» TRENDING

- » Duke has won 132 consecutive home games vs. non-conference competition, the longest such streak in the nation. The last time Duke dropped a non-conference game at home was on Feb. 26, 2000 against St. John's.
- » To put that in perspective, Duke senior **Grayson Allen** was four years old when that loss occurred and freshmen **Marvin Bagley III** and **Wendell Carter, Jr.**, were both one. The No. 1 song on the Billboard Top 100 was "I Knew I Loved You" by Savage Garden and retail gasoline prices were \$1.58. The top movie of the week was "The Whole Nine Yards" starring **Bruce Willis** and **Matthew Perry**. Apple's first iPod was still more than a year away from being introduced. And, Coach K was the proud grandfather of one (he now has 10).
- » Duke will play its 150th game as the No. 1 team in the AP poll since 1998. That figure is 70 more games than the next closest school (Kentucky) during that timeframe.
- » Elon returns five starters from last year's 18-14 team that finished fourth in the CAA. Junior forward **Tyler Seibring** is the team's leading returning scorer at 14.4 ppg. He was a first team All-CAA preseason selection.
- » CollegeInsider.com ranked Elon 22nd in its Preseason Mid-Major Top-25 Poll.



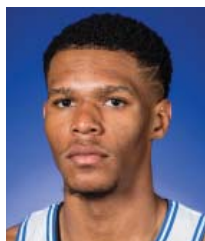

» TEAM NOTES

**113TH SEASON OF BASKETBALL**

- » The 2017-18 campaign marks the 113th season of Duke Basketball. The Blue Devils have compiled a 2,115-873 all-time record to rank fourth all-time in victories.
- » Only Kentucky (2,237), Kansas (2,217) and North Carolina (2,206) have more all-time wins than Duke entering the season.
- » Duke's all-time .708 winning percentage is also the fourth-best in NCAA history, behind only Kentucky (.765), North Carolina (.739) and Kansas (.725).

**NUMBER 1 AGAIN**

- » Duke enters the 2017-18 season as the No. 1 team in both the Associated Press and *USA Today* Coaches polls.
- » This is now the 21st time in the past 33 seasons that Duke has reached No. 1 in either poll at some point in a year.
- » The program has now been ranked No. 1 by the AP in a total of 21 seasons, including 13 of the last 20 years.
- » The Blue Devils have been ranked No. 1 in the AP poll 75 times since the start of the 1997-98 season, far and away the most in the nation (North Carolina is second with 39).
- » This is the 10th consecutive year that Duke starts the season ranked among the nation's top 10 teams in the AP poll. In eight of those previous nine seasons, Duke also finished in the AP top 10.
- » Duke's nine preseason AP No. 1 rankings are tied for the most in the history of the poll, and its 130 total polls as the AP's top-ranked team ranks second.

**SUSTAINED SUCCESS**

- » Duke has won 20 or more games 52 times in its 112-plus years of basketball.
- » The Blue Devils have recorded 30 or more wins an NCAA-record 14 times under Coach K.
- » Duke is one of three programs nationally to win at least 25 games in each of the last 10 seasons along with Gonzaga and Kansas
- » Duke has won 20 or more games in 21 consecutive seasons entering the 2017-18 campaign.

**DUKE ROLLS IN EXHIBITIONS**

- » Duke defeated reigning Division II national champion Northwest Missouri State, 93-60, on Oct. 27, then followed that up with a 116-53 win over Bowie State on Nov. 4.
- » In two preseason games, Duke has shot .597 from the floor and had a +28.5 rebound margin. The Blue Devils averaged 104.5 points and enjoyed a +48.0 victory margin.
- » Senior **Grayson Allen** was the team's leading scorer at 22.0 ppg and shot .615 from the field, including .438 from three-point range. He also averaged 5.0 rebounds and 7.0 assists.
- » **Marvin Bagley III** averaged 20.5 points and 8.0 boards, while **Wendell Carter, Jr.**, averaged 17.0 points and 11.5 rebounds in Duke's frontcourt. Carter, Jr. shot 16-of-20 from the field in two contests.
- » **Gary Trent, Jr.**, has been efficient, averaging 18.5 points, 3.5 rebounds and 3.0 assists. He scored 37 points on just 22 field goal attempts.

