## Duke (16-9) vs. South Florida (17-8)

• Duke (16-9) makes its return to the NCAA Team Championship after missing the field in 2016. This will be the Blue Devils' 26th overall appearance in the main event and 25th showing in the last 26 seasons.

• The Blue Devils play their first match of the event Friday, May 12, against South Florida (17-8) at 11 a.m. inside the Dan Magill Tennis Complex in Athens, Ga.

• No. 12 Georgia, the No. 13 seed for the NCAA Team Championship, is serving as the host for the first and second rounds, and also for the NCAA Team Championship Round of 16 through the title match.

• Should Duke defeat the Bulls on Friday morning, it would take on the winner of the Georgia versus Florida A&M match Saturday at 3 p.m.

• The Blue Devils hold a 5-0 advantage in the all-time series with South Florida, but the two teams have not met since a 5-3 Duke victory on March 1, 1992. The teams have never met in NCAA Team Championship play.

• Duke positioned itself for the NCAA Team Championship appearance by going 12-5 during its final 17 matches of the season. Of the five losses, four were to teams ranked within the top 10 with the fifth setback at No. 17 Georgia Tech.

• Duke enters the NCAA event with an 8-4 record in nonconference matches this season.

• The Blue Devils has gone through a challenging road schedule this year, playing 10 matches away from Durham with seven taking place at top-20 foes. Duke has faced No. 15 Kentucky, No. 17 Illinois, No. 9 Northwestern, No. 5 North Carolina, No. 10 UCLA, No. 2 Virginia and No. 17 Georgia Tech all on the road.

• Duke faced against 11 teams in the regular season that qualified for the NCAA Team Championship, playing 12 matches against them and going 3-9 in those contests.

• Of Duke's nine losses, four were to teams that are nationally seeded NCAA Team Championship

• Of Duke's nine losses this season, all nine came to NCAA Team Championship participants and to teams who were ranked at the time of the match.

• The Blue Devils have been led by the team's lone senior, **TJ Pura**. Pura has played the best tennis of his career, going 11-0 in ACC action and clinching four of Duke's eight league victories. Pura enters the NCAA event with a career-high 30 singles victories.

• With two wins during its Senior Weekend, Duke finished the year with a 12-1 home record. The 12 home triumphs are tied for the seventh most in a year in program history.

• Duke posted an 8-4 ACC record in 2017 after finishing 4-8 in league play in 2016.

• The Blue Devils own a 1-1 neutral site record, playing their first two matches at a neutral site during the ACC Championship in Rome, Ga.

• In the last five years, Duke owns a 9-4 record (.692 winning percentage) in May.

**Versus South Florida ...**

Duke owns a 5-0 advantage in the all-time series, but the teams have not met since a 5-3 Duke victory on March 1, 1992. The two have never played in NCAA Team Championship action as all five matches have been in March. Duke is 2-0 on neutral courts against the Bulls.

To end the fall season, senior **TJ Pura** and freshman **Robert Levine** split decisions against USF's top player, Sasha Gozun, at the Dick Vitale Intercollegiate Clay Court Classic. Pura fell 7-5, 6-4 in the quarterfinals of the tournament while Levine capturing the championship with a 7-6 (3), 2-6, 6-4 victory.

**Taking on the Bulldogs ...**

Georgia leads the all-time series 9-4, with the teams splitting the last four matches. Duke captured the first two meetings, in 1939 and 1948, before the Bulldogs answered with seven-straight victories, from 1959 to 1998. The last four matches, from 1999 to 2011, have alternated Duke and Georgia victories. In NCAA Team Championship history, the Bulldogs are 3-0 versus Duke.

In the last match, on May 19, 2011, in Stanford, Calif., No. 6 Georgia came away with a 4-1 victory against No. 12 Duke in the NCAA Team Championship Round of 16. The Blue Devils registered their point as **Chris Mengel** earned a 6-2, 6-4 victory against No. 51 Sadio Dombia on court three.

**Against Florida A&M ...**

A potential second round matchup would be the first between Duke and Florida A&M.

**Back in the NCAA Team Championship Fold ...**

Duke makes its return to the NCAA Team Championship after missing the field in 2016. The Blue Devils have made the NCAA's main event in 25 of the last 26 seasons and own 26 overall appearances. In their last NCAA Team Championship showing, the Blue Devils advanced to the Round of 16 in 2015.

