## 2009 NOTEBOOK

### DUKE HAS BEST SEASON SINCE 1994

• The Blue Devils ended the year with a 5-7 overall record and were 3-5 in ACC play. Duke posted several accomplishments in the win column both overall and in the ACC:

> Duke's five victories in 2009 are the most since the 1994 Blue Devils squad went 8-4

> With wins over N.C. State, Maryland and Virginia it is the first time since 1994 the Blue Devils have won three ACC games

> The Blue Devils' three-game winning streak earlier in the season was the longest since a seven-game winning streak to start the 1994 season. Duke has only won two consecutive games five times since 1994 (1995, 1997, 1998, 2003 and 2008)

> With three road wins on the season, Cutcliffe has a 4-6 record in away games at Duke. The Blue Devils yielded a road record of 3-42 in the previous eight seasons

> Duke's nine victories in 22 games under Cutcliffe are one shy of the 10 wins the Blue Devils posted in the previous 93 games

> Won three road games (Army, N.C. State and Virginia) in a single season for the first time since 1994

> Won two ACC road games (N.C. State and Virginia) in a single season for the first time since 1999

> Won two consecutive road games for the first time since 1994

> Won two consecutive ACC road games for the first time since 1994

> Ended a 10-game losing streak against N.C. State with a 49-28 victory, the first win over the Wolfpack since 1993 (21-20)

> Snapped a nine-game losing streak at N.C. State, winning in Raleigh for the first time in 25 years (1984, 16-13)

> Beat Maryland for the first time since 1999 (25-22), ending a five-game losing streak to the Terps

> Defeated Virginia, 28-17 on the road, the first win in Charlottesville for the Blue Devils since 1999, a double overtime victory (24-17)

### SPORTING NEWS HONORS OGHOBAASE

• DT **Vince Oghobaase** received third team All-America honors by *Sporting News* after recording 37 tackles, 7.5 sacks for loss, 2.5 sacks and two quarterback hurries in 2009 ... A 6-5, 305-pound native of Houston, Texas, Oghobaase is Duke's first defensive lineman to receive All-America honors in the modern era ... In addition, he became the 59th player in Blue Devil football history to earn All-America accolades ... A two-time All-ACC pick, Oghobaase played in 44 games and finished his Duke career with 165 tackles, 36.5 tackles for loss and 14.0 sacks ... Oghobaase was one of seven ACC players honored by *Sporting News* including Clemson's C.J. Spiller (KR/1st team), Georgia Tech's Derrick Morgan (DE/2nd team), Clemson's Thomas Austin (OL/3rd team), Clemson's DeAndre McDaniel (S/3rd team), Virginia Tech's Ryan Williams (RB/3rd team) and Florida State's Greg Reid (PR/3rd team).

### FRESHMAN ALL-AMERICA NOD FOR VERNON

• WR **Conner Vernon** became the 11th Duke rookie since 2000 to earn Freshman All-America accolades from *Sporting News* after setting freshman school single-season records for pass receptions (55), receiving yards (746) and 100-yard receiving games (3) in 2009.

### SIX BLUE DEVILS EARN ALL-ACC HONORS

• Headlined by first team selection **Donovan Varner**, six Duke players received All-ACC honors from the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association ... Other Blue Devils to secure all-conference recognition were second team selections **Thaddeus Lewis**, **Vincent Rey** and **Will Snyderwine** and honorable mention choices **Vince Oghobaase** and **Leon Wright** ... The 2009 Associated Press All-ACC football teams were voted on by 40 members of the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association.

### DUKE HAS 11 ACADEMIC ALL-ACC SELECTIONS

• Led by all-league selections **Vincent Rey** and **Will Snyderwine**, Duke placed a conference-best 11 student-athletes on the 2009 Academic All-ACC Football Team ... Other Blue Devils joining Rey and Snyderwine on the squad were **Adam Banks**, **Lee Butler**, **Matt Daniels**, **Kyle Hill**, **Kevin Jones**, **Mitchell Lederman**, **Brian Moore**, **Chris Rwabukamba** and **Johnny Williams** ... Jones earned the honor for the second straight year ... Over the past five years, Duke has earned a conference-best 33 Academic All-ACC citations, 12 more than the next highest total of 21 by Maryland.

### 2009 CAPTAINS

• Seniors **Thaddeus Lewis** and **Vincent Rey** were named Duke's 2009 team captains ... Announced as alternate captains for the season were **Re'quan Boyette**, **Vince Oghobaase**, **Ayanga Okpokowuruk** and **Leon Wright**.

