Men's Basketball Postgame Notes

February 20, 2019 - vs. North Carolina

- Head coach **Mike Krzyzewski**'s record at Duke is now 1,050-282 in his 39th season. His overall record is 1,123-341 in this, his 44th season.
- The game was the 249th in the series versus North Carolina, and the series now stands at 138-111 in favor of UNC. At Cameron Indoor Stadium, the series is now 54-49 in favor of Duke.
- Under Coach K, the series is 46-43 in favor of Duke.
- The game marked the 46th in the rivalry with each team ranked in the AP top 10 - the most in NCAA history - and the series now stands tied at 23-23.
- Duke is 230-148 versus ranked teams under Coach K, including 85-48 versus ranked ACC teams.
- Duke is now 236-38 all-time when playing as the No. 1-ranked team in the AP poll.
- With Duke as the AP No. 1 versus North Carolina, the series is now 10-8 in favor of Duke.
- Duke is now 968-219 when playing as a ranked team under Coach K, including 565-103 when playing as a ranked AP top five team under Coach K.
- Against AP top 10 teams, Duke is now 93-91 in the Coach K era.
- Duke extended its streak of at least one made three-pointer in a game to 1,047. It is the nation's third-longest active streak.
- Duke improved to 890-161 all-time at Cameron Indoor Stadium, including 532-66 under Coach K. Duke is 13-2 at home this season.
- The game was Duke's 453rd consecutive sellout at Cameron Indoor Stadium, extending the longest streak in men's college basketball.

PLAYER NOTES

- Freshman **RJ Barrett** recorded his sixth double-double with 33 points to match his career high and 16 rebounds. He played all 40 minutes.
- Barrett's 33 points were a Duke freshman record in a game versus North Carolina. The previous record was 30 points by **Jabari Parker** on March 8, 2014.
- Freshman **Cam Reddish** set a career high with 27 points. Three of his seven 20-point games have come over the last five games.
- Six different Blue Devils accounted for the team's eight blocked shots, including two each from **Marques Bolden** and **Jack White**. Duke leads the nation in blocked shots per game (7.2).
- Freshman **Zion Williamson** suffered a knee injury 34 seconds into the game and did not return.
