► DUKE AT THE NCAA OUTDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

SETTING THE SCENE

•Ten Duke student-athletes will conclude the outdoor season at the 2017 NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships this week, hosted by the University of Oregon in Eugene, Ore., June 7-10 at Hayward Field.
 •Each day of competition will be televised live by ESPN, beginning Wednesday at 7:30 p.m. (ET) on ESPNU and 8:30 p.m. on ESPN2. Thursday's action will be on ESPN2 at 7:30 p.m. Friday and Saturday will be aired on ESPN, beginning at 8:30 p.m. and 6:30 p.m., respectively. Fans can also stream all four days online with ESPN3.

RETURN TO EUGENE

•Five of the 10 Blue Devils that qualified for the 2017 NCAA Outdoor Championships are making consecutive trips back to Eugene.
 •This campaign marks the third straight season that junior Madison Heath competes in Eugene in women's pole vault.
 •Senior Madeline Kopp qualified for the 4x400m relay as a junior and freshman. Kopp will be a member of this year's squad while also competing individually in the 800m.
 •Both Maddy Price and MacKenzie Kerr will head back to the national stage to represent Duke in the 4x400m relay for the second straight year.
 •Graduate student Daniel Golubovic qualified for the decathlon his junior and freshman year at UC San Diego. This will be Golubovic's first NCAA appearance in the decathlon in a Duke uniform.

HEATH CONTINUES TO SOAR

•Madison Heath returns to the national stage with her sights set high, entering the weekend seeded 20th.

•The 2017 outdoor campaign marks Heath's third consecutive trip to Eugene after she received second team All-America accolades as a sophomore and honorable mention honors as a rookie.
 •Heath is coming off a tied for second place at the NCAA East Preliminary Round with a clearance of 13-9.25 (4.20) and an ACC title at the conference championships in May.

VAULT SQUAD SETS THE BAR HIGH

•Both the men's and women's pole vault squads have seen great success during the outdoor season as one male and two females qualified for this week's competition.
 •Senior Connor Hall enters the week tabbed 10th after placing third at the NCAA East Prelims with a school-record height of 17-6.50 (5.35).
 •On the women's side, Heath will be joined by rookie Laura Marty who owns the fourth-best clearance in Duke history in 13-9.25 (4.20) and is seeded 23rd.

KOPP SETS GAZE ON NATIONAL STAGE

•Senior Madeline Kopp is set to compete in her first outdoor 800m at the NCAA Championships after transitioning to mid-distance during her senior campaign.
 •Kopp placed third in her heat and eighth overall at the NCAA East prelims, clocking in the third-best time in Duke history, 2:03.00.
 •In addition to her individual race, Kopp will run a leg of the 4x400m relay in Eugene for the third time in her career.
 •Kopp joins members of the relay squad (MacKenzie Kerr, India Lowe and Maddy Price) that posted the fourth-fastest time in Duke history, 3:34.17, at the NCAA East prelims. The 4x400m relay secured the 16th seed for nationals.

GOLUBOVIC QUALIFIES FOR DECATHLON

•Graduate student Daniel Golubovic heads to the NCAA Outdoor Championships after qualifying for the decathlon with a gold medal performance at the ACC Championships.
 •With a score of 7,500 points at the Mt. Sac Relays earlier this spring, Golubovic heads to Eugene seeded 21st in the competition.
 •Golubovic's last decathlon was at the conference championships where he finished first with a score of 7,493 points, just seven off his personal-best and second-best point total in school history.

JAVELIN DUO READY TO SHINE

•Senior Christine Streisel and rookie Katelyn Gochenour each qualified for the women's javelin competition for the first time in their careers.
 •Gochenour enters the week ranked seventh with a fifth-place finish mark of 167-10 (51.16) at the NCAA East Preliminary Round, while also holding the school-record mark of 170-2 (51.86).
 •Streisel registered a mark of 159-10 (48.72) at the NCAA East Prelims to secure the 16th seed. Streisel owns the third-best mark in Duke history, 164-4 (50.15), set in 2014.

RECORD SETTING SEASON

•Two of the five Blue Devils that etched their name atop the Duke all-time list in their respective events throughout the outdoor campaign are ready to compete in Eugene.
 •Rookie Katelyn Gochenour anxiously awaited her collegiate debut in the javelin at the Raleigh Relays and registered a mark of 170-2 (51.86) and enters the week tabbed seventh.
 •In men's pole vault, senior Connor Hall cleared an outstanding height of 17-6.50 (5.35) at the NCAA East Preliminary Round to secure his ticket to nationals with the 10th seed.