**Duke Against the American, SEC and MEAC ...**

Entering this weekend's NCAA Team Championship action, the Blue Devils own a combined record of 18-2 versus current members of the American Athletic Conference, 103-92 against SEC clubs and 24-2 when facing all current Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference members.

**Strength in Numbers ...**

Duke is one of seven ACC teams to receive a bid to the NCAA Team Championship, joining top-seeded Wake Forest, ACC Champion and No. 2 seed Virginia, No. 9 seed North Carolina, Florida State, Georgia Tech and Louisville. The seven clubs are tied with the Big 12 for the second most by a conference, trailing only eight selections by the SEC.

**Duke Players in the NCAA Team Championship ...**

The Blue Devils have two players who have taken part in an NCAA Team Championship match. Pura has the most experience of the duo, playing to a 3-1 mark in singles. In Duke's last NCAA Team Championship appearance, in 2015, Pura clinched both of the Blue Devils' matches during the regional in Durham, helping Duke advance to the Round of 16. Pura is 0-0 in doubles action, despite playing three matches in 2015 as all three went unfinished. Junior **Nicolas Alvarez** is 1-1 in singles and 1-2 in doubles action. Alvarez, ranked No. 14, defeated Stanford's No. 26 Tom Fawcett 6-4, 6-0 on court one in the regional final in 2015 to help the Blue Devils to a 4-1 win against the Cardinal.

**Furman and Stachowiak to NCAA Doubles Tournament ...**

Duke freshmen **Spencer Furman** and **Nick Stachowiak** will represent the Blue Devils at the NCAA Doubles Tournament. Furman and Stachowiak are one of 32 duos that will participate and one of 20 at-large selections. The two are the first Duke doubles team to reach the field since Alvarez and **Raphael Hemmeler** in 2015.

The freshman pair has formed Duke's top doubles team, going 19-3 overall and 9-3 on court one. The tandem, which earned its highest ranking of No. 20 on May 4, won its first 13 matches, the longest streak for a Blue Devil pair since **Henrique Cunha** and Hemmeler won 16 straight from March 5 – May 16, 2013.

**Three All-ACC Honorees ...**

Last week, Duke had three individuals earn All-ACC honors as Furman was a second team selection and sophomore **Catalin Mateas** and Pura were third team honorees.

The Blue Devils have had three or more All-ACC selections in four of the past five years. The all-league honor is the first for each of the three.

**Against the NCAA Team Championship Field ...**

**Another Road Challenge for Duke ...**

Playing ranked opponents outside of Durham is nothing new for this year's Duke squad. The Blue Devils played 10 true road matches during the regular season, seven versus foes ranked within the top 20 at the time of the contest. The Blue Devils went 3-7 on the road with a 6-1 win at Virginia Tech on March 4 to begin the ACC season, a 5-2 road win at Clemson on April 9 and a 4-3 victory at No. 39 Louisville on April 21.

Duke has faced No. 15 Kentucky, No. 17 Illinois, No. 9 Northwestern, No. 5 North Carolina, No. 10 UCLA, No. 2 Virginia and No. 17 Georgia Tech all on the road. The Blue Devils faced just five total top-20 clubs a year ago, and just one on the road.

**Smith Tallies Career Win No. 175 ...**

Duke head coach **Ramsey Smith** earned his 175th career victory with a 5-2 win at Clemson on April 9. Smith is one of just three Duke coaches to reach the 175-wins plateau. A closer look:

**A Turnaround from 2016 ...**

Duke enters this year's NCAA Team Championship with a 16-9 overall record in 2017 after finishing 11-15 a campaign ago. The Blue Devils also flipped their ACC record this year, going from 4-8 to 8-4.

**Pura Sets Duke ACC Single-Season Consecutive Wins Mark ...**

Senior **TJ Pura** finished the ACC regular season with an 11-0 record, marking the longest single-season ACC winning streak in program history. Pura picked up the record-setting 10th straight victory with a 6-3, 6-1 triumph against Nile Clark of Miami on April 15. His 11-straight ACC wins in a single season surpassed the previous record of nine in a year, set by **Raphael Hemmeler** in 2015. The overall Duke record for consecutive league wins is 31 by **Marko Cerenko** from 1998-2001 as he went undefeated during his career.

