



Duke Postgame Notes

Duke vs. North Carolina



March 3, 2018 // Cameron Indoor Stadium // Durham, N.C.

- Head coach **Mike Krzyzewski**'s record at Duke is now 1,023-277 in his 38th season. His overall record is 1,096-336 in this, his 43rd season.
- The game was Coach K's 1,300th as Duke's head coach.
- The game was the 247th game in the Duke-UNC rivalry, which now stands at 136-111 in favor of the Tar Heels. Duke is now 55-47 at home versus North Carolina, including 45-36 at Cameron Indoor Stadium.
- Coach K is now 46-41 in the series versus North Carolina.
- The game was the 45th in the rivalry when each team was ranked in the AP top 10, and Duke now leads in those meetings 23-22.
- The Blue Devils improved to 80-56 under Coach K in games between teams ranked in the top 10.
- Duke has sold out 438 consecutive games at Cameron Indoor Stadium, the longest current streak in both men's college basketball and the NBA.
- The game was the 49th at Cameron Indoor Stadium between two teams each ranked in the AP top 10 - the most of any venue in history. Duke's record in those games improved to 38-11.
- Duke extended its streak of at least one made three-pointer in a game to 1,015. It is the nation's fourth-longest active streak.
- Senior **Grayson Allen** finished with 15 points, five assists, five rebounds, and matched his career high with five steals. He now has scored 1,904 career points to become just the 18th Blue Devil to reach 1,900 career points.
- Allen made two three-pointers and now has 271 in his career, which stand fifth on Duke's all-time list.
- The win was Allen's 59th at Cameron Indoor Stadium, where he finished his career with a 59-6 (.908) record.
- Freshman **Marvin Bagley III** recorded his 19th double-double and his 24th consecutive double-figure scoring game with 21 points and 15 rebounds.
- Freshman **Gary Trent, Jr.**, hit three three-pointers and now has made at least one three-pointer in 22 consecutive games.
- Freshman **Trevon Duval** finished with six assists. He now has 164 this season, moving him to sixth on the list of most assists by a Duke freshman.
