Duke vs. Pitt

- Head coach **Mike Krzyzewski's** record at Duke is now 1,012-273 in his 38th season. His overall record is 1,085-332 in this, his 43rd season.
- The win at Pitt marked Duke's 500th win away from Cameron Indoor Stadium under Coach K - improving Duke to 500-210 in road/neutral games under Coach K. In ACC regular-season play, Duke's road record under Coach K improved to 172-113.
- When playing as the No. 7-ranked team (AP poll), Duke improved to 86-27.
- Duke improved to 10-7 all-time versus Pitt, including 4-1 since Pitt entered the ACC.
- Duke improved to 792-131 versus unranked opponents under Coach K.
- Duke extended its streak of at least one made three-pointer in a game to 1,000. It is the nation's fourth-longest active streak.
- Duke's 35-point margin of victory (87-52) was its largest in an ACC road game since beating Virginia by 46 points (100-54) on Feb. 11, 1999.
- Duke's 52 points allowed were its fewest allowed in an ACC road game since a 63-52 win at Louisville on Jan. 17, 2015.
- Duke had six players reach double-figures in scoring for the first time since a 99-94 win over Wake Forest on Feb. 18, 2017.
- Freshman **Marvin Bagley III** recorded his 13th double-double (16 points, 15 rebounds), which continues to lead all NCAA freshmen. It is one shy of tying Duke's freshman record for most double-doubles in a season, held by **Jabari Parker** (2014) and **Gene Banks** (1978).
- Of Duke's 22 double-doubles this season, 21 have come from freshmen, which is also a school record. The 2014-15 class held the previous record with 20.
- Sophomore **Justin Robinson** set a career high with 10 points. His previous career-best was six points versus Evansville earlier this season.
- Robinson also established a new career high with three made three-pointers. His previous high was two made threes versus Evansville on Dec. 20, 2017.
- Robinson matched his career high with three blocked shots.
- The five assists for freshman **Gary Trent, Jr.** were a career high.