**NON-CON HOME WIN STREAK**

- » Duke has won an NCAA-best 132 consecutive non-conference home games. Duke's last home loss against a non-conference foe was an 83-82 decision against St. John's on Feb. 26, 2000.
- » Duke has also won 124 straight games at Cameron against unranked non-conference opponents (also dating back to the 83-82 loss to St. John's on Feb. 26, 2000).

**WHAT'S BACK?**

- » Duke returns 20 percent of its scoring (603/2,991), 17 percent of its rebounding (224/1,341) and 26 percent (128/484) of its assists from a season ago. Team captain **Grayson Allen** is the team's lone senior and he has been recognized as a preseason All-American by several outlets, including first team honors by *Blue Ribbon*. Allen is the team's leading returnee in every major statistical category except blocked shots (**Marques Bolden** had seven to lead Duke returnees). The Jacksonville, Fla., native averaged 14.5 ppg, 3.7 rpg and 3.4 apg last season.

## NEW YEAR, NEW FACES

- » In addition to its seven returning letterwinners, Duke welcomes eight newcomers to the fold who made up the No. 1 recruiting class in the nation according to ESPN. Four top 10 recruits -- **Marvin Bagley III** (1), **Wendell Carter, Jr.** (5), **Treyvon Duval** (6) and **Gary Trent, Jr.** (8). **Jordan Tucker** (42) and **Alex O'Connell** (87) also resided in the top 100 per ESPN. **Jordan Goldwire** and **Mike Buckmire** are also incoming freshmen for Duke.
- » This marks just the third time Duke has eight freshmen (scholarship and walk-on) on its roster. The other teams were in 1944-45 and 1986-67.
- » Duke's seven scholarship freshmen are tied for the most by any school in the country this season. Duke joins Pitt, Mount St. Mary's and Kentucky as schools with seven scholarship freshmen. Montana and Holy Cross each have six.
- » To quantify, if a freshman was valued as a 1 in experience, sophomores 2, juniors 3, seniors 4, and graduates 5, this is the youngest Duke team in the Post World War II era:

## FRESHMEN STARTERS

- » Along with senior **Grayson Allen**, Duke started four freshmen -- **Trevon Duval**, **Gary Trent, Jr.**, **Wendell Carter, Jr.**, and **Marvin Bagley III** -- in its exhibition game against NW Missouri State on Oct. 27.
- » If that starting lineup holds for the regular season opener against Elon, it would mark the first time that Duke starts four freshmen since the 1982-83 season when **Johnny Dawkins**, **Mark Alarie**, **Jay Bilas** and **David Henderson** started 23 times together.
- » Of Coach K's 1,269 games as Duke's head coach, only 23 times have four freshmen started together and in only 60 games have three or more freshmen started.

## SIZING UP THE BLUE DEVILS

- » Duke has one of its tallest rosters in history. The 2017-18 Blue Devils are just the fourth team to average a height of 6-7 or more.
- » Duke's top seven rotation players are 6-11 (2), 6-10 (2), 6-6, 6-5 and 6-3.
- » Three of Duke's tallest teams have been in the last three seasons:

- » Starting with its regular season opener on Nov. 10, Duke will play an NBA-type schedule in November with nine regular season games in 20 days. Five of those nine games will be played outside of Durham.
- » Duke will travel more than 8,500 miles round trip from Nov. 14-29. The Blue Devils face Michigan State in Chicago (1,572 miles round trip) on Nov. 14, then play in the PK80 Tournament in Portland, Ore. (5,680) from Nov. 23-26 before facing Indiana in Bloomington on Nov. 29 (1,284).
- » Duke's 18-game ACC regular season schedule includes 11 games against 2017 NCAA Tournament participants.

