SERIES: Duke leads, 53-31-2

LAST WEEK: Duke opened the season with a 13-0 loss to Richmond in Durham while the Demon Deacons secured a 20-10 victory over Syracuse in Winston-Salem.

LAST TIME: On October 29, 2005 in Durham, **Chris Barclay** rushed 18 times for 204 yards and two touchdowns to lead Wake Forest to a 44-6 victory over Duke ... After building a 20-6 lead at halftime, the Deacons received rushing scores of nine and 71 yards from Barclay to open up a 34-6 advantage in the third period ... Wake Forest outgained the Blue Devils by a 557-203 margin on the afternoon while picking up its sixth consecutive win in the series.

RANKINGS: Both teams are unranked.

COACHES: Duke's **Ted Roof** (Georgia Tech '87) is in his third full season as head coach of the Blue Devils and holds a record of 5-23 ... **Jim Grobe** (Virginia '75) is in his sixth year as the head coach at Wake Forest ... He is 27-32 with the Demon Deacons and 60-65-1 overall as a college head coach.

Duke Kicks Off ACC Action At Wake Forest

The Blue Devils will open league play this week by travelling to Winston-Salem, N.C., to meet Wake Forest ... Kickoff is set for 12 noon and the game will be televised live by Lincoln Financial Sports ... **Steve Martin** will handle the call with assistance from **Rick Walker** (analyst) and **Mike Hogewood** (sideline) ... The Blue Devils stand at 0-1 following a 13-0 loss to Richmond in the season-opener while the Demon Deacons are 1-0 after defeating Syracuse, 20-10.

Duke Plays Its 94th Year Of Football

The 2006 season marks Duke's 94th campaign of inter-collegiate football, with the Blue Devils holding an all-time record of 443-428-31 ... Football was introduced at Duke by **Dr. John Crowell**, who coached then Trinity College to victories in its first two games ever — wins of 16-0 and 25-17 over North Carolina in 1888 ... After the 1894 season, football was banned at Duke by the Board of Trustees, but returned in high form in 1920 when **Floyd Egan** guided the team to a 4-0-1 ledger.

Duke's **Justin Boyle** and Wake Forest's **Jon Abbate** and **Zach MacDowall** all graduated from Harrison (Ga.) High School ... Duke's **Joe Sorgan** and **Marcus Lind** along with Wake Forest's **Mike Simmons** prepped at St. Thomas Aquinas (Fla.) High School ... Duke's trio of **Danny Bowling**, **Chris Davis** and **Matt Rumsey** along with Wake Forest's **Pierre Easley** all graduated from Marist (Ga.) High School ... Duke's **John Talley** and **Jomar Wright** and Wake Forest's **Trey Bailey** are graduates of Byrnes (S.C.) High School ... Duke's **Jarrold Holt** and Wake Forest's **Louis Frazier** both are graduates of Clearwater (Fla.) High School ... Wake Forest junior defensive end **Jeremy Thompson** is the younger brother of former Blue Devil defensive tackle **Orrin Thompson** (2001-04) ... Wake Forest assistant athletic director for football **Bill Faircloth** served as an assistant coach at Duke in 1976-77.

More Duke-Wake Forest Series Notes

- **1889:** On March 29, Wake Forest defeats Duke in the first meeting between the schools.
- **1930:** Duke and Wake Forest battle to a 13-13 tie as the Blue Devils go 8-1-2.
- **1938:** Duke blanks Wake Forest, 7-0, in one of nine regular season shutouts for the "Iron Dukes".
- **1945:** Duke's **George Clark** rushes 17 times for a school single-game record 214 yards as the Blue Devils win, 26-19.
- **1962:** Duke posts its largest win over an ACC opponent by defeating the Deacons, 50-0.
- **1963:** The Duke defense intercepts a school record six passes in a 39-7 win.
- **1981:** Duke has three backs — **Mike Grayson** (17-188), **Joel Blunk** (20-110) and **Greg Boone** (16-101) — top the 100-yard barrier in a 31-10 victory.
- **1988:** Duke's **Anthony Dilweg** throws for 475 yards — the most ever given up by a Wake Forest defense and the second highest single-game total in Duke history — but Wake Forest prevails, 35-16, by taking advantage of five Blue Devil turnovers.
- **1995:** Wake Forest's **Rusty LaRue** sets an NCAA record with 55 pass completions while throwing for 478 yards but Duke wins, 42-36, thanks to a 28-0 halftime lead.
- **1999:** The Blue Devils score a school record 34 points in the first quarter and hold on for a 48-35 win ... The game features 99-yard kickoff returns for touchdowns by Duke's **Scottie Montgomery** and Wake Forest's **John Stone**.