### PASS OFFENSE RANKS NINTH NATIONALLY

• Duke's passing offense led the ACC and ranked ninth nationally in 2009, averaging 305.0 yards per game ... The Blue Devil quarterbacks threw for 3,660 yards and 24 touchdowns ... In conference-only games, Duke averaged 323.9 passing yards per game to lead the league.

### LEWIS ENDS GREAT CAREER

• QB **Thaddeus Lewis** ended his career at Duke having started in 46 of his 47 games played and either set or matched 58 school records ... He completed a school record 877-of-1,510 pass attempts for a .581 career completion percentage and became just the second quarterback in ACC history to throw for over 10,000 yards in a career, finishing with 10,065 ... Lewis threw 67 career touchdown passes compared to just 40 interceptions in four seasons.

### LEWIS & ACC HISTORY

• QB **Thaddeus Lewis** closed out his career as one of the top quarterbacks in ACC history ... The Opa-Locka, Fla., product ranks second all-time in passing yards and attempts, third in total offense and completions and fourth in touchdown passes.

### LEWIS ON SINGLE-SEASON LISTS

• QB **Thaddeus Lewis'** 2009 season totals stand among the top single seasons in school history ... His passing yardage total of 3,330 ranks second as he became just the third player at Duke to throw for over 3,000 yards in a season while his season totals also rank third in completions and attempts, tied for third in touchdown passes and fifth in completion percentage.

### LEWIS FIRST WITH FOUR 2,000-YARD SEASONS

• In 2009, QB **Thaddeus Lewis** became the first player in Duke history to throw for over 2,000 yards in four straight seasons ... In addition, he is one of only three players in ACC history to accomplish the feat, joining N.C. State's **Philip Rivers** and Wake Forest's **Riley Skinner**.

### VERNON AMONG TOP ROOKIE RECEIVERS

• WR **Conner Vernon** compiled 55 receptions for 746 yards and three touchdowns in his rookie season, ranking him among the top freshmen in the country in 2009 ... He ranked tied for third among freshmen nationally in receptions per game (5.0) and was second in receiving yards per game (67.82).

### VERNON SETS ROOKIE RECORDS

• WR **Conner Vernon** established new Duke freshman records for pass receptions (55), receiving yards (746) and 100-yard receiving games (3) ... Among rookies in the history of the ACC, his catch and yardage totals both rank as the third-highest totals.

### VARNER POSTS 1,000-YARD CAMPAIGN

• WR **Donovan Varner** became just the third player in school history to record at least 1,000 receiving yards in a single season, joining **Clarkston Hines** and **Wes Chesson** ... Varner's 1,047 yards marked the first 1,000-yard season since 1989 when Hines set the school record with 1,149 yards ... Varner's totals also rank among the top single-season performances in Duke history with his reception total ranking fifth and touchdown total of eight ranking seventh.

### VARNER-VERNON DUO IN ELITE COMPANY

• WRs **Donovan Varner** and **Conner Vernon** combined to become just the fourth pair of teammates in Duke history with 700 or more receiving yards in the same season ... In addition, the pair established a new record for most receiving yards by a tandem with 1,793 ... The last two teammates to go over 700 receiving yards were **Scottie Montgomery** (793) and **Richmond Flowers** (704) in 1998.

### THREE WITH 50+ PASS RECEPTIONS

• WRs **Austin Kelly** (54), **Donovan Varner** (65) and **Conner Vernon** (55) each caught over 50 passes in 2009 to become the first trio in school history with over 50 catches each ... Prior to 2009, only 14 wide receivers in school history had at least 50 catches in one year ... The combined 174 catches rank as the third-highest total by three players in one season in Duke history.

### SCOTT LEADS DUKE IN RUSHING

• RB **Desmond Scott** became the seventh freshman in Duke history to lead the team in rushing after ending the season with 262 yards on 70 carries ... It marked the second straight season a rookie has led the Blue Devils' rushing attack as **Jay Hollingsworth** paced the team with 399 yards in 2008.

### SACK LEADER

• DE **Ayanga Okpokowuruk** registered a team-high six sacks on the season, ending his career with a sack in six of the final eight games ... The total also ranked tied for fifth in the ACC ... Okpokowuruk also led the team with 9.5 tackles for loss on the season.

