SETTING THE SCENE

- Duke enters the 2019 season ranked second nationally and voted as the preseason favorite in the ACC.
- February 2 is the earliest Duke has started a lacrosse season. The previous mark was Feb. 3 against Air Force in 2018.
- Saturday's game is the first of five February games for the Blue Devils, the most of any Division I team.

THE SERIES HISTORY

- Duke and Furman are meeting for the first time since the inaugural meeting in 2014. The Blue Devils beat the Paladins, in their first season, 19-4 en route to their second consecutive NCAA title.
- Furman is one of four Southern Conference teams Duke will play this season. The Blue Devils also face High Point, Jacksonville and Richmond.

3 BLUE DEVILS EARN PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA

■ JT Giles-Harris, Brad Smith and Cade Van Raaphorst garnered preseason All-America honors. Smith was a first-team choice, while Giles-Harris and Van Raaphorst were voted to the second team. All three were All-Americans in 2018.

■ Duke is one of five programs to have at least three players voted to the top three teams and one of two - the other being Yale - to have three representatives on the first and second teams.

DANOWSKI GOING FOR WIN NO. 400

■ Head coach John Danowski etched his name at the top of the Division I men's lacrosse wins list in 2017, beating Jacksonville for his 376th career victory. Dom Starsia held the previous record of 375. Danowski is third among active coaches across all three divisions and will be the first Division I head coach to reach 400 wins if Duke beats Furman.

■ The Blue Devils' leader has 180 wins at Duke, 192 at Hofstra and 27 in his first stop at LIU Post. He will be the first Division I head coach to reach 400 wins and the third across all three divisions to achieve the mark.

■ Danowski, a winner of three NCAA titles, is one of four active coaches to own multiple NCAA titles. He is third among the group with three, while Bill Tierney of Denver leads the way with eight.

■ Danowski owns a 180-55 record at Duke, making him one of five coaches in Division I men's lacrosse to win 100-plus games with two programs.

■ He captured 192 wins at Hofstra prior to coming to Durham. Denver's Bill Tierney joined the club in 2017.

LAST TIME WE MET

■ Eleven different Blue Devils scored goals and 14 players had at least one point as third-ranked Duke cruised to the 19-4 victory over first-year program Furman in 2014.

■ The Blue Devils scored three goals in the opening 59 seconds and led 7-1 after the first quarter in what proved to be a championship season. Josh Dionne led all scorers with six tallies.

LOOKING AT DUKE

■ Duke opens the 2019 season as the unanimous No. 2 team behind reigning NCAA Champion Yale. The Blue Devils return a wealth of talent both offensively and defensively, including All-Americans Brad Smith, Cade Van Raaphorst and JT Giles-Harris.

■ Smith, Duke's most versatile player, is the Blue Devils' top returning scorer after registering 65 points in 2015. He has the capability to play both attack and midfield. Sophomore Joe Robertson, senior Sean Lowrie and junior Joey Manown are likely to headline the offense after a combined 111 points last season. CJ Carpenter also has the potential to bolster the attack in a very deep position for the Blue Devils.

■ In the midfield, Duke is deep with Smith likely leading the charge. Senior Jake Seau looks to cap his career with his best season, while juniors Reilly Walsh and Kevin Quigley are expected to be major contributors. Sophomore Nakeie Montgomery has the potential to have a breakout year, while classmate Cameron Badour will be an impact player after missing last season to injury.

■ On defense, the duo of All-Americans Van Raaphorst and Giles-Harris will anchor the close defense along with Walker Scaglione. Graduate student Peter Welch will be a long stick middle. As short stick d-middies, John Prendergast, Terry Lindsay and Blake Leischow will bring a lot of experience to the defensive squad.

■ Joe Stein and Brian Smyth are back at the X after sharing duties last season. Freshman Jordan Ginder is the newest addition to the faceoff crew.

■ In goal, senior Turner Uppgren has the most experience of a young crew. Freshmen Garrett Smith and Andrew Bonafede will battle for time along with senior David McCann.

