DUKE NCAA HISTORY

Duke owns an all-time NCAA Team Championship record of 60-27 (.690) and has advanced to the quarterfinals in 1991-99, 2001, 2003, 2004, 2006, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2014. Duke claimed the NCAA Team Championship title in 2009 with a 4-0 victory against California.

Duke (20-5) vs. Boston University (11-10)

• Duke (20-5) makes its 28th consecutive NCAA Team Championship appearance on Friday, May 12, against Boston University (11-10) at 4 p.m. inside Ambler Tennis Stadium in Durham, N.C.

• Duke, the No. 15 overall seed, will host its second straight regional after going 1-1 in Durham a year ago.

• Should Duke defeat the Terriers Friday afternoon night, it would face the winner of the Tennessee (18-11) versus Winthrop (19-5) match at 4 p.m. Saturday, May 13.

• Friday will be the first match between Duke and Boston University. The Saturday match would be the 21st against Tennessee or fifth with Winthrop.

• A potential Round of 16 match against No. 2 seed North Carolina looms. The Tar Heels handed Duke its only ACC loss of the season, claiming a 5-2 victory on April 19.

• The Blue Devils have one NCAA Team Championship, winning the title in 2009.

• Duke captured a share of the ACC regular season title, going 13-1 in league play to equal the marks of North Carolina and Georgia Tech.

• The Blue Devils now own a league-best 20 regular season titles.

• Duke has reached the 20-win plateau for the first time since the 2013-14 campaign, when Duke finished 27-5.

• The Blue Devils enter the regional with a 12-0 home record. The 12 home triumphs are the fifth most in a year in program history.

• Duke has reached the NCAA Team Championship in each of head coach **Jamie Ashworth's** 20 seasons with the program

• Since the start of the 2011-12 season, Duke owns an 11-5 record (.688 winning percentage) in May.

• The Blue Devils faced 14 teams in the regular season that qualified for the NCAA Team Championship, going 12-5 against them.

• Of Duke's five losses this season, all came to NCAA Team Championship participants and to teams ranked within the top 15 at the time of the match.

• So far this year, Duke has gone 1-4 in neutral site matches. The Blue Devils fell to No. 6 Georgia, No. 15 Texas A&M and No. 9 Vanderbilt at the ITA Team Indoor Championship before splitting decisions at the ACC Championship in Rome, Ga.

• Duke is 7-4 in nonconference matches this season.

• Individually, sophomore **Kaitlyn McCarthy** enters the NCAA Championship on a 19-match winning streak. The last Blue Devil with at least 17 consecutive dual match victories was **Rachel Kahan** with 30 straight from September 18, 2010 – May 22, 2011.

• Ashworth earned career win No. 450 with a 4-3 victory against No. 23 Northwestern on February 5. Ashworth enters the NCAA's main event with 466 career triumphs.

**Versus Boston University ...**

Friday's match against the Terriers will be the first in program history.

Duke Unbeaten in Recent First-Time Meetings ...

Since the start of the 2013 dual match season, Duke is 9-0 in first-time meetings. During the span, the Blue Devils own victories against East Tennessee State, Elon, Florida Gulf Coast, Fresno State, Louisville, Pittsburgh, Portland, Texas Tech and Wyoming.

Taking on the Volunteers ...

Duke leads the all-time series 17-3, but the teams have not met since a 4-1 Duke victory on February 18, 2011. Tennessee won three of the first five contests, from 1978-89, but the Blue Devils have captured the last 15 matches.

The 2011 contest was at the ITA National Team Indoor Championship in Charlottesville, Va., with the Blue Devils falling in the doubles point before winning four straight decisions in singles. At the time of the match, all six Duke singles players were ranked within the top 90, with No. 86 **Elizabeth Plotkin** downing Kata Szekely 7-6 (8), 6-1 on court four to clinch the match.

Against Winthrop ...

A potential Round of 32 matchup would be just the fifth meeting with the Eagles in program history. Duke holds a commanding 4-0 advantage in the series that began in 2000.

All four matches have been in the NCAA Team Championship in a Durham regional, with Duke not allowing a point to the Eagles in the four wins. The last meeting was a 4-0 Duke win on May 11, 2012. No. 85 **Rachel Kahan** clinched with a 6-4, 6-1 victory on court three against Sandra Herrera.

Duke Against the Patriot League, SEC and Big South ...

Entering this weekend's NCAA Team Championship, the Blue Devils have not played any current members of the Patriot League, are a combined 93-76 against SEC clubs and 5-0 when facing all current Big South Conference members.

Strength in Numbers ...

Duke is one of nine ACC teams to receive a bid to the NCAA Team Championship, joining No. 2 seed North Carolina, No. 8 seed Georgia Tech, Clemson, Florida State, Miami, N.C. State, Notre Dame and Wake Forest.

The nine clubs are the second most of any league, behind only the SEC's 12 selections.

Tough at Home ...

Duke heads into the NCAA Team Championship with a 12-0 home record, good for the fifth most home wins in a year in program history. A year ago, the Blue Devils finished 11-3 in Durham.

Duke has not lost a regular season home match since falling 4-3 to Michigan on April 6, 2016. The Blue Devils have not lost a home ACC match since a 4-1 setback to North Carolina on March 29, 2016. Beginning with the 2013-14 campaign, the Blue Devils own a 45-5 record (.900 winning percentage) at home.

Sweet 16 ...

Duke has played 16 matches against ranked teams this year, going 11-5 in such contests, including a seven-match winning streak from February 22-April 13.

A Pair to the NCAA Singles Tournament ...