## » DUKE IN THE NBA [21]\*

- » A total of 69 former Duke players have appeared on NBA rosters.
- » Overall, 35 Duke players have been selected in the first round of the NBA Draft in the Coach K era, including 17 in the past seven years.
- » The 21 Duke players on NBA rosters are the most by any ACC school in a single season in the history of the league.
- » Three Duke players have been selected No. 1 in the NBA Draft -- **Art Heyman** (1963), **Elton Brand** (1999) and **Kyrie Irving** (2011).
- » In 2017, Duke had four players drafted, bringing its total to 57 under **Mike Krzyzewski**.
- » Duke has had 23 players selected in the NBA Draft Lottery, the most in the nation since the system was put into place in 1985.
- » Overall, between Duke and USA Basketball, Coach K has coached 98 NBA players -- 49 of whom are active.
- » In 1999, Duke became the first program in the history of the NBA Draft to have four players from the same school selected in the first round. Three of the four -- **Elton Brand** (Chicago), **Trajan Langdon** (Cleveland) and **Corey Maggette** (Seattle) -- were lottery picks.
- » In 2002, **Jason Williams** (2nd overall) and **Mike Dunleavy** (3rd) became the first college teammates in the history of the NBA Draft to be the first two collegians selected.
- » Five former Duke players -- **Jeff Mullins** (Golden State, 1975), **Danny Ferry** (San Antonio, 2003), **Shane Battier** (Miami, 2012 and 2013), **Kyrie Irving** (Cleveland, 2016) and **Dahntay Jones** (Cleveland, 2016) -- have been part of NBA championship teams.
- » Duke players who've played under Coach K have earned \$1.35 billion in NBA contracts. That figure includes \$152.8 million by active Duke NBA players.

## SELLOUT STREAK

- » Duke has sold out 422 consecutive games at Cameron Indoor Stadium. The last time Duke did not have a sellout at home was on Nov. 16, 1990, against Boston College.
- » The sellout figure is the longest current streak in either men's college basketball or the NBA.

## DUKE NAMED TOP PROGRAM AGAIN

- » For the fourth consecutive time, Duke was chosen as the top Division I men's basketball program by *Basketball Times*. The analysis comes out every five years.
- » The magazine uses six equally weighted categories - winning percentage, the number of former players on NBA rosters, federal graduation rate, academic peer assessment score, program cleanliness and head coach ranking - over a 10-year period in order to measure the programs against each other.
- » Just nine programs have qualified for every edition of the project, which is now 20 years old. Along with Duke, they are Arizona, Connecticut, Kansas, Kentucky, Murray State, North Carolina, Syracuse and Xavier.
- » The Blue Devils took the top spot with an average of 3.5, well ahead of second place Notre Dame's 9.3 average.

In 37 seasons at Duke, Mike Krzyzewski - a Naismith Hall of Fame coach, five-time national champion and 12-time Final Four participant - has built a dynasty that few programs in the history of the game can match.

The numbers that illustrate Coach K's career are simply staggering:

- Five national championships (1991, 1992, 2001, 2010, 2015)
- Six gold medals as head coach of the U.S. Men's National Team
- Six National Defensive Players of the Year (nine honors)
- Seven National Players of the Year (nine honors)
- 10 consecutive top-10 AP poll finishes (1997-06)
- 12 National Coach of the Year honors (eight seasons)
- 12 Final Four appearances (tied for most in NCAA history)
- 12 ACC regular season championships
- 14 ACC Tournament championships (most in league history)
- 23 NBA Lottery picks (most in draft history)
- 31 All-America selections (45 honors)
- 33 NCAA Tournament bids (most ever by one coach)
- 57 NBA Draft selections, including 35 first-round picks
- 61 ACC Tournament wins (most in league history)
- 91 NCAA Tournament wins (most in NCAA history)
- 112 weeks ranked No. 1 in the AP poll (most by an active coach in poll history)
- 460 ACC wins (most in league history)
- 498 weeks ranked in the top 10 of the AP poll (most by a coach in poll history)
- 583 weeks ranked in the AP poll (most by a coach in poll history)
- 998 victories at Duke (most in NCAA history at one school)
- 1,071 career wins (most in NCAA history)

Coach K became the Division I men's career wins leader on Nov. 15, 2011, at Madison Square Garden, moving past his former coach Bob Knight with his 903rd victory. His historic 1,000th career victory came against St. John's at The World's Most Famous Arena on Jan. 25, 2015, as he became the first Division I men's basketball coach to achieve a four-figure win total.