**OGHOBAASE ON DUKE CAREER CHARTS**

• DT **Vince Oghobaase** finished his career ranking among Duke's all-time leaders in both sacks and tackles for loss ... The Houston, Texas, native stands fifth all-time at Duke with 14.0 career sacks and sixth with 36.5 tackles for loss ... He had at least 7.5 tackles for loss in all four of his collegiate seasons.

**ALLOWING LESS THAN 200 YARDS**

• Duke held both Virginia and N.C. Central to less than 200 yards of total offense in a pair of Blue Devil victories ... The Blue Devils limited the Cavaliers to 196 yards (89 rush, 107 pass) while N.C. Central managed just 70 rushing yards and 111 passing yards for a total of 181 yards ... Prior to 2009, the last time the Blue Devils held an opponent under 200 yards of total offense was Sept. 6, 2003, against Western Carolina (185 yards).

**REY SETS SCHOOL STANDARD**

• LB **Vincent Rey** set a new school record when he recorded his third career fumble return for a touchdown against N.C. Central ... The touchdown in the victory over the Eagles covered 16 yards ... Rey returned two fumbles for touchdowns in 2008 versus Navy (37 yards) and North Carolina (36).

**FIVE INTERCEPTIONS FOR WRIGHT**

• CB **Leon Wright** recorded five interceptions in 2009 to rank tied for fifth in the ACC ... The picks came against Army (2), N.C. State, Virginia and North Carolina ... On Duke's all-time lists, Wright finished his career ranking tied for sixth in interceptions (10), ninth in interception return yards (155) and ninth in pass breakups (20).

**WRIGHT RANKS 10TH NATIONALLY**

• CB **Leon Wright** compiled 146 interception return yards on the season to rank 10th nationally ... He had two returns for touchdowns (51 & 33 yards) at Army, a 32-yard return at Virginia and a 30-yard return at North Carolina ... The 146 return yards rank as the fourth-highest single-season total in Duke history.

**REY AMONG ACC TACKLE LEADERS**

• LB **Vincent Rey** closed the year ranked third in the ACC with 8.2 tackles per game average in 2009 ... Posting 98 total stops in his final campaign, Rey became the 13th player in Duke history to amass more than 300 tackles to rank 11th in school history with 330 career tackles ... In addition, senior safety **Catron Gainey** ranked tied for 11th in the conference with 7.0 tackles per game.

**SNYDERWINE BOOTS RECORD 17 FIELD GOALS**

• With 17 made field goals this season, K **Will Snyderwine** broke **Sims Lenhardt's** record of 16 set in both 1997 and 1998 ... Snyderwine was 17-of-20 on the year to also set a new school single-season record for field goal percentage (.850).

**SNYDERWINE AMONG TOP ACC KICKERS**

• K **Will Snyderwine** made 17 of his 20 field goal attempts to rank second in the ACC and 15th nationally with 1.55 field goals per game ... He also ranked fifth in the ACC and tied for 20th nationally in field goal percentage (.850) ... Snyderwine was a perfect 24-of-24 on PAT attempts, one of 32 players nationally with 20 or more attempts and no misses.

**PUNT COVERAGE UNIT & FUMBLES**

• Duke's punt coverage unit recovered four fumbles in 2009 with two returns for touchdowns ... S **Matt Daniels** forced a fumble against N.C. Central which was returned 16 yards for a score by LB **Vincent Rey** ... LB **Adam Banks** fell on a fumble in the end zone for a touchdown at N.C. State ... Also against the Wolfpack, WR **Tony Foster** recovered a fumble and versus Maryland, TE **Brandon King** sealed the victory for Duke by recovering a fumble on a punt return with 1:42 remaining in the game.

**ALL-PURPOSE YARDAGE**

• RB **Desmond Scott** and WR **Conner Vernon** both ranked in the top 10 in the ACC in all-purpose yards per game as true freshmen ... Scott was seventh with 95.7 per game while Vernon averaged 94.6 all-purpose yards per game to rank eighth ... On Duke's freshman all-purpose records list, Vernon ranks fourth (1,041) while Scott stands sixth (861).

**AFCA HONORS MACINTYRE**

• Duke's defensive coordinator **Mike MacIntyre** was named the AFCA National Assistant Coach of the Year ... In his second year with the Blue Devils, MacIntyre helped the Blue Devils hold three straight ACC opponents (Maryland, Virginia & North Carolina) to fewer than 20 points for the first time in 15 seasons ... In 2008, the Blue Devil defense allowed 23.4 points per game -- the program's lowest total in 20 seasons -- and held three opponents to less than 10 points for the first time since 1976.