Duke leads the all-time series with Wake Forest by a 53-31-2 count ... The series dates back to March 29, 1889 when Wake Forest defeated Duke, 32-0, in Raleigh ... In Winston-Salem, Duke has won 13 of 24 meetings ... Wake Forest has won six in a row and eight of the past 10 meetings over the Blue Devils ... Duke enjoyed success against the Demon Deacons in the 1960s and 70s, winning 14-of-17 games from 1961-78.

A Glance At The 2006 Ledger

A year ago, Duke's 12 opponents for the 2006 season combined for a 92-52 (.639) overall record that included a 5-3 ledger in bowl games ... The .639 winning percentage for Duke's 12 foes is the highest in the nation ... Five teams — Virginia Tech (7th), Alabama (8th), Miami (17th), Boston College (18th) and Florida State (23rd) — closed the year ranked in the final Associated Press poll while three more — Georgia Tech, Navy and Virginia — were among others receiving votes ... In addition, Richmond went 9-4, advanced to the NCAA I-AA quarterfinals and was ranked eighth in the final poll.

Five of those 12 are true freshmen: Lewis, King, Wright, Rey and Gainey.

Youth Movement

During the 2004-05 seasons, Duke played more true freshmen — 28 — than any other team in the ACC ... In 2004, Duke played an ACC-high 14 true freshmen — a total that ranked second nationally behind Idaho (17) ... In 2005, the Blue Devils played 14 true freshmen, tops in the ACC and tied for third nationally.

The Houston, Texas, native now has four double figure tackle games in his last five outings dating back to last year ... In 12 career games, Tauilili has 103 stops — good for a per game average of 8.6.

Name Change

Last year, Duke fans heard the name "**Michael Brown**" over the public address system, television and radio frequently as the rookie linebacker led the Blue Devils in tackles with 92 ... During the off-season, the Houston, Texas, product made a change to his last name in favor of **Tauilili** (tau-EE-lee-EE-lee) to pay respect to his Samoan heritage ... "When I went back to Samoa and talked to my family, I felt that as I got older and more mature and understood my heritage it was necessary to embrace it to the fullest," said Tauilili.

Chestnut & Wright Post Career Games

Duke had a pair of wide receivers — **Raphael Chestnut** and **Jomar Wright** — register career-highs for receptions last week against Richmond as both players hauled in seven passes ... Chestnut entered the season with only two career catches while Wright's previous high was a five-reception contest against Wake Forest in 2004 ... Chestnut and Wright currently rank tied for second in the ACC and tied for 17th nationally in receptions per game while Chestnut is fourth in the league and 59th in the country in receiving yards per contest.

Senior cornerback **John Talley** is one of four returning first team all-conference defensive backs from BCS conferences in 2006 ... The Duncan, S.C., native is joined on the list by Darrell Revis of Pittsburgh, LaRon Landry of LSU and Daymeion Hughes of California.

Talley Named To Thorpe Award Watch List

Duke senior cornerback **John Talley** is one of 33 candidates on the preseason Watch List for the 2006 Jim Thorpe Award, an honor presented annually to the top defensive back in the nation ... Michael Huff of Texas captured the 2005 Thorpe Award, and other past winners include Bennie Blades of Miami (1987), Deion Sanders of Florida State (1988), Charles Woodson of Michigan (1997) and Roy Williams of Oklahoma (2001) ... The award is named after history's greatest all-around athlete, a man who excelled as a running back, passer and kicker on offense, but also was an awesome defensive back ... Recognized in the Pro Football Hall of Fame simply as "The Legend", Thorpe also played professional baseball and won Olympic gold medals in the decathlon and pentathlon ... The watch list will be narrowed to 10 semifinalists the first Monday in November and then to three finalists the Monday before Thanksgiving ... The winner will be announced on ESPN's College Football Awards Show, telecast from Disney World on December 7 ... The official presentation of the award will be in Oklahoma City on Feb. 7.