Krzyzewski's 998 victories at Duke are an NCAA record by a coach at one school. With 998 of the Blue Devils' 2,115 all-time victories, Coach K has presided over 47.2 percent of the men's basketball wins in Duke history.

Krzyzewski has won a league-record 460 ACC games (regular season and tournament), passing former North Carolina head coach Dean Smith (422) on Feb. 4, 2015.

Coach K's five national championships are the second-most in NCAA history. Krzyzewski and former Connecticut coach Jim Calhoun are the only coaches in NCAA history to win national championships in three different decades.

Coach K has led the Blue Devils into the NCAA Tournament 33 times - more than any other coach in NCAA history. He has taken Duke to the NCAA Tournament in each of the last 22 seasons, the longest active streak by a coach and the second-longest in NCAA history.

Krzyzewski holds NCAA Tournament records for games coached (119) and wins (91) while ranking second all-time and leading active coaches with a .765 NCAA Tournament winning percentage (min. 20 games). He has reached the Sweet 16 on 23 occasions, five more than any other coach in NCAA history, and has advanced to the Elite Eight 14 times.

Of the 1,269 games Krzyzewski has coached at Duke, 1,124 - 88.6 percent - have been as a ranked team. The Blue Devils are 917-207 (.816) as a ranked team under Coach K.

Coach K has taken top-ranked Duke teams into games on 223 occasions and compiled a 194-29 (.870) record as the AP's No. 1 team, ranking second in poll history in

both games and wins as coach of a top-ranked squad.

Krzyzewski has tutored 57 NBA Draft picks during his time at Duke, including a total of 35 first-round selections that leads all active coaches. Duke has had at least one player taken in 30 of the 37 NBA Drafts during the Krzyzewski Era.

Since the inception of the NBA Draft Lottery in 1985, Coach K and Duke have produced 23 lottery picks - a draft-record total for both a school and a coach.

Through the 2016-17 season, Coach K's former Duke players have accumulated \$1.35 billion in NBA salaries. Lottery selections who played for Krzyzewski at Duke have combined to earn approximately \$950 million, an average of just over \$45 million per individual.

Under Coach K's watch, Duke has produced multiple All-ACC Academic selections in 10 consecutive years. The 2015 NCAA championship featured a program-high five All-ACC Academic honorees. Three-time captain Amile Jefferson became the only player in Duke history to earn All-ACC Academic honors four times and departed the university in 2017 with both bachelor's and master's degrees.

Krzyzewski has had six players collect a total of nine CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, headlined by two-time first-team honorees Battier (2000, 2001) and Mason Plumlee (2012, 2013). Allen became the sixth in 2016 when he garnered second-team accolades.

Fittingly, Coach K has earned nearly every award imaginable. The crown jewel of that haul, however, came in 2001 when he was inducted into the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame.

Since his enshrinement in Springfield, Mass., Krzyzewski has also been inducted into the Army Sports Hall of Fame (2009), the Chicagoland Sports Hall of Fame (2010) and the Duke Athletics Hall of Fame (2011).

While establishing Duke as one of college basketball's dynastic programs, Krzyzewski simultaneously spent more than a decade as one of the architects of the revitalization of USA Basketball. During his tenure at the helm of the program, the U.S. National Team amassed an extraordinary 88-1 record and claimed gold medals at the 2007 FIBA Americas Championship, 2008 Beijing Olympics, 2010 FIBA World Championship, 2012 London Olympics, 2014 FIBA World Cup and 2016 Rio Olympics, as well as a bronze medal at the 2006 FIBA World Championship.

