



Duke Postgame Notes

Duke vs. Indiana

- Tonight's game was Duke's 232nd when playing as the No. 1-ranked team under head coach **Mike Krzyzewski**, four more than UCLA's John Wooden for most games coached as a No. 1 team in NCAA history. Duke improved to 203-29 in those games.
- Duke's 260 all-time games played as the No. 1-ranked team are the most in NCAA history.
- Duke played its 158th game as the nation's No. 1-ranked team in the AP poll since 1998. That figure is 77 more than the next closest school (Kentucky) during that time.
- Coach K's record at Duke improved to 1,007-271 in his 38th season. His overall record improved to 1,090-330 in this, his 43rd season.
- Duke is 9-0 to start a season for the fourth time since the 2010-11 season, and 16th time under Coach K - 14 of those seasons have ended in the Sweet 16 or beyond.
- Duke extended its streak of at least one made three-pointer in a game to 993. It is the nation's fourth-longest active streak.
- The Blue Devils improved to 17-2 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge, the best record for teams in either conference.
- Duke improved to 6-3 all-time versus Indiana - that includes a 2-0 mark at Assembly Hall and a 4-0 mark over the Hoosiers in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge.
- Freshman **Marvin Bagley III** posted his seventh double-double with 23 points and 10 rebounds to tie the NCAA lead.
- Freshman forward **Wendell Carter Jr.**, recorded his fifth double-double with 18 points and 12 rebounds, which ties for the fourth-most nationally.
- Each of Duke's 14 double-doubles have come from freshmen this season, tied for the third-most by a freshman class in a season in Duke history. (Bagley 7, Carter 5, **Trevon Duval** 2).
- Freshman guard **Gary Trent Jr.**, was 5-for-5 at the free throw line, extending his streak of consecutive made free throws to 22.
- Senior guard **Grayson Allen** scored 21 points - his 3rd 20-point game this season and 33rd of his career. Duke improved to 27-6 when Allen scores 20+.
- Allen was 5-for-5 at the free throw to extend his streak of consecutive makes to 11.
