Men's Basketball Postgame Notes

January 26, 2019 - vs. Georgia Tech

- Head coach **Mike Krzyzewski**'s record at Duke is now 1,044-281 in his 39th season. His overall record is 1,117-340 in this, his 44th season.
- The game was the 96th in the series between Duke and Georgia Tech, and the series now stands at 73-23 in favor of Duke. In games at Cameron Indoor Stadium, Duke leads 36-5.
- Duke has won 12 straight in the series, its longest active winning streak against an ACC opponent.
- Duke is now 124-22 all-time when playing as the No. 2-ranked team in the AP poll.
- Duke is now 962-218 when playing as a ranked team under Coach K, including 560-102 when playing as a ranked AP top five team under Coach K.
- Duke extended its streak of at least one made three-pointer in a game to 1,040. It is the nation's third-longest active streak.
- Duke improved to 887-160 all-time at Cameron Indoor Stadium, including 529-65 under Coach K. Duke is 10-1 at home this season.
- The game was Duke's 449th consecutive sellout at Cameron Indoor Stadium, extending the longest streak in men's college basketball.

PLAYER NOTES

- Freshman **Zion Williamson** began the game 4-of-4 from the field, extending a streak of 17-consecutive two-point field goals that extended to the Virginia game.
- Williamson finished with 22 points on 9-of-12 shooting from the floor, with seven rebounds, three blocks and two steals.
- Williamson recorded his 12th 20-point game, second-most in the ACC.
- Freshman **RJ Barrett** recorded his ACC-leading 16th 20-point game with his game-high 24 points.
- Barrett posted his third double-double with 24 points and 11 rebounds.
- Eleven of Duke's 12 double-doubles this season have come from freshmen (eight by Williamson and three by Barrett).
- Freshman **Tre Jones** returned to the lineup after missing the last two games with a shoulder injury. He scored six points, with four rebounds, four assists and turnover in his 35 minutes.
- Freshman **Cam Reddish** set career-highs for assists (six) and steals (five). He finished with seven points, six assists, six assists and five steals in 38 minutes.
- Reddish posted just the sixth 7-6-6-5 game in Duke history, and the first since **Justise Winslow** had 13-6-7-6 versus Wake Forest on 3/4/15.