**Pura Sixth in Duke's ACC Career Wins Club ...**

Pura's 11 ACC wins this year match **Jason Tahir's** Duke record for league wins in a season with 11 in 2013. Pura also finished with 30 career league singles wins, the sixth most at Duke.

**Clinchers for Pura ...**

Pura capped the final regular season match of his career with a 6-2, 7-6 (3) victory against Louisville's Clement Filho on April 21. The win clinched the match for Duke and marked Pura's fourth clincher of the Blue Devils' eight ACC wins this season.

**A Strong Season at Home ...**

Duke capped the 2017 regular season with a 12-1 home ledger. The 12 home victories are tied for the seventh most in a year in program history while the .923 winning percentage is tied for the 11th best in single-season history. The Blue Devils' only home setback was 5-2 against No. 2 Wake Forest on March 12.

**The Doubles Point a Good Indicator of The End Result ...**

Duke has won the doubles point 17 times during its 25 matches. The Blue Devils captured just 11 doubles points a season ago. In the 17 matches Duke has taken the early lead this year, the Blue Devils own a 13-4 record (.765 winning percentage). At the ACC Championship, Duke split its doubles points, winning against No. 20 Georgia Tech and falling against Miami.

**Five with 20 or More Wins ...**

Duke heads into the NCAA Team Championship having five players with 20 or more singles wins. Freshman **Nick Stachowiak** leads the way with 32 victories while Pura is close behind with 30. Sophomores **Catalin Mateas** (24) and **Ryan Dickerson** (22) joined the club before freshman **Spencer Furman** recorded his 20th at the ACC Championship. A year ago, the Blue Devils had just three reach the 15-win plateau and just one capture 20 or more wins.

**Close But Still a Win ...**

Duke has played six 4-3 matches this season, falling in the first three and the last one. A year ago, Duke played in five 4-3 decisions, but won just one. A closer look at the Blue Devils' record in 4-3 decisions the last four seasons:

**Depth in the Order ...**

Part of Duke's overall team success has been due to the depth in the Blue Devil order. Spots four, five and six have all been formidable for Duke this season. In particular, Stachowiak (9-3 at No. 4), Pura (9-1 at No. 5) and Dickerson (10-1 at No. 6) have been key pieces for the Blue Devils. A closer look at the No. 4, 5 and 6 singles positions for Duke:

**A Freshman Surpasses 30 Singles Wins ...**

Stachowiak picked up his 30th singles win of the year against Miami with a 6-2, 6-4 triumph against Jesse Flores on court four. He added two more wins at the ACC Championship and enters the NCAA Team Championship with 32 victories, tied with David Hall (1989-90) and Alex Bose (2000-01) for the sixth most by a Duke freshman. Stachowiak is the first Blue Devil rookie to get 30 in a year since **Nicolas Alvarez** tallied 31 during the 2014-15 season.

Stachowiak is up to 27 doubles wins this year, tied with **Phillip King** (2000-01) for the fifth most by a Blue Devil freshman.

**A Winning Streak for the Record Book ...**

Stachowiak began his career with 11 consecutive dual match wins, the longest by a Duke rookie since Cunha ripped off 24 consecutive from February 5 – May 29, 2010. Overall, Stachowiak put together a 14-match winning streak, the longest for the Blue Devils since Pura's run of 14 consecutive decisions from November 1, 2013 – April 25, 2014.

**A Strong Return ...**

Freshman **Robert Levine** missed nearly a month of matches due to a bout with mononucleosis in March. Levine came back for the March 31 match against Florida State and the Blue Devils have gone 6-2 in overall contests since his return. Levine's return allowed Stachowiak, Pura and Dickerson to finish out the last three singles spots in the lineup.

**Four at the Top Spot ...**

Duke has rotated four players at the No. 1 singles position this year with Mateas getting the most decisions there and going 5-5. Furman is just behind with a 3-6 ledger in the top slot. It is the first time since head coach **Ramsey Smith** took over as head coach that Duke has had four players in the No. 1 position.
