



Duke Postgame Notes

Duke vs. Furman

- Tonight's game was Duke's 228th when playing as the No. 1-ranked team under head coach **Mike Krzyzewski** and the Blue Devils improved to 199-29 in those games. All time, Duke is 222-34 when ranked No. 1.
- Duke played its 154th game as the nation's No. 1-ranked team in the AP poll since 1998. That figure is 73 more than the next closest school (Kentucky) during that time.
- Coach K's record at Duke improved to 1,003-271 in his 38th season. His overall record improved to 1,076-330 in this, his 43rd season.
- Duke extended its streak of at least one made three-pointer in a game to 990. It is the nation's fourth-longest active streak.
- The Blue Devils extended their streak to 136 consecutive non-conference home wins at Cameron Indoor Stadium. It is the nation's longest active streak.
- Freshman guard **Trevon Duval** scored a career-high 18 points on 9-of-12 shooting. His previous career-high was 17 points versus Michigan State (11/14/17).
- Freshman guard **Alex O'Connell** came off the bench and scored a career-high 10 points. He also grabbed two rebounds, and had an assist and a blocked shot in 12 minutes. His previous career-high in points was eight versus Elon.
- Freshman forward **Marvin Bagley III** scored a game-high 24 points (one shy of his career high). He has surpassed 24 points in three of his five games as a collegian.
- Bagley is just the fourth player in the Coach K era to score 24+ points three times in the first five games of a season (any class). **Grayson Allen** did it four times in the first five games of the 2015-16 season; **Johnny Dawkins** (1983-84) and **Cherokee Parks** (1994-95) each did in three of the first five games. Scoring 24 or more points in three of the first five games has happened 15 times by 11 players in Duke history.
- Sophomore forward **Javin DeLaurier** recorded a game and career-high four blocked shots. He also matched his career high with six points on 3-of-3 shooting in 17 minutes off the bench.