SCOUTING FURMAN

■ Furman comes into 2019 after posting a 4-10 record last season. The Paladins were picked to finish fifth in the Southern Conference. William Holcomb was voted to the preseason All-SoCon team after leading Furman in scoring a year ago. The Paladins return three of their top four scorers.

■ Kyle Weatherford is back for his senior season as a defensive leader. He had 24 ground balls and a team-best 18 caused turnovers. In goal, Alec Van de Bovenkamp will likely be the anchor between the pipes. He played all but 40 minutes last season and posted a 12.52 goals against average and a .571 save percentage.

■ Sophomore Sage Rieth was the top draw man last season, winning 77-of-192 (.401) as a rookie. He also collected 20 ground balls.

FOR OPENERS

■ The Feb. 2 start date for the Blue Devils is the earliest for Duke in program history. Last year's Feb. 3 faceoff was the previous record for earliest start.

■ Duke is 10-2 in season openers under head coach John Danowski. The losses were to No. 19 Air Force (11-10) in 2017 and to No. 9 Denver (14-12) in 2013. The Blue Devils have not lost to an unranked foe in a season opener since and 8-6 setback to Washington & Lee in 1985. ■ The average margin of victory for Duke since 2007 is 6.33 goals. The Blue Devils' 18-4 victory last season was the largest spread in a season-opening game since a 20-6 win over Siena in 2011.

DUKE A FORCE ON OFFENSE

■ Duke has proven it traditionally features one the top offenses in Division I lacrosse. The Blue Devils have been in the top 11 in scoring in each of the past 10 seasons and are expected to be one of the top point producing programs again in 2019.

■ Since 2007, Duke is 160-22 when scoring at least 10 goals in a game.

■ The Blue Devils are 16-32 when being held to fewer than 10 scores.

■ Duke is 46-46 when allowing 10 goals in a contest and 130-8 when holding opponents under 10 goals.

DUKE IN ONE GOAL GAMES

■ Duke is 77-72 in games decided by one goal in program history after upending North Carolina 11-10 in 2018.

■ Duke is 20-16 in one-goal contests since 2007 and last played a one-goal game in a season opener in the 11-10 loss to Air Force in 2017.

DUKE'S EXPERIENCE AT MIDFIELD

■ The Blue Devils have the luxury of depth and a wealth of experience at the midfield position. Led by senior captain Brad Smith, Duke has four upperclassmen to lead the charge. Sophomore Nakeie Montgomery is back after playing on both the first and second midfield line in 19 games last season.

■ Overall, Duke's collection of five midfielders who competed on the first two lines last season have combined to play 187 games.

■ In addition, the Blue Devils look to be buoyed by sophomore Cameron Badour, who missed last season to injury but benefited from an entire season being immersed in practice.

MONTGOMERY LOOKING FOR BREAKTHROUGH

■ Sophomore Nakeie Montgomery will look to build on his NCAA Tournament performance last season. The Dallas native came on strong in the NCAA postseason event, scoring five goals in the first three games.

■ Joining the first midfield in the first-round game against Villanova, Montgomery registered his first career hat trick. A week later, he scored two goals in 60 seconds to break open Duke's one-goal lead in the fourth quarter against Johns Hopkins. On his birthday in the NCAA semifinal, Montgomery tallied another hat trick to help Duke past Maryland. He was held scoreless in the

■ Prior to the NCAA Tournament, Montgomery had just six goals and two assists in 15 games. He earned a start on the first midfield for one game during the regular season.

BRAD SMITH POINT SCORING STREAK

■ Senior Brad Smith enters the 2019 season riding a 35-game point streak. His 35-game stretch started Feb. 10, 2017 and he has scored 100 points in that span. He is third among active players on the list and only one of 12 to have a point in 20 straight games.

■ The next closest Blue Devil is sophomore Joe Robertson at 11 games.

■ Brad Smith became a household name for the Blue Devils in 2018, scoring 65 points after totaling 53 his first two seasons combined.