**NFL COMBINE**

• Two Blue Devil seniors — **Thaddeus Lewis** and **Vince Oghobaase** — participated in the annual NFL Scouting Combine on February 24-March 2 in Indianapolis, Ind. ... A total of 329 draft-eligible players were invited to the event.

**FIVE DEVILS INK NFL FREE AGENT CONTACTS**

• In the spring of 2010, five Duke players signed free agent contracts with respective NFL organizations ... **Thaddeus Lewis** (St. Louis Rams), **Vince Oghobaase** (Miami Dolphins), **Ayanga Okpokowuruk** (New York Giants), **Vincent Rey** (Cincinnati Bengals) and **Leon Wright** (New York Giants) all reached agreements with professional franchises.

**LEWIS TABBED DUKE MVP**

• After throwing for 3,330 yards and 20 touchdowns, QB **Thaddeus Lewis** was named the recipient of the Carmen Falcone MVP Award following the season ... Lewis also earned the program's Outstanding Offensive Back honor ... Other team honorees were **Kinney Rucker** (Ace Parker Award), **Jeffrey Faris** (Michael P. Suglia Award), **Ayanga Okpokowuruk** (Micah Harris Trinity Teammate Award & Outstanding Defensive Lineman Award), **Catron Gainey** (Iron Devil Award), **Will Snyderwine** (Bill Keziah Award – MVP Special Teams), **Kyle Hill** (Dan "Tiger" Hill Award – Outstanding Offensive Lineman), **Donovan Varner** (Outstanding Receiver Award), **Leon Wright** (Willis Aldridge Award – Outstanding Defensive Back) and **Vincent Rey** (Outstanding Linebacker Award).

## 2009 GAME SUMMARIES

### Richmond 24, Duke 16

September 5, 2009 • Durham, N.C.

- Richmond QB **Eric Ward** passed for 143 yards to lead the reigning FCS champion Spiders past Duke, 24-16, in front of 33,311 fans at Wallace Wade Stadium
- The Spiders took the lead midway through the opening period by returning a blocked punt for a touchdown, and led 14-9 at intermission. Richmond extended its lead to 24-9 in the fourth period before Duke QB **Thaddeus Lewis** accounted for the final margin with a 21-yard scoring pass to WR **Austin Kelly**
- Lewis completed 34-of-55 passes for 350 yards and two scores on the evening, breaking his own school single-game record for most pass attempts without an interception
- Blue Devil WR **Johnny Williams** had seven receptions for 115 yards including a 54-yard touchdown
- LB **Vincent Rey** paced Duke with 14 tackles
- Richmond held the Blue Devils to just 19 net rushing yards and won the time of possession battle, 33:22 to 26:38
- Neither team committed a turnover
- The crowd of 33,311 was Duke's largest at home since 2001

### Duke 35, Army 19

September 12, 2009 • West Point, N.Y.

- Seeing his first collegiate action, Duke backup QB **Sean Renfree** came off the bench to complete seven-of-eight passes for 106 yards and two touchdowns as the Blue Devils defeated Army, 35-19, in front of 25,698 fans at Michie Stadium in West Point, N.Y.
- Duke CB **Leon Wright** sealed the win with two interception returns for touchdowns just 16 seconds apart late in the fourth period ... The returns covered 51 and 33 yards as Wright became the first player in Duke history to score two touchdowns via interception returns in a single game ... The St. Petersburg, Fla., native also had four tackles and one fumble recovery
- With Duke trailing 10-7, Renfree connected with TE **Brett Huffman** for a 17-yard score to give the Blue Devils a 14-10 lead midway through the third quarter ... After a field goal cut the lead to 14-13, Renfree directed a nine-play, 78-yard drive that resulted in a 31-yard scoring toss to WR **Donovan Varner**
- At halftime of the game, Duke head basketball coach **Mike Krzyzewski** was honored as a member of Army's Sports Hall of Fame Class of 2009

- Kansas QB **Todd Reesing** threw for 338 yards and three touchdowns to lead the 22nd-ranked Jayhawks to a 44-16 win over Duke as 50,101 fans watched at Memorial Stadium in Lawrence, Kan.
- On Duke's first play from scrimmage, QB **Thaddeus Lewis** hooked up with WR **Austin Kelly** for a 66-yard gain to set up a 21-yard touchdown run by Lewis
