



Duke Postgame Notes

Duke vs. Michigan State



Nov. 14, 2017 // United Center // State Farm Champions Classic // Chicago, Ill.

- Duke improved to 4-3 in the Champions Classic, while improving to 12-2 all-time versus Michigan State. The Blue Devils have won seven straight in the series versus the Spartans.
- Head Coach **Mike Krzyzewski** improved to 12-1 all-time vs. Michigan State.
- Duke's last win over a top-five ranked opponent (AP poll) was a victory over No. 5 North Carolina, 74-73, on February 17, 2016.
- Duke's last win over AP No. 2 came January 31, 2015, a 69-63 victory at Virginia.
- Tonight's game was Duke's 226th when playing as the No. 1-ranked team under Coach K and the Blue Devils improved to 197-29 in those games. All time, Duke is 220-34 when ranked No. 1.
- Duke improved to 4-2 when playing as the No. 1-ranked team versus No. 2.
- Coach K's record at Duke improved to 1,001-271 in his 38th season. His overall record improved to 1,074-330 in this, his 43rd season.
- Senior guard **Grayson Allen** led all scorers with career-high and Champions Classic record 37 points. The previous scoring record in the Champions Classic was held by Michigan State's Denzel Valentine (29). Allen's previous career high was 34 versus UNLV on December 10, 2016.
- Allen's 30-point game is the first by a Duke player since **Luke Kennard** scored 34 at Wake Forest on January 28, 2017. It is Allen's sixth career 30-point game and his first since scoring 34 versus UNLV December 10, 2016.
- Duke improved to 6-0 when Allen goes for 30+ points.
- Allen also matched a career high with seven three-point field goals. He was 7-of-11 from three-point range, 11-of-20 from the field and 8-of-8 at the free throw line.
- Freshman guard **Trevon Duval** finished with a career-high 17 points and 10 assists for his second-straight points and assists double-double.
- Including his 10 assists tonight, Duval has collected (30) over the first three games of his career, the most by any Duke player through the first three games of a season. The previous record of 26 was set by **Chris Duhon** in the 2010-11 season.
- Duval also had a game and career high six steals tonight, and has amassed more steals (12) than any Duke freshman through the first three games of a career. The previous record was nine set by **Kenny Dennard** in 1997-78.
- Freshman forward **Wendell Carter, Jr.**, posted his first career double-double by matching a career-high of 12 points and pulling down a career-best 12 rebounds.
- Duke extended its streak of at least one made three-pointer in a game to 987. It is the nation's fourth-longest active streak.
