of Duke football and basketball last year ... A Sanford, N.C., product, Jones was an All-America running back for the Blue Devils from 1970-72 and continues to rank second on the school's all-time rushing chart with 2,951 career yards.

Overtime

The NCAA tiebreaker system established in 1996 will be used when a game is tied after four periods ... NCAA football-playing rules apply. The officials will escort the captains (Rule 3-1-1) to the center of the field for the coin toss ... The referee shall toss a coin at mid-field in the presence of no more than four captains from each team and another game official, first designating the field captain of the visiting team to call the coin toss ... The winner of the toss shall choose one of the following options:

1. Offense or defense, with the offense at the opponent's 25-yard line to start the first series.
2. Which end of the field shall be used for both series of that overtime period.

Note: The winner of the toss may not defer his choice.

The loser of the toss shall exercise the remaining option for the first extra period and shall have the first choice of the two options for subsequent even-numbered extra periods ... An extra period shall consist of two series with each team putting the ball in play by a snap at the designated 25-yard line ... Each team retains the ball during a series until it scores or fails to make a first down.

The team scoring the greater number of points during the regulation and extra periods shall be declared the winner ... There shall be an equal number of series in each extra period, except if one team scores during a period other than on the try ... Beginning with the third extra period, teams scoring a touchdown must attempt a two-point try.

DURHAM, N.C. — Richmond's defense allowed just 210 yards and K **Andrew Howard** booted two field goals as the visiting Spiders defeated Duke, 13-0, in the season-opener for both clubs in front of 27,546 fans at Wallace Wade Stadium

Richmond took advantage of an early turnover to claim a 3-0 lead. The Blue Devils fumbled on their second snap from scrimmage and Richmond LB **Anthony Dabney** returned the ball 25 yards to the Duke nine yard line. After three plays netted six yards, Howard booted a 20-yard field goal.

The Spiders increased their lead to 10-0 by driving 75 yards in nine plays for a 16-yard touchdown pass from QB **Eric Ward** to WR **Arman Shields** with 10:40 remaining in the second period. The drive was highlighted by a 23-yard run by RB **Tim Hightower** and a 21-yard strike from Ward to WR **Matt Hale**.

Duke had a scoring opportunity thwarted late in the first half when Richmond LB **Adam Goloboski** blocked a 43-yard field goal attempt.

Howard's 22-yard field goal with just over one minute left in the third quarter capped an 18-play, 83-yard drive that took 9:09 off the clock, giving the Spiders a 13-0 lead.

Duke would have possession inside the Richmond five yard line on two occasions in the final period, but failed to score.

Ward finished the night with 11 completions in 23 attempts for 120 yards while Shields caught five balls for 69 yards. Hightower carried the ball 20 times for 86 yards.

For the Blue Devils, QB **Thaddeus Lewis** came off the bench to hit on 15-of-24 passes for 148 yards. WRs **Raphael Chestnut** and **Jomar Wright** each caught seven passes.

Twelve Duke newcomers saw their first game action against Richmond in the season-opener: Lewis, WR **Jabari Marshall**, FB **Tielor Robinson** (played at Army in 2003 and 2004), LB **Vincent Rey**, DT **Vince Oghobaase**, FB **Brandon King**, P **Alex Feinberg**, DT **Norman Gee**, QB **Kevin Cronin**, CB **Leon Wright**, FS **Catron Gainey** and DT **Ayanga Okpokowuruk**. Eight Blue Devils made their first starts at their respective positions versus the Spiders — RT **Fred Roland**, RG **Rob Schirmann**, LG **Zach Maurides**, Robinson, TE **Nick Stefanow**, QB **Marcus Jones** (made four starts at WR in 2005), Oghobaase and SS **Glenn Williams**.

Wake Forest RB **Micah Andrews** scored the game-winning touchdown with 1:28 left in the game as the Demon Deacons defeated Duke, 14-13, at Groves Stadium.

In his first start, Duke rookie QB **Thaddeus Lewis** completed 21-of-32 passes for 305 yards and one touchdown to pace the Blue Devils. The 305 passing yards marked the most by a Blue Devil quarterback in a starting debut since **Dave Brown** threw for 444 yards against Wake Forest in 1989.

The two-yard scoring plunge by Andrews and K **Sam Swank's** extra point put the Demon Deacons ahead, 14-13, with 1:28 remaining in the fourth period. Lewis then directed the Blue Devils down the field, with his 21-yard pass completion to WR **Jomar Wright** setting up first down and goal to go from the nine yard line with nine seconds left. One play later, Wake Forest blocked a potential game-winning field goal attempt by K **Joe Surgan** to preserve the victory.

