THE OPENING TIP

- Mike Krzyzewski's 37th season as head coach at Duke yielded 28 victories, an historic run to the ACC Tournament title and the program's 22nd consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance.
- The Blue Devils stormed Brooklyn to win their record 20th ACC Tournament championship by becoming the first team ever to win four games in four days.
- Coach K established ACC records for both tournament wins (61) and tournament titles (14) during the run.
- Duke earned a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Blue Devils have been a top-three seed an NCAA-best 28 times since 1985, four more than the closest team (Kansas, 24).
- Duke's 22 consecutive NCAA Tournament berths mark the second-longest active streak in the nation and the third-longest streak in NCAA history.

• Coach K, the only men's coach in Division I history to win 1,000 games overall, will enter the 2017-18 season just two wins shy of his 1,000th at Duke. His 998 wins at Duke are the most in NCAA history by a coach at one school.

• Coach K will also enter next season needing 28 wins to surpass the late Pat Summit (1,098) as the all-time wins leader in NCAA Division I basketball.

• The Blue Devils won at least 25 games for the 10th consecutive season. Duke, Gonzaga and Kansas are the only programs in the country with active 25-win streaks of 10 years.

• Duke won a nation's-best 13 games over RPI top-50 teams. Seven of the 13 victories came away from Cameron against ranked teams.

• The Blue Devils finished the year ranked sixth nationally in adjusted offensive efficiency (121.0). Duke is the only program in the country to rank in the top 10 in each of the last nine seasons.

• Duke ranked fourth nationally in three-point field goal percentage defense (.293), the best mark in the country by a major-conference team.

• The Blue Devils made 311 three-pointers in 2016-17, the fourth-best single-season total in program history. It marked the third time in the last four years that Duke sank at least 300 triples.

• Duke shot .762 from the free throw line as a team, tied for the fourth-best mark in program history and the team's best since 1989-90.

• Duke had three 1,000-point scorers on its roster for the 14th time in program history, as **Grayson Allen** (1,424), **Luke Kennard** (1,147) and **Amile Jefferson** (1,079) all reached the milestone in 2016-17.

112TH SEASON OF BASKETBALL

- The 2016-17 campaign marked the 112th season of Duke basketball. The Blue Devils have compiled a 2,115-873 all-time record to rank fourth all-time in victories.
- Only Kentucky (2,236), Kansas (2,217) and North Carolina (2,206) have more all-time wins than Duke (through April 3).
- Duke's all-time .708 winning percentage is also the fourth-best in NCAA history, behind only Kentucky (.764), North Carolina (.737) and Kansas (.723).

THERE'S ONLY 1K

- Mike Krzyzewski owns a 1,071-330 (.764) record over 42 seasons as a head coach, including a 998-271 (.786) mark at Duke (37 seasons).
- Coach K became the first men's coach in Division I college basketball to record 1,000 career victories with a 77-68 win over St. John's on Jan. 25, 2015 at Madison Square Garden.
- Krzyzewski has also won a record 460 ACC games (regular season and tournament), having passed Dean Smith (422) on Feb. 4, 2015.
- Coach K owns 998 of Duke's 2,115 all-time wins, translating to 47.2 percent of the wins in the history of Duke men's basketball.
- Duke has won 20+ games in 21 consecutive seasons, making Coach K the third coach in Division I men's history to do so.

MORE COACH K MILESTONES

- Duke head coach Mike Krzyzewski holds the NCAA record for wins at one school with 998 in his tenure at Duke.
- Coach K, the only men's coach in Division I history to win 1,000 games overall, needs just two victories to get to 1,000 at Duke.
- Coach K earned his 500th win at Cameron Indoor Stadium when Duke defeated Pitt on Feb. 4.

SUSTAINED SUCCESS

- Duke has won 20 or more games 52 times in its 111-plus years of basketball. Duke has won at least 20 games for 21 consecutive seasons.
- The Blue Devils have recorded 30 or more wins an NCAA-record 14 times under Coach K.
- Duke is one of three programs nationally to win at least 25 games in each of the last 10 seasons along with Gonzaga and Kansas.

STACKING UP GOOD WINS

- Duke led the nation with 13 wins against teams in the RPI top 50.
- Seven of those 13 victories came in ACC regular-season play and three came in the ACC Tournament. Seven of the 13 came against ranked teams away from Cameron.
- The Blue Devils were also 9-4 against ranked teams this season.

ROAD CHALLENGES

- As a result of unbalanced scheduling in the ACC, Duke finished the regular season having faced nine of the top 11 teams in the league standings on the road. Duke was 3-6 in those games.
- No other team in the league faced more than seven of the ACC's top 11 teams on the road.

CONSISTENT OFFENSIVE EFFICIENCY

- Duke ranked sixth nationally in adjusted offensive efficiency at a rate of 121.0.
- The Blue Devils are the only team to finish in the nation's top 10 in adjusted offensive efficiency in each of the last nine years.

EMBRACING THE THREE-POINT SHOT

- Duke ranked second in the league with an average of 8.8 three-pointers per game in ACC play and ranked third in the league with a .389 three-point percentage in conference action.
- Over its last 36 ACC games dating back to last season, Duke is shooting .389 (330-of-849) from outside the arc, translating to 9.2 treys per game.
- The Blue Devils made 311 three-pointers in 2016-17, the fourth-best single-season total in program history. It marked the second year in a row, and third time in the last four years, that Duke sank at least 300 triples.

- Duke turned the ball over via an opponent steal on just 6.8 percent of its possessions this season, the 13th-best rate in the country.
- Duke's 6.8 percent offensive steal rating is also fourth-best among major-conference teams.
- The Blue Devils ranked 41st nationally in overall turnover percentage, giving the ball away on just 16.3 percent of their possessions.

- Duke had a total of seven players on its 2016-17 roster who had international basketball experience, including six who have played in the USA Basketball system.
- **Harry Giles** and **Jayson Tatum** have both won three gold medals representing the U.S. in international competition, while **Chase Jeter** and **Luke Kennard** have one gold medal apiece.
- **Marques Bolden** and **Frank Jackson** made their USA Basketball debuts in 2016, helping the U.S. win the 2016 Nike Hoop Summit.
- **Jack White** has represented Australia at three international competitions since 2013.

GOING OUT WITH GOLD

- **Mike Krzyzewski** finished his tenure as U.S. National Team head coach with a flourish on Aug. 21, 2016, as the USA defeated Serbia for the gold medal at the Rio Olympics.
- With the win, Coach K became first coach - man or woman - to lead a country to three Olympic basketball gold medals (and did so consecutively).
- Coach K was 24-0 in the Olympics as head coach of the U.S. National Team. He was part of five Olympic gold medal-winning coaching staffs for the U.S., helping his country compile a 40-0 record in those tournaments.
- **Krzyzewski** concluded his tenure as U.S. National Team head coach with an 88-1 record, finishing it off with a National Team-record 76-game winning streak intact. He led the team to six gold medals and one bronze.
