



Duke Postgame Notes

Duke vs. Wake Forest



January 13, 2018 // Cameron Indoor Stadium // Durham, N.C.

- Head coach **Mike Krzyzewski** missed the game with a virus. Associate head coach **Jeff Capel** was the head coach in his place.
- Duke has sold out 430 consecutive games at Cameron Indoor Stadium, the longest current streak in both men's college basketball and the NBA.
- Duke extended its streak of at least one made three-pointer in a game to 1,001. It is the nation's fourth-longest active streak.
- Duke improved to 170-78 all-time versus Wake Forest - the 248 games is the most against one opponent in Duke in history.
- Duke has won seven straight games versus Wake Forest, the team's second-longest active ACC winning streak behind 10 straight wins over Georgia Tech.
- When playing as the No. 7-ranked team (AP poll), Duke improved to 87-27.
- Duke improved to 793-131 versus unranked opponents in the Coach K era.
- Duke's 89 points were their second-fewest in a home game this season. The Blue Devils are averaging 97.7 points in nine home games this season (9-0).
- Of Duke's 89 points in Saturday's game, 87 came from freshmen.
- Freshman **Marvin Bagley III** recorded his 14th double-double this season with 30 points and 11 rebounds, to go along with three assists, three blocks and a career-high four steals.
- His 14 double-doubles lead all NCAA freshmen and are second-most nationally.
- Bagley has matched Duke's freshman for double-doubles record set by Jabari Parker in 2014 and Gene Banks in 1978.
- Bagley leads the ACC with 10 games of 20+ points and five games of 30+ points.
- He has scored 30+ in three of the last four games.
- Freshman **Wendell Carter, Jr.** posted his seventh double-double with 15 points and 11 rebounds.
- Of Duke's 23 double-doubles this season, 22 have come from freshmen which extended a Duke record.
- It is the eighth time this season that multiple freshmen had a double-double in the same game. That happened just three times in Duke history before this season.
- Freshman **Gary Trent, Jr.**, matched a Duke freshman game record with six made three-pointers. Trent also had six at Boston College earlier this season. The record had been set nine previous times.
- Trent also matched Duke's freshman game record for three-point field goal percentage (min. five made three-point attempts). Trent was 6/7 (.857), matching records set by **Jayson Tatum** (6/7 vs. Virginia, 2/15/17) and **J.J. Redick** (6/7 at Georgia Tech, 2/2/6/03).
- Senior **Grayson Allen** recorded Duke's sixth performance all-time of 12+ rebounds and 8+ assists in a game. It was the first since Danny Ferry had 12 rebounds and eight assists against Vanderbilt in 1986.
- Freshman **Alex O'Connell** scored a career-high 13 points. His previous was 11 versus Furman on 11/20/17.