John Talley headlines Duke's preseason honorees as the senior cornerback was named preseason first team All-America by *The Sporting News*... Talley, who enters the 2006 season as the nation's active leader in interceptions with 11, also was charted by *TSN* as the nation's top cornerback and is a first team All-ACC selection by *The Sporting News*, *Athlon*, *Blue Ribbon College Football Yearbook* and *Lindy's*... Other Duke players to receive preseason recognition were return specialist **Chris Davis** (3rd Team All-ACC by *Lindy's*) and linebacker **Michael Tauiilili** (3rd Team All-ACC by *Lindy's*).

Talley & The Record Book

Senior cornerback **John Talley** continues to etch his name into the ACC and Duke record books... His 245 career return yards stand fourth on the ACC's all-time chart and he needs just one interception to move into a tie for 23rd on the ACC's career list for pick-offs... On Duke's career charts, he ranks second in interception return yardage, fifth in interceptions (11) and sixth in pass breakups (26)... In 2004, Talley established school single-season marks for interception return yards (172) and average yards per interception return (43.0) while matching the annual standard for interception returns for touchdowns (2).

Junior fullback **Tielor Robinson** has significant ties to the Duke football program as two uncles — **Cedric** and **Walter Jones** — enjoyed outstanding careers for the Blue Devils... Robinson spent two years at Army before transferring to Duke prior to last season, and then sat out the 2005 campaign due to NCAA regulations... While with the Black Knights, Robinson rushed 114 times for 548 yards and five touchdowns while catching 34 passes for 297 yards and two scores... He earned Conference USA Player of the Week honors after accounting for 193 all-purpose yards and five TDs against Cincinnati in 2004... Cedric Jones played from 1978-81 and caught 99 career passes for 1,732 yards (7th all-time at Duke) and 21 touchdowns (3rd)... He earned second team All-America honors as a senior and spent nine seasons with the NFL's New England Patriots... Walter Jones played from 1988-91 and had 119 receptions (10th all-time at Duke) for 1,968 yards (6th) and 17 TDs (14th) and was on Duke's 1989 ACC title squad... Robinson's mother, **Sandra Robinson**, is the sister of Cedric and Walter.

Wright Returns

Junior wide receiver **Jomar Wright** returned to the Blue Devil lineup after missing the final six games of the 2005 campaign due to injury ... Against Navy in week five, Wright suffered a season-ending knee injury after hauling in a 19-yard reception along the Duke sideline ... He is Duke's active leader with 33 career receptions for 530 yards and two touchdowns ... Among active ACC wide receivers with at least 25 pass receptions, Wright entered the 2006 season ranking third with his career per catch average of 18.4 yards, ahead of Miami's Lance Leggett (17.3) and Georgia Tech's Calvin Johnson (16.9) and trailing only Florida State's Greg Carr (20.6) and Virginia Tech's Josh Morgan (19.0) ... An impressive 66.7 percent (22-of-33) of Wright's career receptions have produced first downs for the Duke offense.

Riley Looks To Build From 2005 Season

When **Jomar Wright** was lost for the season in week five against Navy last year, fellow wide receiver **Eron Riley** — then a true freshman — was forced into a more prominent role within the Duke offense ... Over the final six weeks, Riley produced 11 receptions for 247 yards and two touchdowns, averaging an impressive 22.5 yards per catch ... His top outing came at Clemson in week 10 when the Savannah, Ga., native hauled in a season-best four passes for 130 yards including a 66-yard touchdown.

Drummer & The Big Play

Junior **Ronnie Drummer** joins Felix Jones of Arkansas as the only two active players in the nation with both a run from scrimmage of 80 or more yards and a 100-yard kickoff return to his credit ... Last year at Miami, Drummer sprinted 81 yards for a touchdown on the opening series of the third quarter ... On third down and 11 from the Duke 19 yard line, Drummer broke through a hole on the left side of the line and darted past the Hurricane defense for the sixth longest rush in Blue Devil history and the longest run from scrimmage against Miami since 1976 ... The rushing touchdown was the first for Drummer, who also has a receiving touchdown (vs. Clemson in 2004) and kickoff return for a score (at East Carolina in 2005) to his credit ... Against Miami, the Salinas, Calif., native finished with nine carries for a career-high 101 yards ... In the 2005 season-opener at East Carolina, Drummer returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown ... The kickoff return matched the Duke record since the NCAA began recording official statistics in 1938, equalling returns by **Leroy Gallman** (vs. Tennessee in 1994) and **Greg Boone** (vs. Tennessee in 1982) ... The school mark of 105 yards was set by **Ace Parker** versus North Carolina in 1936.