■ He came on a third of the way through the season, scoring 51 of his 65 points this season in the final 14 games. He averaged 2.50 points per game in the first six and 3.64 in the past 14.

ROBERTSON LACROSSE FAMILY

■ Lacrosse is a family affair for Duke sophomore Joe Robertson as he follows in the footsteps of his three older brothers to play Division I lacrosse. Matt, the oldest, played his final two seasons at Virginia. Ian was a Maryland Terrapin for three years and Phillip is a junior on the Princeton men's lacrosse team.

■ Phillip finished fourth in points for the Tigers with 36. Joe had 60 points in 20 games to rank third in scoring for the Blue Devils. Both ranked nationally among the top 40 in goals per game, the top 100 in points and the top 30 in shot percentage in 2018.

ALL IN THE FAMILY FOR GILES-HARRIS

■ Preseason All-American and All-ACC choice, junior defenseman John Thomas (JT) Giles-Harris isn't the only one from his family who has made a name for himself as a Blue Devil.

■ JT's brother, Joe, Duke football's top defensive player and team captain in 2018, recently declared for the NFL draft. He garnered four All-America awards in 2017, including second-team honors by the Walter Camp Foundation. Overall, he was the first Duke linbacker with multiple first-team All-ACC accolades since 1985-86.

VAN RAAPHORST'S ATHLETIC LINEAGE

■ Junior close defenseman Cade Van Raaphorst traded the football for the lacrosse stick despite hailing from a family of elite college quarterbacks.

■ Cade is the son of Jeff Van Raaphorst, quarterback at Arizona State leading the Sun Devils to the Pac-10 and Rose Bowl titles in 1987. He was inducted into the Rose Bowl Hall of Fame in 2006. Jeff also played in the NFL for a few seasons.

■ Uncle, Mike Van Raaphorst, was the backup quarterback to Carson Palmer at Southern California.

Cemented as one of the top coaches in college lacrosse, John Danowski has led the Duke men's lacrosse team to unprecedented success and himself to the top of the Division I men's lacrosse wins list. Danowski was introduced as Duke's eighth head men's lacrosse coach on July 21, 2006 and quickly led the Blue Devils to some of the most successful lacrosse seasons in school history, to three NCAA Championships in five seasons.

In Danowski's 11 years at the helm of the Blue Devils lacrosse program, he has compiled an impressive 180-55 record in leading Duke to seven ACC regular season titles and four ACC tournament titles, eight straight appearances in the national semifinals from 2007-14, four in the NCAA title match and ultimately to the 2010, 2013 and 2014 national titles. The 2014 NCAA crown put Danowski, a winner of 399 career games, among a small group of nine coaches to win three national titles and among eight to capture consecutive crowns. Meanwhile, Duke's run of eight straight NCAA semifinals rank as the second most of any program since 2000 with Syracuse. Most recently, Danowski passed Dom Starsia as the winningest Division I lacrosse history, garnering his 376th win with a 13-6 victory over Jacksonville, March 13, 2017.

A winner of nearly 80 percent of his games at Duke, the individual awards Blue Devil players have garnered is equally impressive. In 12 seasons, Danowski mentored 69 All-America selections, 41 All-ACC choices, two Tewaaraton Trophy winners, a pair of USILA Attackman of the Year honorees, a USILA Defenseman of the Year, three USILA Midfielder of the Year award recipients and 22 USILA Scholar All-America picks.

While the success on the field is unsurpassed in Duke lacrosse history, the student-athletes excellence in the classroom also is unrivaled. The Blue Devils consistently lead the ACC in All-ACC Academic picks as well as players on the ACC Academic Honor Roll. In 2018, Duke had 37 players - nearly 79 percent of the team - achieve a 3.0 grade point average for the entire academic year, with Justin Guterding earning USILA Scholar All-America honors.

Head coach John Danowski is one of four active coaches to own multiple NCAA titles. He is third among the group with three, while Bill Tierney of Denver leads the way with eight.