Duke took advantage of a Demon Deacon turnover to claim a 3-0 lead in the opening quarter when LB **Codey Lowe** recovered a fumble caused by CB **John Talley** to give the Blue Devils possession in Wake Forest territory. Surgan's 27-yard field goal at the 3:19 mark capped the nine-play, 24-yard scoring drive.

With just under five minutes before halftime, Lewis hooked up with Wright on a 47-yard touchdown pass down the left sideline to push the Duke lead to 10-0. The Blue Devils drove 66 yards on four snaps for the score following a missed 51-yard field goal by Wake Forest.

Wake Forest got on the scoreboard at the 9:08 mark of the third quarter when QB **Riley Skinner** fired a five-yard touchdown pass to TE **John Tereshinski**, cutting the Duke lead to 10-7. Duke responded by taking the ensuing kickoff and driving 46 yards on 11 plays for a 39-yard field goal by Surgan. The drive was highlighted by WR **Jabari Marshall's** 34-yard kickoff return and a 13-yard pass completion from Lewis to WR **Raphael Chestnut** on third-and-11 from the Duke 31 yard line.

On Wake Forest's next possession, a 58-yard pass from Skinner to WR **Willie Idlette** gave the Demon Deacons first and goal at the Duke one-yard line. On third down, DT **Vince Oghobaase** sacked Skinner to force a field goal attempt from 38 yards out, but the kick was wide right.

LB **Patrick Bailey** led the Duke defensive effort with nine tackles as the Blue Devils limited Wake Forest to 57 yards rushing. Duke outgained the Demon Deacons by a 367-292 count. RB **Clifford Harris** came off the bench to rush for a team-best and career-high 29 yards on nine attempts while Wright had five receptions for a career-best 104 yards.

BLACKSBURG, Va. — Fourteenth-ranked Virginia Tech used 316 passing yards and a punt return for a score to defeat visiting Duke, 36-0, as 66,223 fans looked on at Lane Stadium in Blacksburg, Va.

Virginia Tech took the opening kickoff and drove 65 yards on four plays to claim a 6-0 lead on RB **Brandon Ore's** one-yard touchdown run. Hokie QB **Sean Glennon** hooked up WR **David Clowney** for a 60-yard completion on the first snap from scrimmage. Duke's **Casey Camero** blocked the PAT attempt, marking the fourth blocked kick of his career.

The Hokies extended their lead to 13-0 when **Eddie Royal** returned a punt 58 yards for a touchdown with 39 seconds remaining in the first quarter. **Brandon Pace** booted a 42-yard field goal at the 11:02 mark of the second quarter, capping a seven play, 37-yard drive to give Virginia Tech a 16-0 lead.

Glennon's 17-yard scoring strike to TE **Sam Wheeler** pushed the lead to 23-0 with just under three minutes before halftime.

At the 7:17 mark of the third quarter, Glennon hooked up with WR **Josh Morgan** on a 25-yard touchdown pass for a 30-0 Tech lead. The scoring drive was set up by Royal's 20-yard punt return that gave the Hokies possession at the Duke 22 yard line. On their ensuing possession, the Blue Devils moved into scoring position when **Marcus Jones** tossed a 38-yard pass to **Eron Riley** to the Hokie 19 yard line. The Virginia Tech defense then held, and Jones was limited to no gain on fourth down, turning the ball over.

Virginia Tech used a 15 play, 84-yard drive to claim a 36-0 lead when **Kenny Lewis** found the end zone from two yards out with just under 11 minutes left in the final quarter.

Jones, who finished with six completions in eight attempts for 71 yards, entered the game on Duke's second offensive snap to replace freshman starter **Thaddeus Lewis**, who was banged up on the first play. Lewis returned to the lineup later in the drive, but departed the contest for a second time following an illegal hit to the head by Virginia Tech's **Aaron Rouse** midway through the second quarter. Junior RB **Justin Boyle** returned to the starting lineup following a one-week absence. On the opening possession, he rushed twice for 20 yards and finished with a team-best 36 net yards on 10 attempts

Senior CB **John Talley** logged his first interception of the year and the 12th of his career while sophomore LB **Michael Tauiliili** had a team-high 11 tackles. Senior LB **Jeremy Edwards** and junior S **Chris Davis** each secured seven total stops.

For the Hokies, Ore rushed for a team-best 64 yards on 15 attempts while Glennon was 15-of-25 through the air for 301 yards and two touchdowns.