Junior **Patrick Bailey** and senior **Eli Nichols** are among the preseason nominations for the Lott Trophy, an award named after College and Pro Football Hall of Fame selection Ronnie Lott and presented annually to the college football student-athlete that best reflects the following qualities: integrity, maturity, performance, academics, community and tenacity.

Duke Radio Network

A state-wide radio audience follows all the action of Duke football on The Duke Radio Network. The network provides in-depth pregame coverage, live play-by-play of all the action, and the post-game press conferences straight from the locker room to stations via satellite each game. The one-hour tailgate show, hosted by **John Roth**, is broadcast live from the Blue Devil Tailgate Terrace at home games.

Two-time North Carolina Broadcaster of the Year **Bob Harris**, the voice of the Blue Devils for the past 30 seasons, calls all the action for Duke fans each game. He was inducted into the Stanly County (N.C.) Sports Hall of Fame in 1993 and the North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame in 2006.

Analyst **Wes Chesson** joins Harris in the booth each game and is in his 27th season providing color commentary for Duke games. Chesson, an All-ACC receiver at Duke from 1968-70, still holds five school receiving records, hauling in 164 catches for 2,399 yards during his playing days. He went on to play with the NFL's Atlanta Falcons (1971-73) and Philadelphia Eagles (1973-74).

In December of 2000, Harris and Chesson were selected to work the 64th annual Shrine Bowl Game of the Carolinas in Charlotte, N.C.

Anthony Dilweg, the 1988 ACC Player of the Year, joins the broadcast team for his seventh season, serving as the sideline reporter with a keen inside perspective. **John Rose** serves as the network's engineer.

Head coach **Wallace Wade** directed the Blue Devils to a 9-1 ledger that season, with the lone defeat coming to the Beavers in front of 56,000 fans in Durham, marking the only time the Rose Bowl has been played outside of California.

70th: In 1936, All-America **Ace Parker** plays his final season for the Blue Devils, helping Duke to a 9-1 ledger with the only loss coming to then second-ranked Tennessee, 15-13.

75th: **Wallace Wade** coaches his first season — 1931 — in Durham, securing a 5-3-2 record ... Wade went on to coach 16 total seasons and compile a 110-36-7 overall mark.

85th: The Blue Devils earn a 6-1-2 record including a 68-0 triumph over Wofford in 1921.

105th: In 1901, Duke goes 3-0 on the year by outscoring Furman, North Carolina and Virginia by a combined 122-4 count.

Three Academic All-ACC Picks Return

Last year, Duke placed a league-high eight players on the Academic All-ACC squad, and three of those are members of the 2006 Blue Devil roster ... Current Blue Devils **Patrick Bailey**, **Eli Nichols** and **Matt Rumsey** were named to the squad last season.

Under Duke's Roof

On December 6, 2003, **Ted Roof** became the 20th head coach in Duke football history ... A 1987 graduate of Georgia Tech, Roof served as Duke's interim head coach for the final five weeks of the 2003 season ... Under Roof's guidance, Duke snapped a 30-game losing streak in ACC play with a 41-17 victory over Georgia Tech on November 8, and then closed out the season by defeating North Carolina, 30-22, for the Blue Devils' first win over the Tar Heels since 1989 ... Roof owns a 5-17 overall head coaching record with the Blue Devils ... As a senior at Georgia Tech, he earned All-ACC accolades, captained the 1985 Yellow Jackets to a 9-2-1 season and guided the team to a win over Michigan State in the All American Bowl ... The Lawrenceville, Ga., native finished his career with 417 tackles and was inducted into the Georgia Tech Athletics Hall of Fame in 1998.

N.C. Sports Hall Of Fame

In May of 2006, the North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame inducted two individuals with Duke ties — longtime radio announcer **Bob Harris** and former gridiron star **Steve Jones** ... Harris, a native of Albemarle, N.C., enjoyed his 30th season as the play-by-play voice of Duke football and basketball last year ... A Sanford, N.C., product, Jones was an All-America running back for the Blue Devils from 1970-72 and continues to rank second on the school's all-time rushing chart with 2,951 career yards.

ACC Action

The Blue Devils are 130-209-6 all-time in league action ... The Blue Devils have won seven league titles — 1953, 1954, 1955, 1960, 1961, 1962 and 1989 — the fourth most in conference history.
