



Duke Postgame Notes

Duke vs. Clemson



February 18, 2018 // Littlejohn Coliseum // Clemson, S.C.

- Head coach **Mike Krzyzewski**'s record at Duke is now 1,020-276 in his 38th season. His overall record is 1,093-335 in this, his 43rd season.
- Duke is now 110-31 in the series versus Clemson, including 38-23 on the road.
- In the Coach K era, today was the 12th meeting between Duke and Clemson when each team was ranked. Duke is 8-4 in those games and has won six of the last seven.
- Duke improved to 5-2 this season when facing a ranked team - four of those wins have come away from Cameron Indoor Stadium (Michigan State, Florida, Miami, Clemson).
- Duke extended its streak of at least one made three-pointer in a game to 1,011. It is the nation's fourth-longest active streak.
- Senior **Grayson Allen** was 9-of-9 at the free-throw line and is 19-of-19 at the line over Duke's last three games.
- Allen scored a team-high 19 points - his third double-digit scoring game in the last four. Duke is now 69-15 in Allen's career when his scores in double digits.
- Freshman **Wendell Carter, Jr.**, recorded his 14th double-double this season -- eight of them have come over Duke's last 11 games. Carter finished with 15 points and 10 rebounds.
- Carter has scored in double figures in 17 consecutive games.
- Freshman **Gary Trent, Jr.**, finished with 11 points - his 16th double-figure game in the last 17.
- Trent has made at least one three-pointer in 18 straight games.
- Sophomore **Javin DeLaurier** made his first career start and played a career-high 30 minutes. His previous career high of 24 minutes came in Duke's last game (vs. Virginia Tech).
- DeLaurier pulled down 10 rebounds - one shy of his career high.
- Freshman **Marvin Bagley III** missed his third straight game with a mild sprain in his right knee.