Senior **Chalena Scholl** and freshman **Meible Chi** were selected to represent Duke at the 2017 NCAA Singles Championship May 24-29 at the Dan Magill Tennis Complex in Athens, Ga. The doubles team of Chi and sophomore **Kaitlyn McCarthy** was named an alternate for the NCAA Doubles Tournament, played the same dates in the same venue.

Scholl and Chi received at-large bids to compete in the 64-player singles field and will be making their first career appearances in the singles championship.

Blue Devils in the NCAA Team Championship ...

Duke has six players who have competed in the NCAA Team Championship. A closer look at the six's singles and doubles records during the NCAA's premier team event:

Three All-ACC Honorees ...

Last month, Duke had three individuals earn All-ACC honors as Chi and junior **Samantha Harris** were first-team selections and Scholl was a second-team pick.

The Blue Devils had the third-most honorees, trailing only the Tar Heels' and Yellow Jackets' four. The all-league honor is the first in Chi's career, the second for Scholl and the third for Harris. Scholl repeats on the second squad while Harris was a third-team honoree the last two seasons.

McCarthy Nets 19th-Straight Victory ...

McCarthy's 6-3, 6-3 victory against Georgia Tech's Kenya Jones in the semifinals of the ACC Championship pushed her to a 22-1 dual match record and 19th consecutive victory. The last Blue Devil with at least 19 consecutive dual match victories was Kahan with 30 straight from September 18, 2010 – May 22, 2011.

McCarthy's only dual match setback this season was a 7-5, 6-4 loss to No. 34 Caroline Brinson of Georgia during the opening round of the ITA Team Indoor Championship.

Capturing the ACC Championship ...

Duke, North Carolina and Georgia Tech all finished 13-1 in conference play to tie for the ACC regular season title. The championship was the Blue Devils' first since 2012, when the program went 11-0 against league opponents and advanced to the NCAA Championship semifinals. The Blue Devils now own 20 regular season ACC titles and 17 ACC Tournament crowns. Duke won 12 consecutive regular season championships from 1988-99 before placing second in 2000. The Blue Devils ran off 14-straight ACC Tournament titles from 1988-2001.

Ashworth Tallies Career Win No. 450 ...

Head coach **Jamie Ashworth** earned his 450th career victory on February 5 as the Blue Devils defeated No. 23 Northwestern, 4-3. The 2014 Wilson/ITA National Women's Coach of the Year and five-time ITA Regional Coach of the Year, Ashworth is in his 21st season leading the Blue Devils. He is the ACC's all-time wins leader.

Losses Few and Far Between ...

Of Duke's five losses this season, all came to NCAA Team Championship participants that were within the top 15 at the time of the match.

13 Straight Wins for the Blue Devils ...

Duke went on a 13-match winning streak from February 22 to April 15. It was the longest run for Duke since a 13-match winning streak from February 23 – April 17, 2014. The longest winning streak in program history is 22 during the 2001 season.

11 Consecutive in the ACC ...

Prior to its only ACC setback of the year, a 5-2 loss at North Carolina, Duke had rattled off 11 consecutive league wins, tied for the fifth-longest streak in program history. The Blue Devils last won 11 consecutive league contests during the 2014 season. The program record for longest ACC winning streak is 82 matches from 1989-2000.

Close But Still A Win ...

Duke has played six 4-3 matches this season, going 5-1 and falling only to No. 15 Texas A&M at the ITA National Team Indoors. It is the third-straight year Duke has had a winning record in 4-3 contests. A closer look at the Blue Devils' record in 4-3 decisions the last four seasons:

Remaining in the Rankings ...

Duke has stood within the top 18 of the national rankings all season. The Blue Devils have been as high as No. 10, spending the first month of the season there.

Duke has not been outside of the top 20 since ranking 23rd in April of 2015.

Depth in the Order ...

Part of Duke's overall team success has been due to the depth in the Blue Devil order. Spots three, four and five have all been formidable for Duke this season. In particular, senior **Chalena Scholl** (18-1 at No. 3), sophomore **Kaitlyn McCarthy** (21-1 at No. 4) and senior **Alyssa Smith** (12-7 at No. 5) have been key pieces for the Blue Devils. A closer look at the No. 3, 4, and 5 singles positions:

Beating The Best ...

The Blue Devils have captured 17 singles victories against nationally ranked opponents. Leading the way for Duke is freshman **Meible Chi**, who has eight wins against ranked foes, the most for a Blue Devil since **Beatrice Capra** had 19 in 2014. Clinching Points ...

Duke's 20 wins this season have featured clinching points from a variety of individuals. All seven players who have participated in a singles match have clinched at least one for Duke this year. Chi on the Duke Freshman Singles Wins Chart ...

With a 6-0, 6-4 win versus Elle Stokes of Louisville on April 21, Chi recorded her 30th singles triumph of the year, tied for the 10th most in a year by a Blue Devil freshman. **Vanessa Webb** owns the record with 51 wins in 1996. The last Duke players to crack the list were Capra and **Monica Turewicz** with 32 victories in 2012.

Harris and Scholl Tied for Fourth ...

With their respective successful ACC seasons, Scholl and junior **Samantha Harris** raised their career league singles win totals to 29 each. The duo is tied for fourth on the Duke all-time ACC singles wins chart. **Reka Zsilinszka** is first in program history with 38 career ACC singles wins. While Scholl's career is complete, **Melissa Mang** is next on the list for Harris with 31 league victories.

Hamlin Strong Since Return ...

Since making her return to the lineup at Florida Gulf Coast on March 15, Hamlin has played to an 11-5 record. She anchored the sixth court for all but two of those matches and went 10-3 in ACC play. During the ACC Championship, she split decisions, sweeping Daniela Ruiz 6-3, 6-0 in the quarterfinals before falling in three sets to Georgia Tech's Luca Fabian 3-6, 6-0, 2-6.