Coach K was 24-0 in the Olympics as head coach of the USMNT and his time at the helm ended with the team in the midst of a National Team-record 76-game winning streak that began in 2006.

### Giving Back

Krzyzewski has been diligently committed to public service, both locally and nationally, throughout his coaching career. He is currently serving on boards for, while also assuming vital roles with, the Duke Children's Hospital, the Jimmy V Foundation for Cancer Research, the NABC Foundation, the CEO Roundtable on Cancer and the Emily Krzyzewski Center.

Coach K's philanthropic activities also include the establishment and funding of the Emily Krzyzewski Center, a community center in Durham named in honor of his late mother. **THERE'S ONLY 1K**

- » Mike Krzyzewski owns a 1,071-330 (.764) record as a head coach, including a 998-271 (.786) mark at Duke.
- » Coach K became the first Division I men's coach to record 1,000 career victories with a win over St. John's on Jan. 25, 2015 at Madison Square Garden.
- » Krzyzewski has won a record 460 ACC games (regular season and tournament). He has 399 regular-season ACC wins.
- » Coach K owns 998 of Duke's 2,115 all-time wins, translating to 47.2 percent of the wins in Duke history.
- » Duke has won 20+ games in 21 straight seasons, making Coach K the second Division I men's coach to do so.

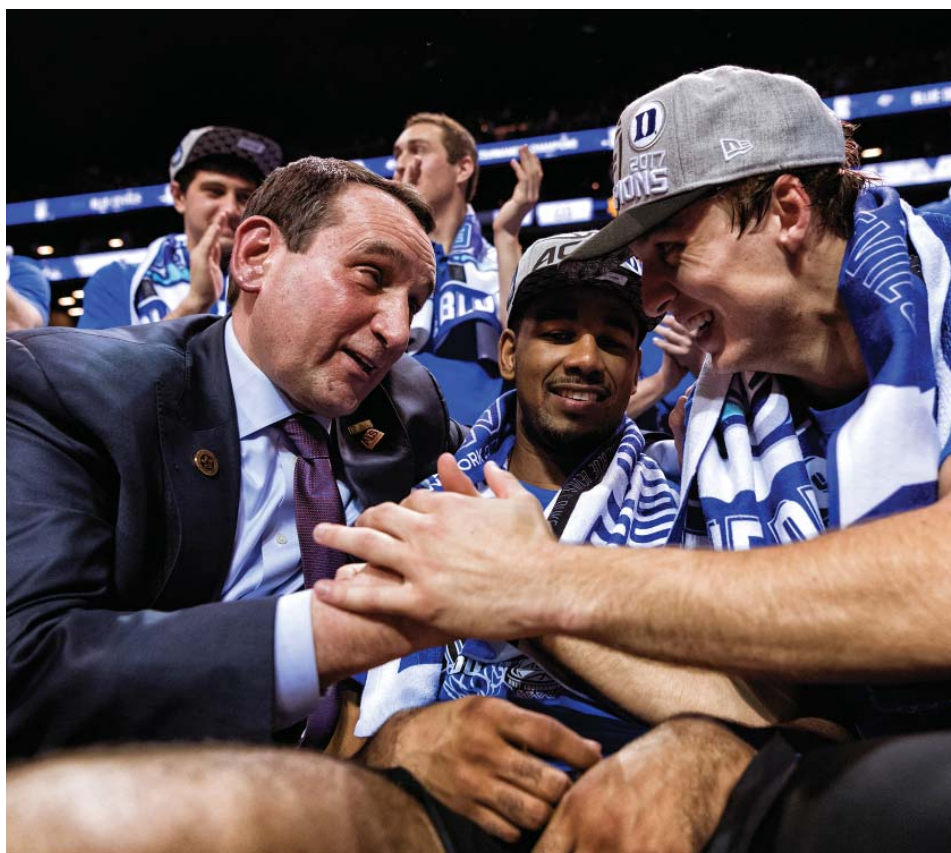
